
Back to Auckland

Picton and Queen Charlotte Sound


- From Nelson we drove through the little town of Havelock to Picton, the main access point for goods and people from the North Island. We liked Picton as it is much more than a tourist town. The town is situated at the end of Queen Charlotte Sound which
- we managed to explore on the mail boat which visits many of the isolated settlements around the Sound. Back in Picton we also explored the preserved remains of the Edwin Fox. This vessel is the 9th oldest ship in the world, the oldest surviving merchant ship, last surviving convict ship that took convicts to Australia and last wooden NZ immigrant ship. The metal cladding of the wooden hull, made from Indian Teak, certainly contributed to its remarkable state of preservation.


























Blenheim and Wairau Valley

We returned to Nelson via Blenheim (centre of the Marlborough wine region) with its great coffee stop at the Wine Station. Then we headed west along the Wairau Valley with numerous examples of timber harvesting and vine growing. The climb up to St Arnaud was quite gradual but we soon reached skiing areas, alpine-style lodges and saw plenty of snowy peaks. Lake Rotoiti is very impressive and we even saw hardy swimmers enjoying the (presumably frigid) water. The route down to Nelson was again quite gradual from mountainous country through quite rich farming areas and eventually to the coastal plains.






































< Blenheim and Wairau Valley







The walk to the Centre of New Zealand starts in Nelson on the banks of the Maitai River at a great coffee stop. The first part is a gentle stroll along the Maitai River Walk to the Botanic Sports Field - the site of New Zealand's first game of rugby. The walk continues on one of several steep paths to the top of Botanic Hill - the Centre of New Zealand. From the top there are excellent views (on a fine day) of Nelson and its surroundings as well as inland to the south and east. We were fortunate to see examples of flowering New Zealand Flax and Manuka on our walk.




