Review - capital letters and full stops

Sam is at a tap.

- 1. Read the sentence.
- Explain to the children that capital letters are used at the beginning of a sentence and for names.

A man is at a tap.

- 3. Read the sentence.
- 4. Explain that some capitals are a similar shape to their lower-case letters (like S), and some have different shapes (like A), but each capital always has the same sound as its lower-case letter.
- 5. Show the children the full stops. Explain that full stops are used at the end of sentences.



The dog will yap if I yell.

7. Apply: The teacher dictates while children write a sentence taken from the daily planning.
