SYMBOLISM

- The white triangle represents liberty, equality, and fraternity.
- The horizontal blue band stands for peace, truth, and justice.
- The red band symbolizes patriotism and valour.
- The golden sun with eight rays is a depiction of unity, freedom, democracy, and sovereignty.
- Each of the eight rays stands for a province. The first eight provinces of the Philippines were Batangas, Bulacan, Cavite, Manila, Laguna, Nueva Ecija, Pampanga, and Tarlac.
- The three five-pointed stars in the corners represent the three major island groups of Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao.

THE PNRL - PAST 10 YEARS

- Established in Australia in 2011 with a view of expanding rugby league further into Asia
- Participated in several Emerging Nation competitions, victorious in most of our categories
- Establishment of various teams in gender and age group:
 - Senior Men's national team (Tamaraw's)
 - Senior Men's development team (Admirals)
 - Senior Women's national team (Sampaguitas)
 - U16 to U18 national teams (Junior Tamaraws)
- We have an established Junior representative pathways program
- A player base of 300+ eligible national team representative rugby league players
- Four team domestic competition in Manila

- 500,000+ registered participants in the Philippines
- Develop coaching and training programs for our domestic rugby league players

- Establish the first Philippine national wheelchair rugby league team who will participate in a World Cup
- Expand the national competition and establish training facilities and programs through the country

- First Asian nation to compete against European rugby league nations
