





The U.S. Department of Labor has established the "American Job Center" network, in order to create a unified name and brand to identify online and in-person workforce development services as part of a single network of services that use public funding. The one-stop delivery system must use either that common identifier as its name, or use the tag line phrase, "a proud partner of the American Job Center network."

The State Board and NALWDB AE are responsible for guiding the establishment of a statewide one-stop delivery system, called One-Stop Centers (NMWFCC). This system is a collaborative effort among education, business, public agencies, and community-based organizations to provide services to job seekers and employers through a variety of access points.

The One-Stop Operations Manager (OSO) will designate a partner staff as the "Site Manager" who will act as the "functional leader" for the designated office. As such, they will have the authority to organize partner staff to optimize and streamline service delivery efforts as established by the NALWDB and OSO.




We Educate, Empower, Employ, and Enforce.
