



Listening to each other gives clues (written comments in the survey):

Attractive place. ..Improvements have to start with residents. Junk yards & buildings are in deplorable conditions; so many houses in town are rundown with vehicles and clutter in the yard; clean up trashy houses; downtown looks sloppy and unkempt. People do not want to linger; Zoning needs to be enforced; we can not go forward without enforcing zoning; Homeowners and renters need to take pride in their homes and community.

Sense of community. New residents that move here get lost and don't experience sense of community; new people need a warmer welcome; we need younger families; a stronger social center would give people a place to build relationships; playground and parks could draw young families




