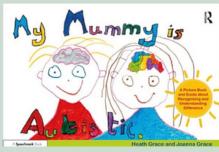
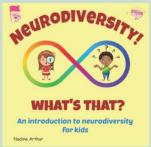
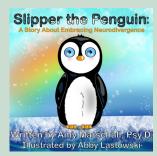

★ They are nice pastel colours and come as a set of 4.

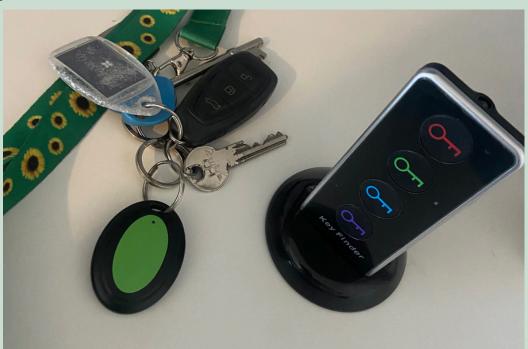
★ You are able to slide the buttons from X to reveal <a>✓
