[Brooklyn, New York — NOVEMBER 2025] Tanya Weddemire Gallery is thrilled to present **FACES OF SUCCE\$\$**, an exhibition by Philadelphia-Born artist KING SALADEEN, opening November 1st, 2025. This is Saladeen first Brooklyn Solo Exhibition, and it charts the remarkable story of an artist who was destined for greatness from the very beginning. His is a visual griot, a storyteller who captures the importance of legacy-building while still climbing toward the apex of his triumphs. Each portrait functions as a rung on a ladder, propelling him upward.

Each brushstroke carries energy, not just to elevate his own story but to honor those who encouraged him to keep climbing. The view from the top is not the point; the journey itself, and the community that shaped it, is where the real triumph resides. Saladeen's breakthrough came at Philadelphia's First Fridays, where his best friend JP insisted, he sell his work. On his very first day, he sold a painting, and soon he became a fixture whose presence people anticipated. Among his nuclear family and close friends these figures became anchors and reminders that belief at the right moment can unlock tenacity and purpose.

King Saladeen art style is contemporary fine art paired with graffiti there is an unmistakable vibrancy and palpable energy. His use of color is bold and declarative, layering saturated reds, blues, greens, and yellows that fracture and reassemble the figures into something alive and whole. He doesn't blend so much as let the contrasts spark against each other, giving his portraits both immediacy and depth. The work holds playfulness and seriousness at the same time, speaking in a visual language that feels timeless yet rooted in the present. By flattening backgrounds and simplifying space, he pulls our full attention to the figures, transforming them into monuments of identity and presence.

Works like "The Side Eye" and "Ear Hustling" speak to tensions that Saladeen faced earlier on in his journey, meeting people that wore faces that presented as familiar and friendly, that soon revealed themselves to be masking an ulterior motive. "The faces change when circumstances change" Saladeen himself noted when asked about the works. These pieces capture how proximity to success can alter relationships. At its core, FACES OF SUCCE\$\$ is about more than achievement. It is about the balance between freedom and responsibility, the strength required to carry legacy forward, and the honesty to acknowledge that success can be as isolating as it is celebratory. It is also a collage that affirms that every individual holds greatness within them, even when triumph is shadowed by adversity.

The series **FACES OF SUCCE\$\$** is a testament to family legacy, perseverance, and the refusal to settle for ordinary. It affirms that Saladeen was not only prepared for SUCCESS, but he was destined for it.
