This marks a significant milestone for both the gallery and the artist, showcasing Salihou's captivating "**BOND**" series.

His **Portraiture Meets Abstraction** oil paintings on canvas are distinguished by rich textures and layered intensity, reflecting the complexities of the human experience. Through these works, the artist invites viewers to reflect on the intricate narratives and emotions that shape our shared existence.

Artist Statement: The "BOND" series is of figurative works inspired by everyday scenes drawn from my memories and relying on photographic references diverted to my vision. These works explore the question of black beauty, identity, friendship, complicity and transmission of values through these special moments while creating a strong bond, it's an entire identity that is celebrated, heritage and values which are transmitted to the youngest.

EXPO CHICAGO showcases leading contemporary and modern art galleries each April at Navy Pier's Festival Hall alongside a diverse and inventive program of talks, on-site installations, and public art initiatives. Inaugurated in 2012, EXPO CHICAGO draws upon the city's rich history as a vibrant

international cultural destination while highlighting the region's contemporary arts community. In 2023, EXPO CHICAGO was acquired by Frieze, the world's leading modern and contemporary art platform.

Moses Salihou is a Cameroonian artist based in Toronto. He explores the ideas of belonging and existence by creating work that blends elements of portraiture and abstraction. Salihou's thick application of paint creates a textural intensity that mirrors our own internal complexities. Central to Salihou's work is his belief that human beings are composites of various identities, experiences, beliefs, and emotions. Salihou's gestural application leaves the defining features on the faces of his portraits only loosely representational. The portraits become composites of various people rather than fixed and stable identities, allowing the observer to be a participant rather than just a viewer. These rich surface effects provide Salihou's work with a sense of dynamism that captures the fluidity and movement he ascribes to the concepts of identity and personhood. Salihou has exhibited across the United States and Canada. His work is also in private collections globally, including in Europe, New Zealand, Africa, Asia, Canada, and the US.
