C. Haydee Mas, Ph.D., PC, first duly sworn and upon oath, hereby deposes and states as follows:

1. I am a licensed family and children's therapist in the Salt Lake City area.

2. I am the primary therapist for Lily and Caleb Bowen having been appointed by the Court.
3. I have conducted therapy sessions with the minor children since November 2007.
4. I see the Bowen children approximately once or twice each month.
5. I believe my relationship with the children is positive, that the children trust me and are therefore open and honest with me.
6. I am aware that the divorce proceeding has been contentious, but my major concern has been for the welfare of the Bowen children. I have never advocated for either of the parties, or positioned myself in favor of either.
7. I absolutely believe the children's version of the facts surrounding the incidents in the Virgin Islands while in the care of Gordon Bowen. They reported to me that they were forced to sleep naked (a portion of the time), in the same bed with each other, and in the morning Gordon Bowen was in bed with them.
8. During this same period of therapy the children revealed that when they cry that they want to be with their mother, Gordon becomes angry, yells at them, and spansks them, hard, sometimes on their bare bottoms.
9. The children are credible when it comes to the facts alleged above.

10. The children are clear and consistent regarding what happened in the Virgin Island while in the care of Gordon Bowen.
11. In my opinion the children were not coached by Ms. Bowen or anyone else in regards to their report.
12. As specified above, the children reported they slept together, on occasion naked, and their Father was in their beds when they awakened in the mornings.
13. The children were extremely uncomfortable about being required to sleep without their clothing.
14. I believe that the incidents as reported are inappropriate, they should not have happened, nor should incidents like this continue to happen with the Bowen children.
15. I wrote a letter to the GAL and asked for an investigation, and advised that parent time should be restricted until the matter was completely reviewed.
16. I do not know who the GAL talked to in regards to an investigation but apparently according to Barbara, they never interviewed the children.
17. I communicated to Ms. Bowen that the children needed protecting from the type of behavior described above.
18. I communicated my concern that the parent sharing time should not take place until the matter was fully investigated and reviewed.

19. I wrote a letter to the GAL and suggested the matter be fully reviewed, and there should be no overnight parent-sharing time until that had taken place. The oral communications to Ms. Bowen were more restrictive in terms of parent-sharing time than the restrictions I suggested in the letter to the GAL. I did this because it is my understanding that it was the specific job description of the GAL to take the lead in protecting the children, and I hoped they would suggest a plan to protect the children.

20. Apparently, even after I expressed my concerns to the GAL and the evaluator, no restrictions were put in place. I understand the only one interviewed in this regard was Gordon Bowen himself.

21. It is concerning that neither the GAL nor the evaluator even interviewed the children, especially after I expressed substantial concern, and advised them that the reports of the children were credible and convincing.

22. The handling of the situation by the other professionals is a concern because the children are extremely uncomfortable and agitated about what happened and do not want to go with their father on further parent-sharing time.

23. Because of my concern for the safety of the children I referred the matter to DCFS.

24. I am concerned that the Bowen children are not being adequately protected. There seems to be a knee jerk reaction from the GAL and Dr. Christy when I express concerns regarding the children with their father, it is somehow Barbara's fault.

25. I believe, as my correspondence suggested, a thorough investigation should be conducted, and until the matter is reviewed, parent-sharing time should be restricted.

26. I am concerned that when I attempt to protect the children by asking for an investigation the response is that I am advocating for one party. I am neutral in regards to the parties. My concerns are solely to protect Lily and Caleb.

27. Heretofore, the response has been, that if I feel that there is any basis for wrong doing on the part of Mr. Bowen, I become an advocate for Ms. Bowen. This response concerns me, because when I attempt to protect the children I automatically, become an advocate for Barbara Bowen. This is not nor has it ever been my intent.
