DOES YOUR PET HAVE A MURMUR?


As in humans, heart disease is common in our companion animals. We often detect heart disease by hearing a murmur on your pet's annual exam. A murmur is an audible sound indicating potentially abnormal blood flow within the heart. The murmur is assessed by its location and loudness. However, a softer or louder murmur does not always correlate with disease severity. In fact, some cardiac diseases are not associated with a murmur at all and we rely on radiographs/x-rays, bloodwork, or signs at home to help us detect them.

Once your primary vet has concern for underlying heart disease, the same advanced diagnostics used in human medicine can be utilized in our companion animals.

CARDIAC DIAGNSOTICS/TESTS?

Echocardiogram is an ultrasound of the heart; assessing the structure and function. Echocardiogram allows for visualization of the murmur originally heard on physical exam or diagnosis of more silent forms of heart disease such as Dilated Cardiomyopathy. We also can perform ECG and Holter monitoring for abnormalities in the heart rate/regularity.

These diagnostics allows for a definitive diagnosis; leading to more specific medical (or surgical) recommendations to be made, depending on the findings.
