#### Phase 1: Development of Standards

- Seconded to the Australian Council on Health Care Standards (ACHS) to provide project leadership and authoring of the National Standards for Mental Health Services and the associated consumer, carer and industry consultation process (at that time the largest mental health consultation project ever undertaken in Australia). Worked as part of a consortium including the ACHS, CHASP and AIMHS
- This role encompassed listening, influencing and interpreting perspectives across consumer, carer, professional and provider settings to create a set of universal human-rights based, outcome standards applicable to public, private and NGO mental health providers.

### Phase 2: Developing Accreditation Methodology for the Standards

- Seconded to Community Health Accreditation & Standards (CHASP) to provide project leadership, design and testing of existing and new approaches to health standards accreditation.
- This role required me to lead a design and change process to enable the standards to be used by the existing healthcare accreditors. This resulted in consumer reviewers on accreditation teams for the first time in Australia.
- Additionally, a new accreditation approach called TRAMHS (Tools for Reviewing Australian Mental Health Services) was developed and tested but subsequently not adopted.
