


200807-08 Queensland



We enjoyed our short holiday on Heron Island. The boat trip from Gladstone and on our return were both calm and pleasant. We explored the islands many shaded...



Caloundra

Our visit to Caloundra was spent mainly exploring the Blackall Ranges to the west. The towns along the range were developed as cool refuges from the hot plains around Brisbane. More recently the towns have become very popular with tourists and locals alike. The range provides very good views of the costal strip and of the extraordinary Glass House Mountains (not so ancient volcanoes). We left Queensland via the steep and narrow Lions Road which shares the crossing of the Border Ranges with a wonderfully engineered railway line.






