MAY 8, 2022: Fourth Sunday of Easter

"My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me . . . No one can take them out of the Father's hand." John 10: 27-30

Paul Farmer wanted to the cure the world.

He believed that access to medical care was a human right. Farmer was a practitioner of "social medicine" — illness and disease, he taught his students, had social roots and must be addressed through fixing broken social structures and systems that kept people chronically ill and poor. While still a student at Harvard Medical School in the 1980s, Paul and his colleagues opened a one-room clinic in a remote village of Haiti. They not only cared for the sick but also trained a team of community health care workers to serve surrounding areas.

That clinic was the beginning of Partners in Health that Dr. Farmer founded in 1987. Over the last 35 years, Partners in Health fundamentally changed the way health care is delivered in the most impoverished places on earth. In addition to 16 clinics in his beloved Haiti, Partners in Health operates in 11 other countries, serving millions of people every year.

Smart and funny, with a relentless drive to do good by those he served, Paul Farmer inspired countless others to do the same. He treated everyone with genuine compassion, kindness, and dignity; he seemed to specialize in overcoming dysfunctional politics and violence to improve the lives of the sick, the poor and the vulnerable. He lived among the people he was treating, moving his family to Rwanda and Haiti for extended periods. Dr. Farmer raised millions of dollars for Partners in Heath.

In Tracy Kidder's book Mountains Beyond Mountains: The Quest of Dr. Paul Farmer, A Man Who Would Cure the World, Paul Farmer explained what drove his love of being a doctor:

"God gives us humans everything we need to flourish, but he's not the one who's supposed to divvy up the loot . . . You want to see where Christ crucified abides today? Go to where the poor are suffering and fighting back, and that's where He is . . . "

The late Paul Farmer modeled the role of "shepherding" that Jesus calls each one of us to take on: to accompany one another through the steep paths and dangerous ridges we all must walk, not diminishing the danger or pain but helping one another make our way through them. The challenge of taking up the Good Shepherd's staff is to face the truth despite our own fears, to seek out God's light (if only a flicker) in the midst of overwhelming darkness, to reach out to grab someone falling despite our own tenuous grasp. In our own acts of generosity, love, and forgiveness, we give voice to the Risen Christ and the good news of hope and grace that is Easter resurrection.
