

To all stakeholders and members,

The Philippine National Rugby League is undergoing significant positive changes. Since 2011, Philippine heritage and domestic functions have been operating under a single banner. With the establishment of Pambansang Ragbi Liga Ng Pilipinas in 2020, our player participation system has recorded a robust number of registrations, totalling 634 worldwide, something we are extremely proud of. The Philippine Rugby League board has been diligently monitoring this success over the years to ensure that our participation numbers align with our yearly strategic goals.

With the increase in both domestic and heritage Philippine rugby league players and volunteers comes the responsibility of effectively managing the large player numbers to achieve optimal outcomes each year, with the ultimate goal of preparing players for potential representation on the Philippine national team.



Given the rapid growth and interest in rugby league both within the Philippines and internationally, the Philippine board has determined that it is an opportune time to separate all domestic operations from foreign operations. Our Australian affiliate, **RLNP Aust Inc.**, which is an Australian NSW registered incorporation headed by a dedicated functioning board, will manage all Australian-based Heritage teams including men's and women's development teams, and all boys' and girls' junior teams. Meanwhile, **Pambansang Ragbi Liga Ng Pilipinas** will continue to oversee the senior national teams, including the Philippine Men's Tamaraws and the Philippine Women's Sampaguitas.









So, what does this mean from a responsibility standpoint and what improves should you expect?


Responsibilities


- Pambansang Ragbi Liga Ng Pilipinas will continue to manage the senior Philippine national teams: Men's Tamaraws and Women's Sampaguitas. National coaches will also report directly to the Philippine board.
- RLNP Aust Inc. will be responsible for managing the Philippine heritage development squads, including men's and women's development teams, and heritage boys' and girls' junior teams from U16 and above.
- Both entities will be accountable for managing their relationships with their governing bodies, sponsors, and participation numbers accordingly.
