Opening Remarks




The Inaugural Northern Region

Dr. Thomas Mason

Representing the largest employer in Northern New Mexico, Dr. Thomas Mason. With a PhD in Experimental Condensed Matter Physics, Dr. Mason has spent over 30 years involved in the design and construction of scientific instrumentation and facilities, and the application of nuclear, computing, and materials sciences to solve important challenges in energy and national security. Prior to his current appointment, Dr. Mason worked at Oak ridge National Laboratory for 19 years, including 10 years and the Laboratory Director. Dr. Mason was appointed as the Director of the Los Alamos National Laboratory, the 12th Director in it's 80-year history, in 2018.


