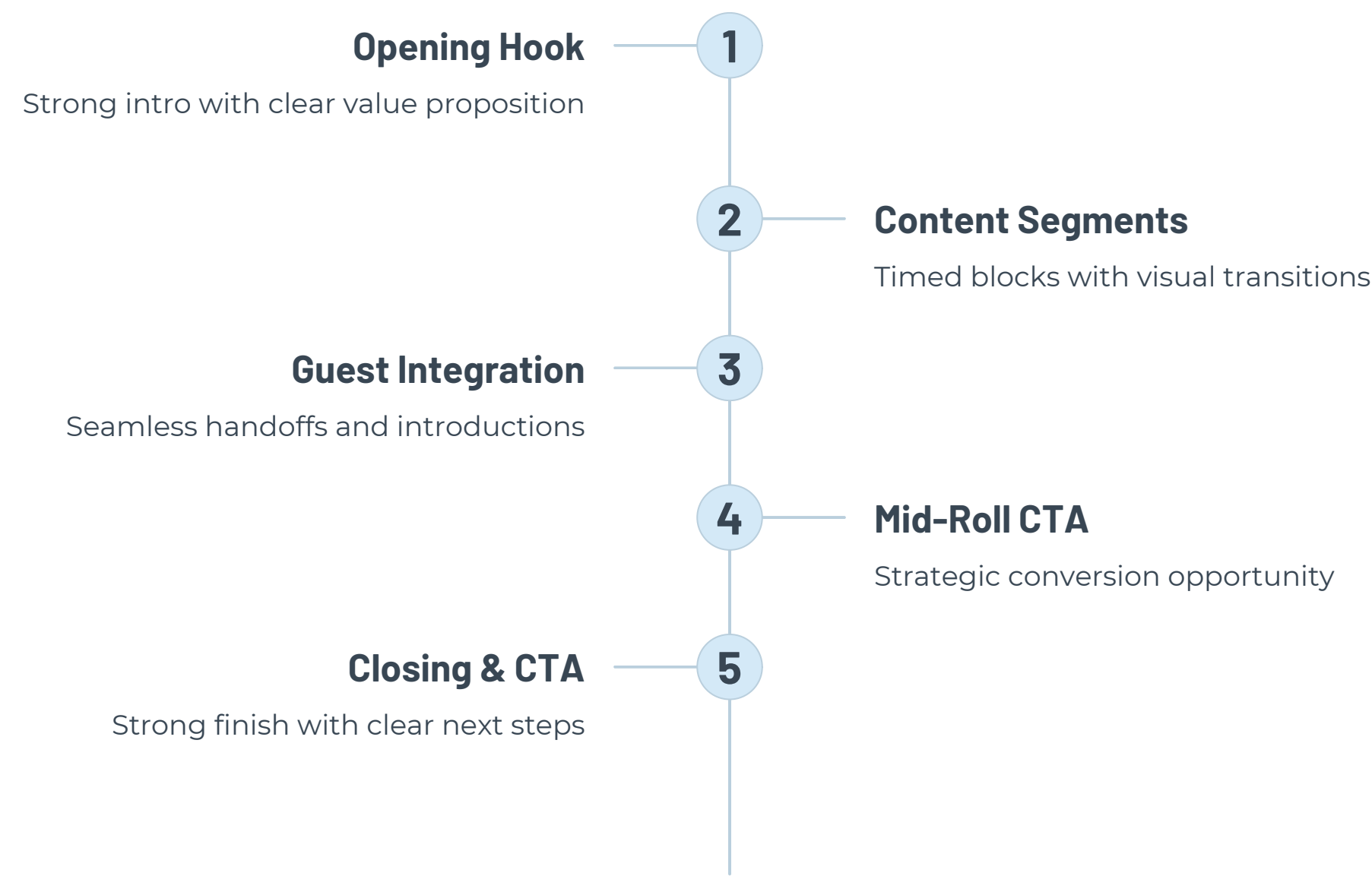

# Run-of-Show Control

Professional broadcasts maintain precise pacing and timing that keeps viewers engaged from introduction through final call-to-action. Without dedicated show control, segments run long, transitions feel awkward, and momentum dies. Viewers sense the lack of structure and tune out.
