Enrique follows Venezuelan news closely, and he spends most of his time trying to make sense of Latin America–United States relations. Enrique is naively optimistic that through endless research, he will find the connections and answers that will help heal a complex Western hemisphere.

Born in the Caribbean nation of Trinidad and Tobago and raised in its rich cultural milieu, light, color, and movement are deeply embedded in Robert V. Reid's collective unconscious. With graphite, charcoals, watercolor, and oils, Reid uses these elements to create an emotive rendering of the human form. Reid's creative journey began in Trinidad, where he was introduced to several significant Caribbean artists who mentored him and nurtured his natural, untrained talent. Over an 18- 20-year career, Reid's work has changed to mirror his journey from the Caribbean to New York City. He arrived in New York as a trained architectural draftsman with a passion for painting and an urge to record, invent, and manipulate the human image using raw talent. His immersion into the New York art scene led him to study at the School of Visual Arts and the Arts Students League, where he developed new techniques and sharpened his technical skills. Reid has since created a body of work that reveals an impressive range of skills- from detailed-styled figurative realism rendered in oils to stunning watercolors that blur the line between figurative and abstract paintings to drawings in charcoal and pencil that demonstrate sound draftsmanship.


about SERRON GREEN : @xplorefreedom

As an artist, Guy's palette is strong and sophisticated. His layering technique has created a body of works so richly textured that one can hardly hold back from reaching out and touching them. It is the artist's intent and wishes that the viewer will follow their desire to reach out and feel the different textures in his works.



about MOSES SALIHOU : @moses salihou

Moses Salihou is a Cameroonian artist based in Toronto. He explores the ideas of belonging and existence by creating work that blends elements of portraiture and abstraction. Salihou's thick application of paint creates a textural intensity that mirrors our own internal complexities. Central to Salihou's work is his belief that human beings are composites of various identities, experiences, beliefs, and emotions. Salihou's gestural application leaves the defining features on the faces of his portraits only loosely representational. The portraits become composites of various people rather than fixed and stable identities, allowing the observer to be a participant rather than just a viewer. These rich surface effects provide Salihou's work with a sense of dynamism that captures the fluidity and movement he ascribes to the concepts of identity and personhood. Salihou has exhibited across the United States and Canada. His work is also in private collections globally, including in Europe, New Zealand, Africa, Asia, Canada, and the US.

Erica Morales (born in 1980 in Bronx, NY) is a Nuyorican native who has resided in Brooklyn since 2008.
Morales is a mixed media artist who combines elements of spray paint, hand-painted details, watercolor, collage, and text on paper. Her portraits depict the everyday stories of her Caribbean family and urban community. Drawing from her surroundings, she pays homage to what is familiar, which led to her passion for portraiture. In 2023, Morales exhibited at Long Island Museum's *SOMOS/WE ARE: Latinx Artists of Long Island and was awarded* the Rema Hort Mann Foundation *2022 Emerging Artist Grant*.
Morales earned a BFA in 2003 from the School of Visual Arts with an emphasis in drawing and an MA in 2010 from New York University in higher education administration.
