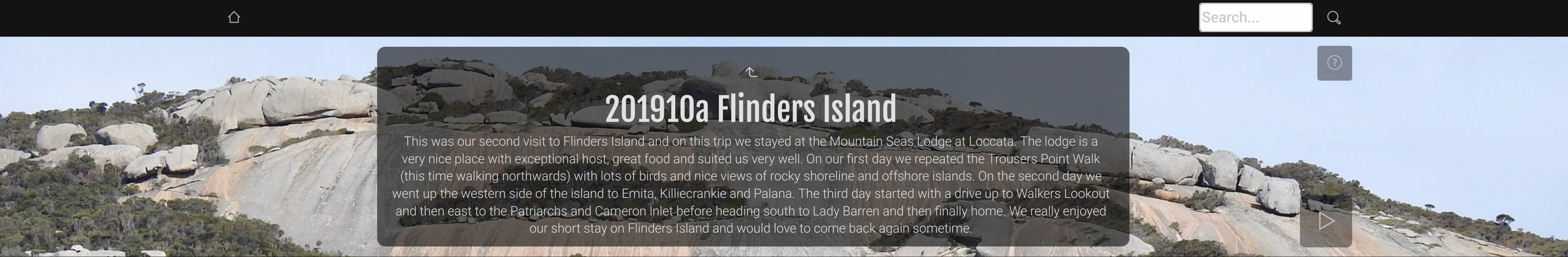


201910a Flinders Island

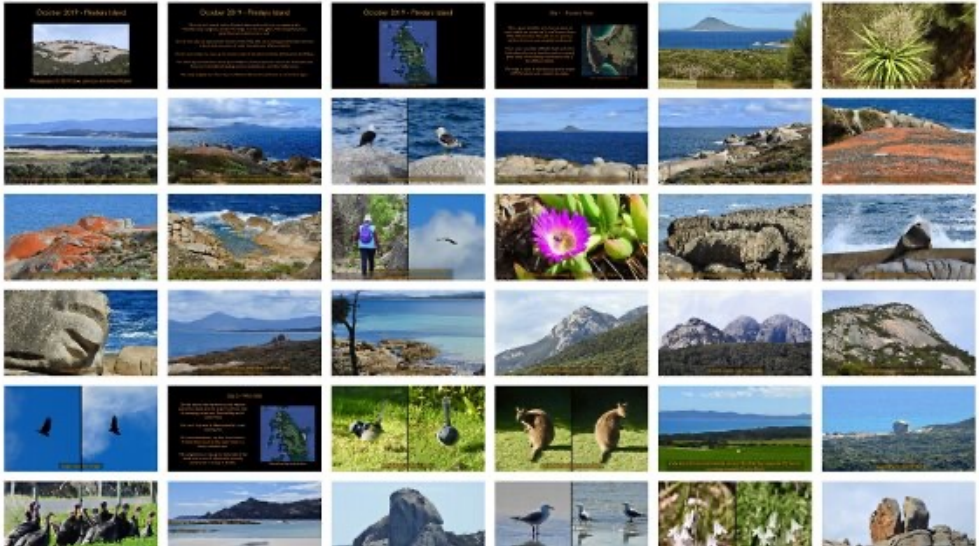

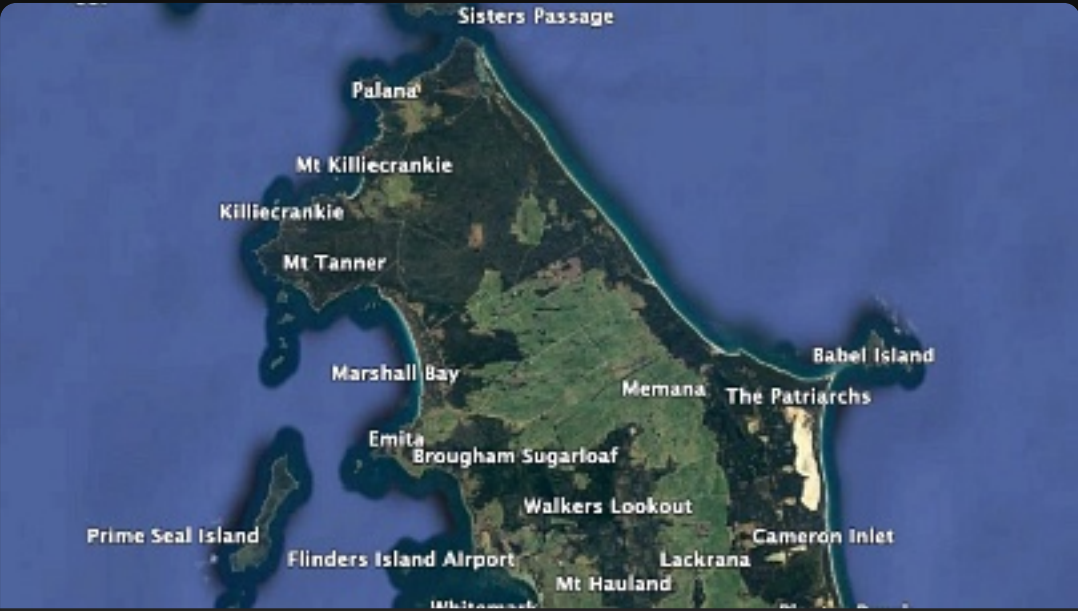

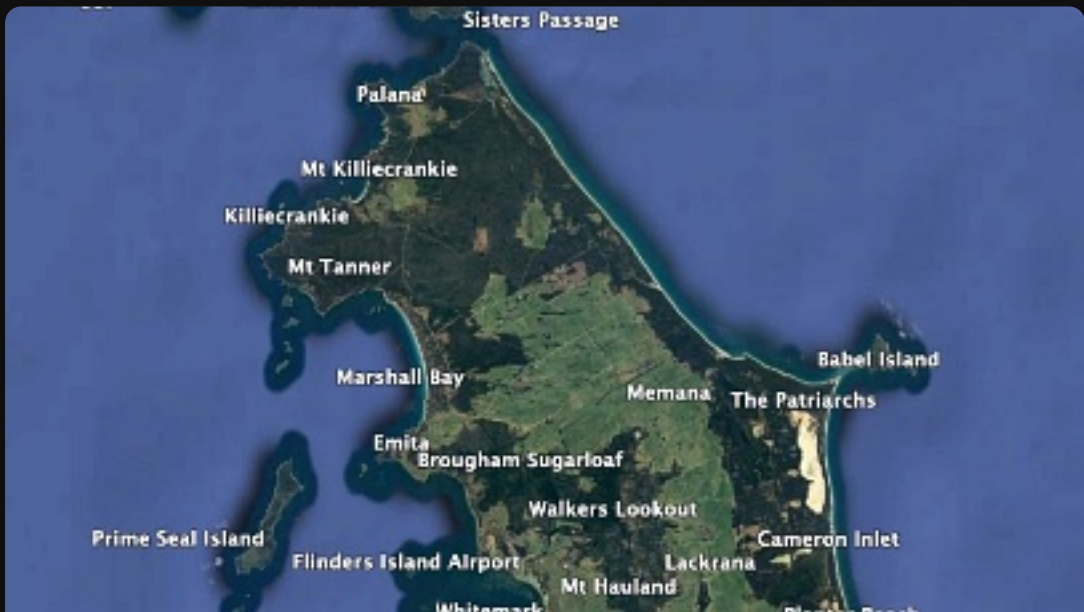


Flinders Island Map

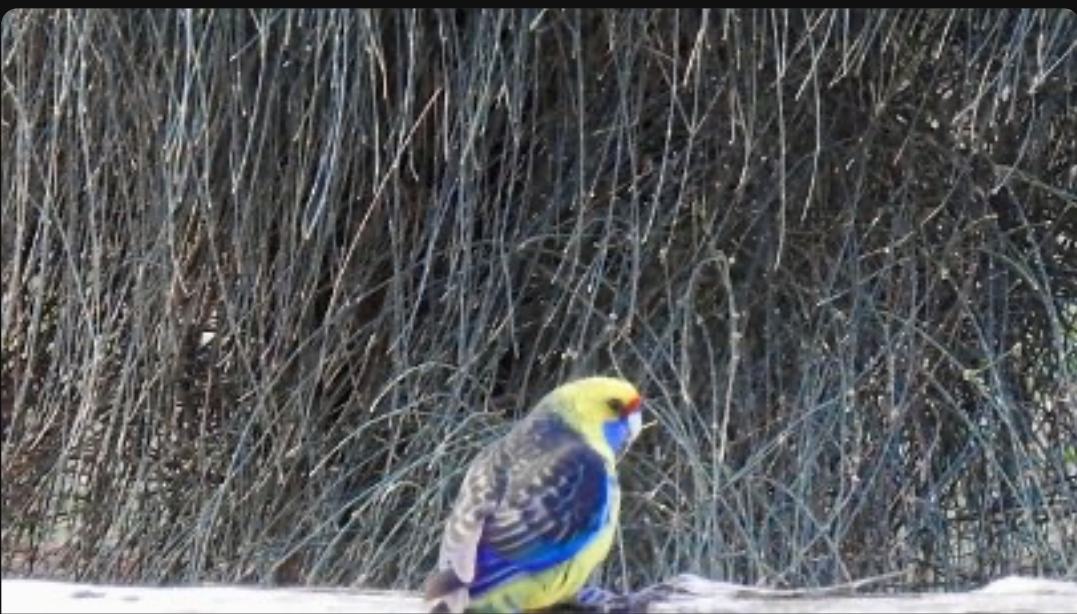

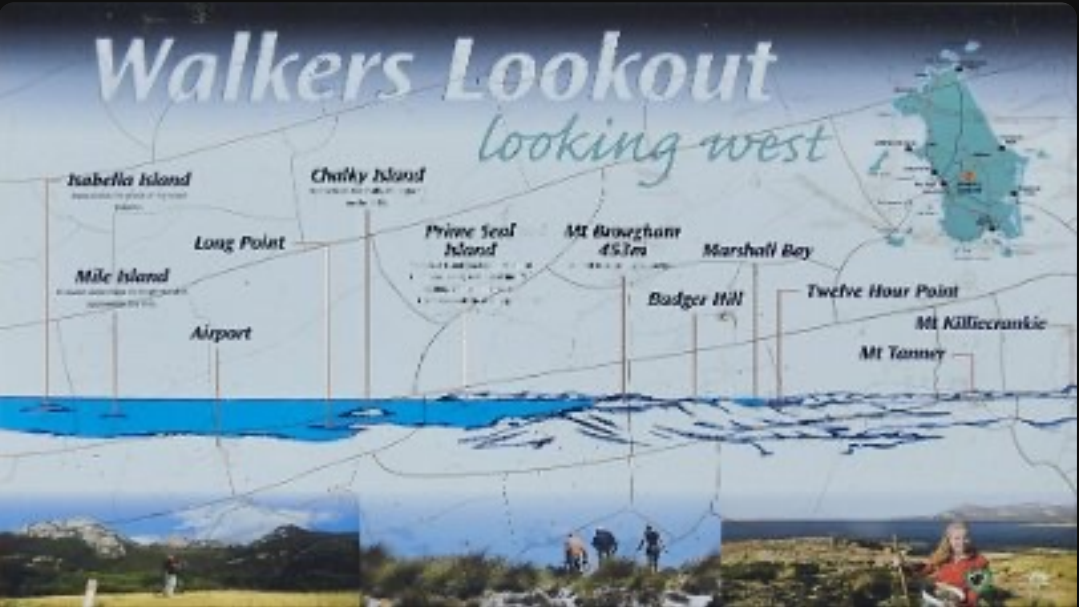


East Side Map

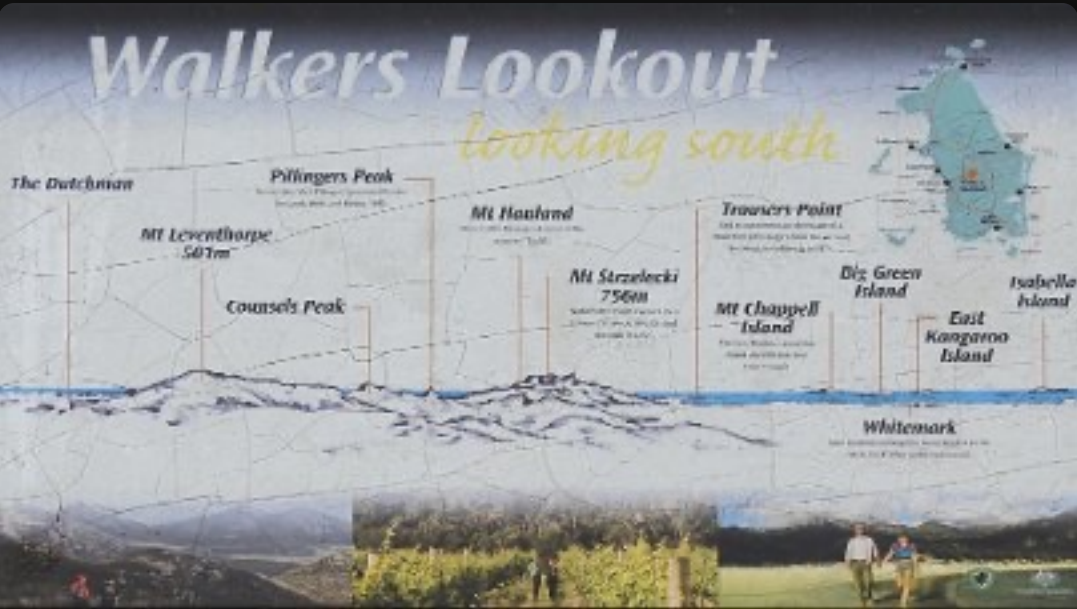

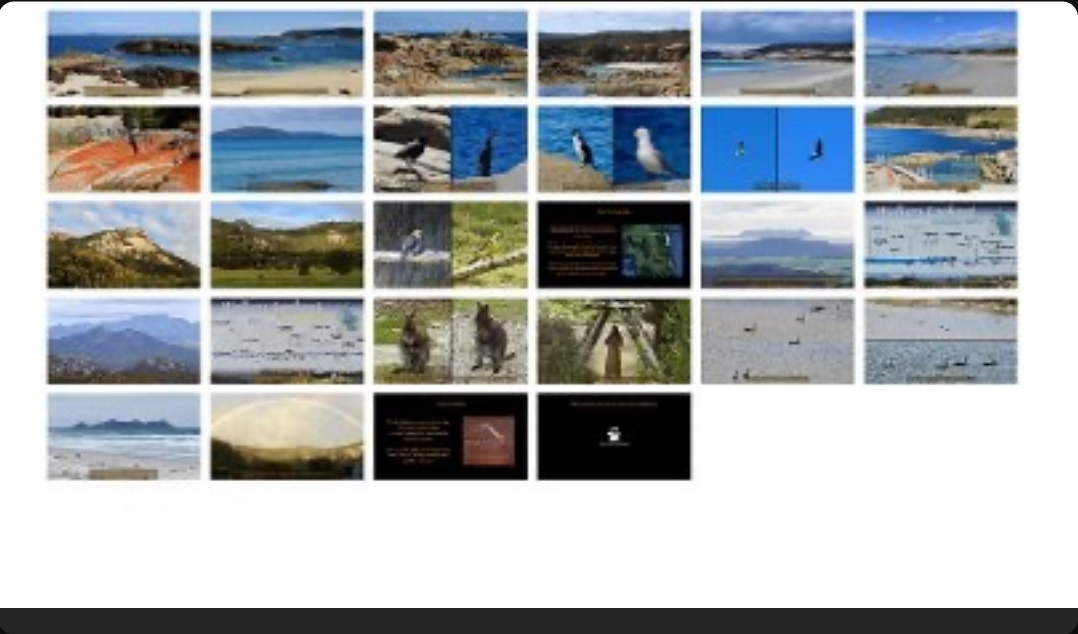

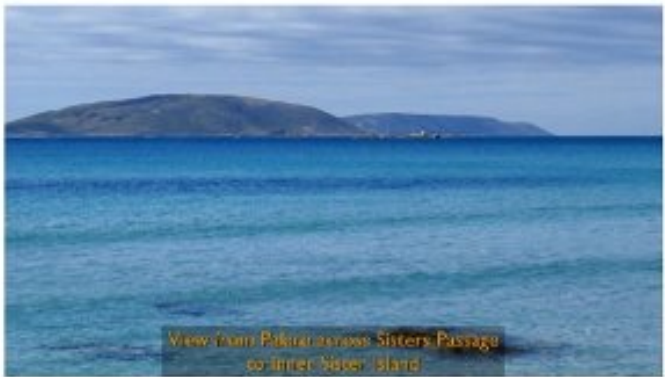

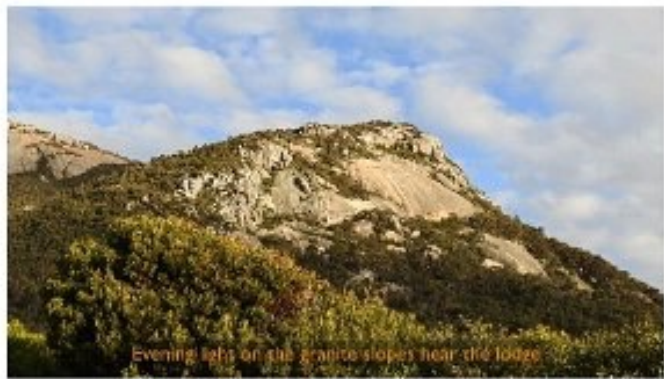

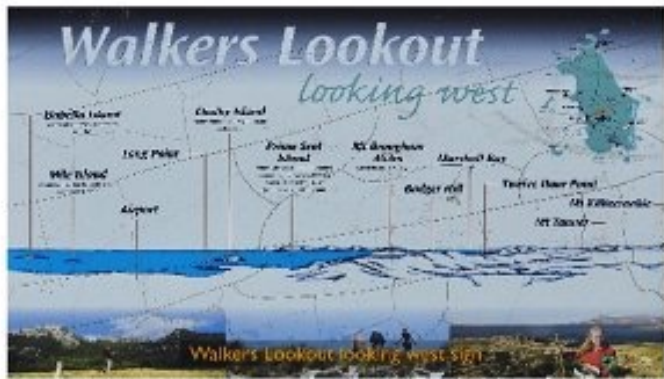

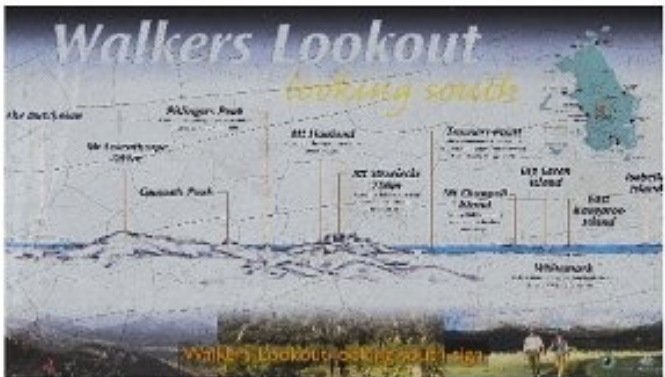
