Description

<u>Size and Shape</u>- Medium-sized songbird with long legs, a long tail, and a small head <u>Color Pattern</u>- mostly gray-brown with a white patch on wings and white belly and chest

<u>Behavior</u>- Are often found alone or in pairs and are very visibly seen often perched on shrubs, trees, and fences or hopping along the ground or on mowed lawns

<u>Song</u>- Varied; Long series of chirps and phrases

<u>Habitat</u>- Found in areas of low shrubbery or in grassy areas

Range- All of the United States and Mexico year-round

<u>Diet</u>- Mostly insects (such as beetles, ants, and bees) in the summer and fruit (mostly berries and wild fruit)in the winter
