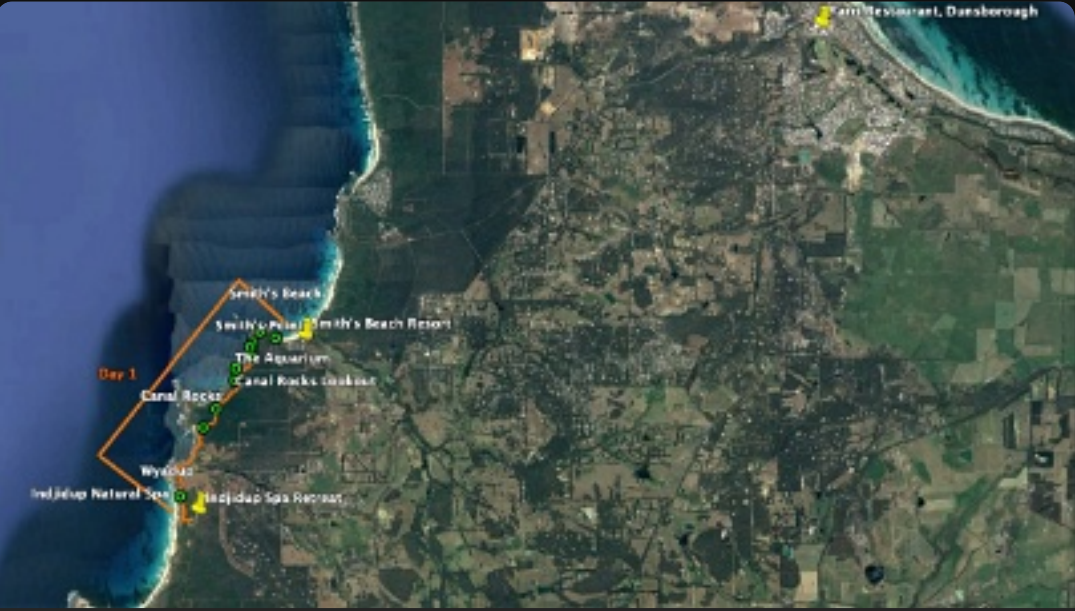
Overview Map of Cape to Cape with Walk into Luxury

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Day 4 Moses Rock to Willyabrup sea cliffs, Cowaramup, Wills Domain

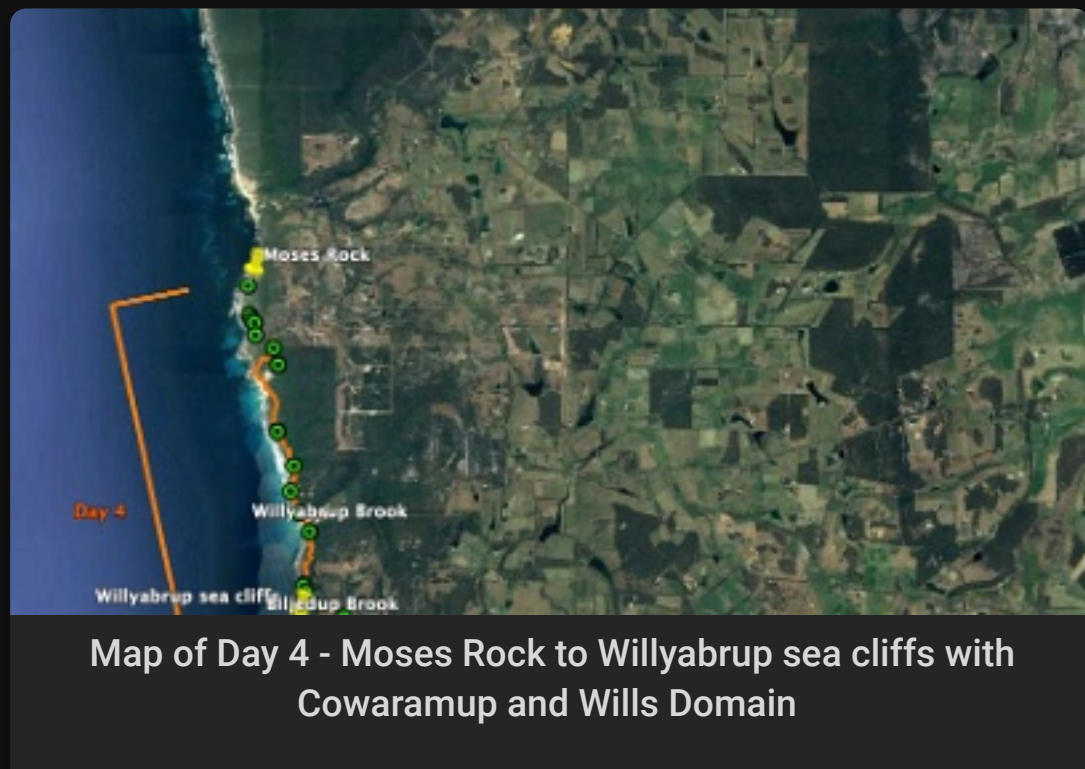

The coastline got much more rugged as we approached the sea cliffs. A lot of steelheads took us up to the top of the cliffs. We finished our trip with an excellent lunch at Wills Domain winery and then along the coast back to Perth.

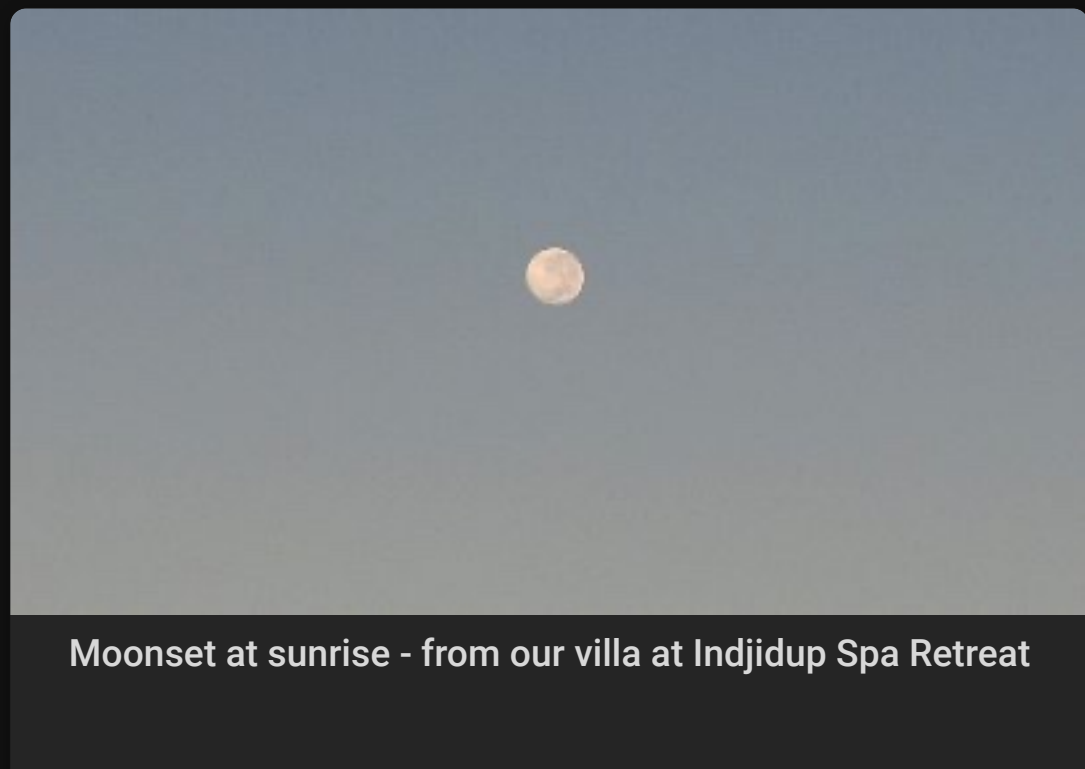
Map of Day 4 - Moses Rock to Willyabrup sea cliffs

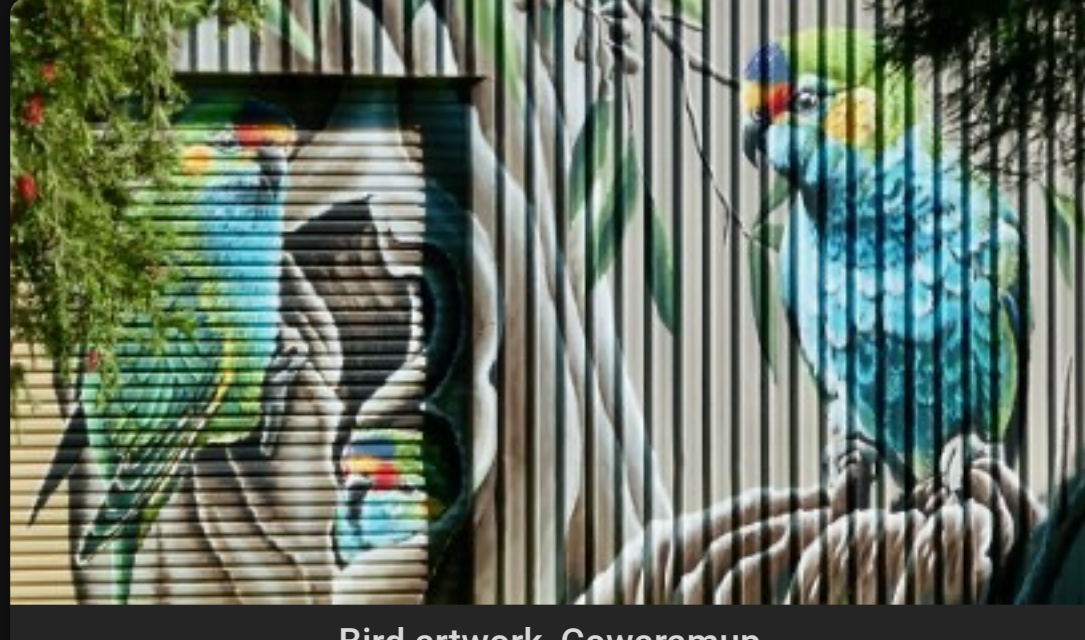

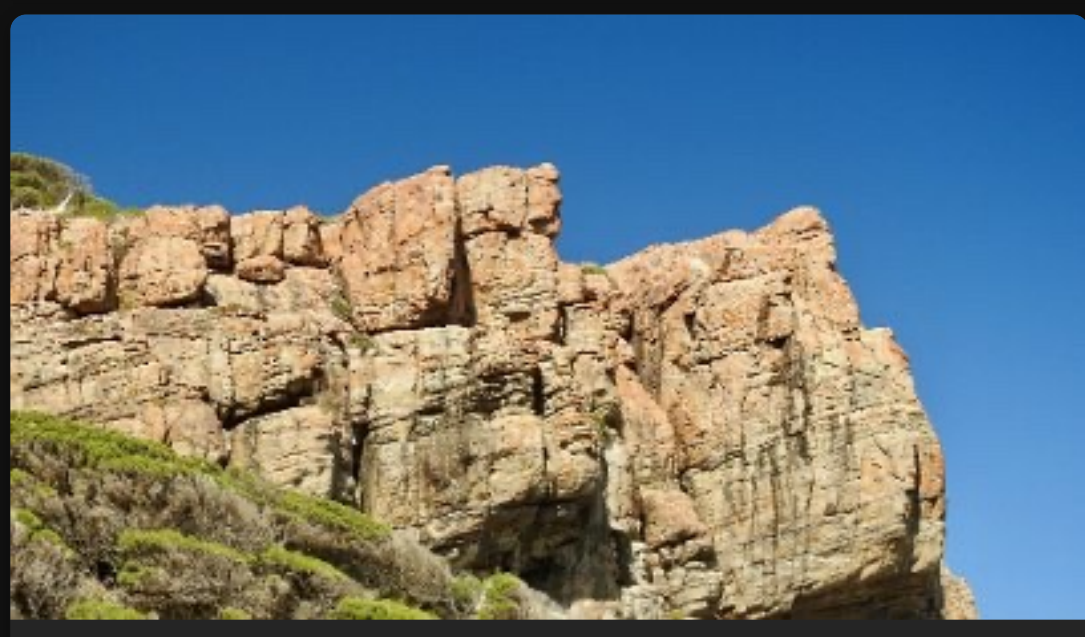

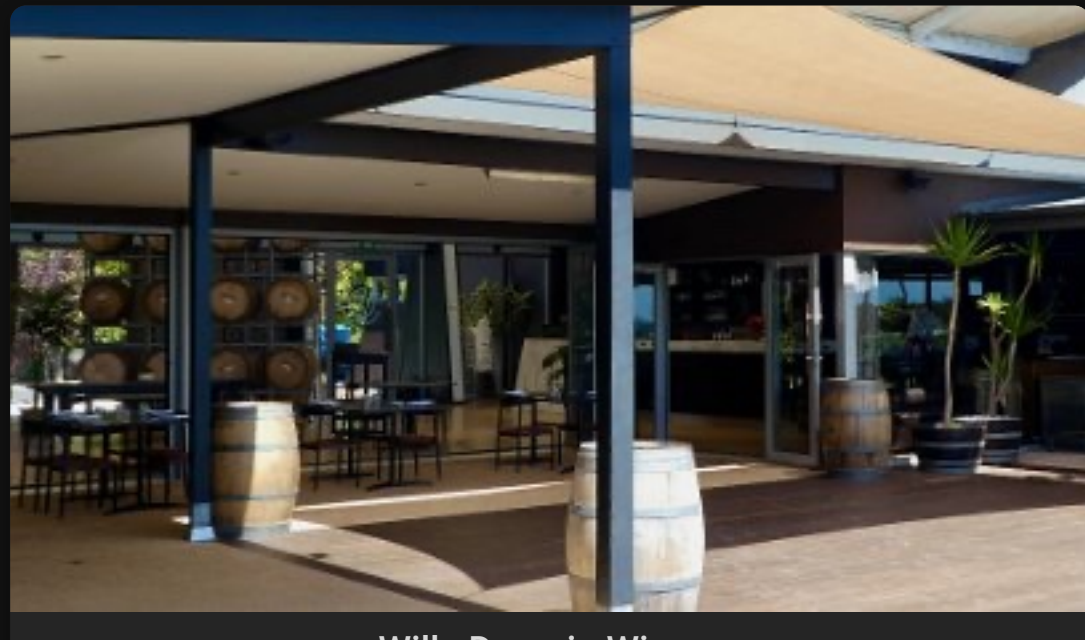

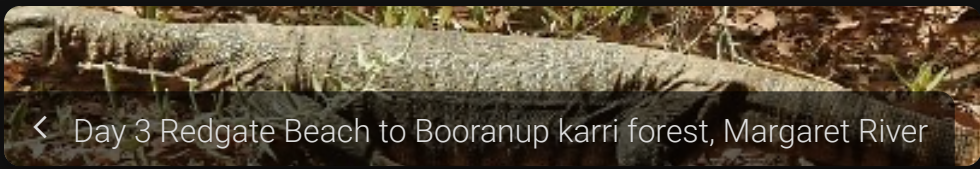

On the last day of our holiday we took a ferry boat ride from Perth down the Swan River to Fremantle, leaving our coffee and lunch place of the first day.

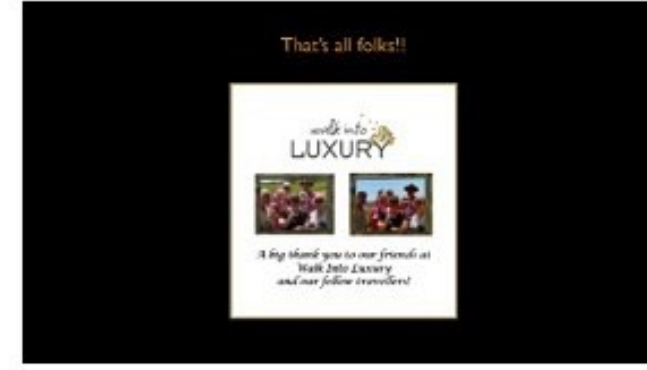
We wandered around Fremantle, which we have visited many times before, but this time it seemed crowded with visitors from the local university.
