

This week we will be looking at the fruit of **PEACE**. When I was in the Christian Church we would greet one another with the phrase, "Praise the Lord". Instead of repeating the phrase, I should have said "HalleluYah". I now, at times, greet likeminded people with the phrase "Mah shalam kah". That is to say, "How is your Peace?" Hazon (Revelation) 6:4 states, "And another horse, fiery red, went out. And it was given to the one who sat on it to take peace from the earth and that they should slay one another..." After the murder of George Floyd, people flooded the streets all around the world chanting "No justice, No peace". What followed was violence and fear. People were boarding up their stores in an effort to keep their businesses safe. In a world that is in turmoil and filled with injustice, we must look to the hills from which cometh our help. Mashaly (Proverbs) 18:10 states, "The Name of Yahuah is a strong tower; the righteous run into it and are safe". One of the meanings of peace in Hebrew is – to be safe in mind body or estate, completed. Yahuah Alahym gives peace to all who come to Him and walk in His ways. "Watch the perfect, and observe the straight; for the latter end of each is peace" Tahalym (Psalms) 37:37. Let us remember that whatever we are seeing or going through, Yahuah will give us the strength to face every challenge with peace. "Yahuah gives strength to His people, Yahuah blesses His people with PEACE" Tahalym 29:11.
