A Note from the Pastor

Happy April, UCPC family! This month's pastoral ponderings are from both of the Reverends Bergh and are based on Daniel 3:

Have you ever felt so overwhelmed by a cascade of life events coming your way, that even though you make do, every once in a while, something bub-

bles over and makes you scream "SOMETHING HAS TO CHANGE!"

Well, Easter shows us that 'something' *has* changed. Christ has spoken light into the darkness. Christ, who lives so that none more shall die, has entered into the furnaces of our hearts, and has revealed something so life-changing that God's response to our cries of "something has to change" is: Something HAS changed!

In the book of Daniel, chapter 3, we hear the story of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego (or Rack, Shack, and Benny if you've seen Veggie Tales) being thrown into the fiery furnace by King Nebuchadnezzar, yet being saved by God through the presence of an angel.

For Nebuchadnezzar, seeing four men unharmed in the tempest of the fur-

nace changed everything, so much so he starts hooting and hollering: "Get out of that furnace, you children of the living God! Blessed be the God of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego!"

So too does Jesus call to us from the furnace. In the Apostle's Creed on Easter Sunday, we said, "Jesus was crucified, died, buried, and descended


into hell." This version reminds us that our savior Jesus Christ goes to the

hellish places and transforms them with his heavenly presence. It's from the pit of nothingness (and fire) that Christ our God makes somethingness (and goodness).

Just as Nebuchadnezzar called Rack, Shack, and Benny out of the furnace, Christ has pulled us out of the furnace of hate and sin through our baptisms, and placed us on the dry land of grace. Our Lord did this by going into the furnace before us when he was crucified, died, and buried.


That's the message of Easter: Jesus took us with him into the grave, so that we may have no fear of it anymore. "O Death, where is thy sting?" "O Hell, you cannot scare us anymore!" Christ has been into the shadows, into the furnace, into the grave, and now he has left death behind like it was nothing but dirty laundry. If Christ took us with him into the grave, how much more surely will he take us into newness of life that we so long for? This Easter, we stand firm without fear, clinging to this promise: if we have been united with Christ in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. His death and resurrection has changed something, not just for those alive 2,000 years ago, but for you and me as well. Something *has* changed. Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!

Minutes of the January 18 and 28, 2024 meetings of the Session, as corrected The following written reports from committees of session were received:

It was moved and seconded to approve the consent agenda (above), and to discuss the finance committee report in more detail during old business. Motion was APPROVED by unanimous consent.

Orders of the Day (7 p.m.)

Deacons' report Comments from the Congregation. No comments were received. Clerk's Report. No report, other than a backlog of session business.

Old Business

The Finance Committee report was discussed. The account designated as a safe-guard to pay for the Pastor's Salary in hard times has been depleted from \$20,000 to about \$11,000 and has not been replenished. Currently, we are able to pay a half-time pastor's salary that does not include benefits that are required to be paid for a full-time pastor. It was recommended that UCPC have a gift and memorial policy so that donors know what to expect, and the church can carry out it's financial responsibilities. Session agreed that this is a good idea.

Finance committee made recommendations to consolidate some of the designated giving accounts. It was moved and seconded to consolidate the accounts, as recommended by Finance Committee in a manner consistent with the purpose for which the money was given, as follows:

Move the Buddy Break amount of \$879.20 to Bingle Camp;

Move the Kalen Memorial amount of unspent \$1,000 to Major Maintenance;

To use the Choir/soloist designated giving account (\$2,500) to purchase music, as needed, for the choir;

To use the Knox Bequest (\$7,179.88) in support of the Knox Organ Fund (\$1,531.79) as needed. The motion was APPROVED by a vote of 6 yes, 0 no.

The session discussed to best way provide committee reports to the congregation. It is expensive and inefficient to print a lot of copies and it may be inappropriate to provide sometimes sensitive information to the many non-member groups who use the church building or peruse the UCPC website. It was moved and seconded to email the committee reports as a separate document to members who receive the newsletter by email, and to include a notice in each newsletter that copies of committee reports are available from the administrative assistant upon request. The motion was APPROVED by a vote of 6 yes, 0 no.

New Business:

- Rock of Israel Ministries, a Christian organization that reaches out to Jewish people, has asked to speak to the congregation. The session decided to reach out to Messianic Jews and others to help determine whether this is an organization with which UCPC wants to be associated.
- It was moved and seconded that the UCPC Narthex serve as a polling place for the May 7 Special Election. Motion was APPROVED by a vote of 6 yes, 0 no. Session decided to accept the \$100 facility use payment from division of elections. The usual polling places (Beaver Sports and University Baptist) are unavailable. Pastor Erika will let election workers into the building to drop off equipment.
- The Rev. Elizabeth Schultz, who is the Executive Presbyter of the Presbytery of Yukon (of which UCPC is a member church) will visit UCPC sometime during April, May, or June to greet members. The session welcomes Rev. Schultz on whichever Sunday works best for her.
- The next session meeting with Interim consultant, Rev. James is April 4, which is before we present her video introduction to the congregation. Session agreed that Doreen should contact Rev. James to reschedule.

Roger Smith will take minutes of action items and progress for the Interim process.


