Manila Storm 2024 Champions PNRL Rugby League Grand Final

Manila, September 22, 2024. The Manila Storm secured their consecutive PNRL Shield Championship by triumphing over Gorillas Rugby with a score of 48-24 in the very wet and

tough Manlia conditions at the Philippine Sports Commission's PhilSport Complex Ultra.

The match began with the Gorillas taking an early lead as Neil Pickford crossed the try line in the first half. The game was fiercely contested, with possession frequently switching sides. Romario Capule, leader of the Storm, quickly equalised with a powerful try, setting the stage for an intense contest.

The Gorillas maintained heavy pressure, demonstrating strategic attacking plays that challenged the Storm. Ethan Ignacio scored his team's second try, keeping the scores close and competitive.

The Storm's defence was formidable, with notable contributions from Joshua Pilic, Sean Masip, Arwin Caparros, and Ian Pausanos. Vice-captain JR Ramirez played a significant role, orchestrating plays and directing the team efficiently. Juliann Feleo, playing as hooker, was crucial for initiating plays from dummy half thanks to his quick thinking and effective distribution, which helped control the game's tempo.

Just before halftime, Alfred Bangsal capitalised on excellent lead-up work. Larcel Caparros made key metres close to the try line, and Bangsal seized the moment by scoring from the dummy half, giving the Storm a two-try lead going into the break.

Throughout the match, John Denmer Tulabot was relentless in gaining valuable metres, which was essential for field position and maintaining momentum. His robust charges continually pressured the Gorillas, creating numerous opportunities for his teammates.

The Gorillas' perseverance paid off in the second half with two additional tries from Victor Besnoux and Xiaobo Zhang. However, the Storm's defence, guided by JR Ramirez's leadership, held firm and prevented further scores. The highlight of the game was Lito Ramirez's exceptional pace and footwork, slicing through the Gorillas' defence from near the 50m line to score the final try and seal the 48-24 victory.

Despite this loss, the inclusion of the Gorillas Rugby team in the grand final marks a significant milestone for the club and its promising young players. We look forward to witnessing the development of the Makati-based team and their dedication to player growth.
