






Map of Jersey



The Tree of Succesion showing linkages between Kings and Queens of England and France - Key to Sculpture








## Week 1 - South western Jersey




# Week 2 - St Helier Parish Church, Pulec, Plemont Bay, Grosnez Castle, Victoria Crescent









Week 2 – Green lane walk from St Lawrence Parish Church
