### RECIPROCAL ADMISSION PROGRAM

Some recent beneficiaries who enjoyed free garden visits during their travels reported:



"In January, Lisa and I visited the San Diego Botanic Garden (SDBG). Set on 37 acres in suburban Encinitas, California, SDBG features over 5000 plant species from around the world. The gardens are geographically organized with a focus on Mediterranean climates. There are also tropical, bamboo, desert, and children's gardens. The highlight of our visit was the guided tour with an enthusiastic volunteer docent. We learned about many interesting plants along with some garden history. A few of our favorite plants were the various cycads, the Cork Oak, the Dragon tree, Arucaria spp. and of course all the fascinating succulents. We had fun seeing many familiar houseplants being used in landscape plantings, including whole 'forests' of jade plant. SDBG is one of more than 345 gardens in the AHS Reciprocal Admissions Program so our visit was free of charge with our OBG membership card. Be sure to take yours along when traveling!"





"On a sunny, mild December 2022 day, we enjoyed using our OBG membership's Reciprocal Admission feature for a free visit to the Ruth Bancroft Garden in Walnut Creek, CA (about 20 miles NE of San Francisco). This exciting 3.5-acre garden has fascinating cacti and succulents, some duplicating OBG's, and other wonderful, often weird-looking plants - many that prefer temperatures milder than Idaho's. This was our 4th visit there, usually to introduce this great place to friends or family."

In late 2022, Ann DeBolt resigned from the OBG Board, partly because her Boise residence prevented her full involvement with the Garden. She believes that locally-based Board members have more effective ties to the community. Ann became an OBG Director when the Garden's Board of Directors was formed in April 2015. However, her connection with the Garden and the Ortons began much earlier.

Ann and her husband Roger Rosentreter are botanists known Idaho-wide for their dedicated, informed, concerned activities with the Idaho Native Plant Society and many other botanical, environmental and ecology groups. They met the Ortons about 2003.

In 2008, Ann offered to bring a crew of plant-lovers from Boise for an OBG spring cleanup. Ortons could not refuse, so an annual tradition of the 3-day OBG April Cleanup extravaganza began. A group of about 15 Boisearea hard-working plant-lovers travel to Twin Falls for 1, 2, or 3 days to prune, lop, weed, trim, dig and saw various plants for better appearance. The April Cleanup is hard work, with sometimes very wet, snowy or windy weather, but many volunteers return annually for the FUN. Twin Falls Board members have joined them recently also. The sunny days displaying wonderful early blossoming cacti and native perennials lure workers back the next year.

Spring Cleanup was a mere fraction of Ann's OBG efforts. She wrote the OBG brochures about Native Plants and Native Buckwheats. Her classes about Trough Gardens and annually the pre-Plant Sale Zoom review of how best to use plants available for sale demonstrated vividly that Ann is an exceptional teacher, highly competent, humble, never talking down to people. Her knowledge base could make her very intimidating, yet Ann is remarkably accessible. She participated vigorously in the Education and Newsletter Committees and many other Board Committees, conducted many terrifically enjoyable Garden tours, and much more. She will continue offering training and classes. The Board will definitely miss Ann!
