Northern Region Update



- DVR is beginning to see clients in the Santa Fe office; we are scheduling one client at a time for COVID safety measures
- Title I is working for new student enrollment for the spring semester.
- Challenges with enrollment due to schools not being open and job insecurity – many of the clients are in crisis and barriers with internet connectivity
- One Stop Operations is working with the state and the Northern offices to expand Wi-Fi to the parking lot to increase internet access for clients
- HELPNM is working with many of colleges across the region on Power Up MOUs between the board and the colleges – UNM Taos, UNM LA, Luna Community College – working on outreach with San Juan, UNM Gallop, and NMSU, etc.

Northern Region Update Cont.



- HELPNM is bringing in new staff and making sure there is representation in rural communities. We were in Taos last Weds facilitating the new Title I staff moving into the Taos One Stop
- DWS is working on Northern Hot Job Infomercials and highlighting employers and hot jobs to attract job seekers. The videos are being recorded weekly and are posted to YouTube as well. The teammembers are recording from Santa Fe, Taos, Farmington and Gallup via zoom. OSO is working on including the video on the Northern Work Connection's website
- The board and HELP NM is continuing to focus on outreach of the dislocated workers, since we know there is a great need especially during the pandemic.

Winter Youth Academy

- ☐ HELPNM provided WIOA youth services to 65 participants in the Ten Northern Counties
- ☐ 37 In School and 28 Out of School youth were eligible for WIOA services
- ☐ Mora County had the highest number of enrollments with 21 participants gaining work experience and job shadowing


