

A Note from the Pastor

Last month, at the Golden Days Street Fair, Ottilie completely fell apart. We're talking yelling and sobbing and attempts to run away. It was hot, she was hungry, it was nap time, it made sense. So my response to the meltdown was basically just "be present" (except to try and keep her near me and not out of my sight, as well as get her into the shade). Other adults were looking between me and her and their eyes were bugging out of their heads, clearly holding back the desire to call out "What?? You're just doing nothing???"

Doing "nothing" — a classic interpretation.

However, I was doing the complete opposite of "nothing." I was using a meltdown response strategy I learned from a parenting course I'm taking. The "do nothing" strategy does look like I'm doing nothing from the outside, but really, I'm doing so much work on the inside – staying calm and regulating my emotions so my kid can feed off of me, assessing safety, remaining sturdy for them to wail against, etc.

In comparison, the classic parenting strategy of responding in a multitude of ways (involving external words or actions by the parent), *usually* means that absolutely no work is being done on the inside of the parent and because of that, the external actions and words by the parent *usually* aren't very effective.

As I've been practicing the "do nothing" strategy, I've been pondering what it might look like if applied to our faith lives, particularly in light of the story of Mary and Martha from Luke 10. If we replace the external event of a child's meltdown with the external event of Jesus entering into their home, then Martha took a classic path of serving Jesus and seeking to support, help, and host him well. That is a holy and required path to take. But in this metaphor, if she is doing all these external actions, is anything happening on the inside — in her faith life? Or was nothing happening? Was she able to be fully present with Christ? I suspect not.

I imagine it might be like if I try to listen to a podcast while doing the dishes. In this scenario, I'm not fully present with either activity. So while the podcast may have *technically* been listened to to completion, will I have retained anything from it? Probably not. And while the dishes may have *technically* been done, did I get to thank God again for the food we ate as I scrape and wash remnants off of the plates? Probably not. Perhaps you are different, but for me, what I am learning is that when too much is happening externally, *likely* nothing is happening internally.

And perhaps, the same can be true for our faith too. If we're so busy serving God externally, we may completely forget about or even make the decision to forgo chances to do the internal work of being fully present with God. Mary can inspire us though. In the story in Luke 10, she chose the "do nothing" strategy in the face of an external event (the appearance of Jesus in her home).

In her decision to let the world or her sister get mad at her for doing "nothing," she chose to prioritize her own need for internal growth as Christ's follower. She chose to do nothing on the outside so she could be doing everything on the inside to be fully present in that external event.

We can look at Martha's decision to use a classic strategy of external service to God in response to the external event of Christ showing up in her home. And we can look at Mary's decision to use the "do nothing" response to that same external event of Christ appearing in her life. Both responses are good and necessary. But my prayer is, that Mary's "do nothing" approach, can inspire us to carve out time to "do nothing" as well and "just" sit at the feet of Jesus. The world or our family may see us doing "nothing" and get mad at us, but we will know, that really, we are doing so much work on the inside, connecting with God, talking with God, listening to God, learning from God, and therefore growing with God.

And ultimately, growing with God is what we need the most. So that *when* we are called upon in service to God, we will have a strong, sturdy foundational relationship with God to draw from and our attempts to serve Him

- Rules for conducting a session vote by e-mail were reviewed and amended. Motion to approve the amended rules was seconded. Motion was APPROVED by a vote of 6:0. The rules are as follows:
 - The Session of UCPC may use e-mail to act on non-controversial or time-critical motions.
 - The moderator shall use discretion when relaying confidential information.
 - Quorum shall be one-half of the Session members.
 - If a member objects to the matter being presented or decided, or wants to discuss the matter in detail a special meeting (with simultaneous aural communication) shall be called to discuss and act on the motion.
 - Voting: A minimum of 3 days shall be permitted to complete voting.
 - Passage of a motion requires a unanimous vote, provided there is a quorum. If the number of members voting does not constitute a quorum, or if the votes on the motion are not unanimous, the motion shall be discussed at a meeting.
 - Any actions taken by this process shall be recorded in the minutes of the next meeting of the Session with a notation that the action was taken by electronic vote.

- **Wedding/Marriage Information Form.** A new form that Pastor Erika has been working on was reviewed and suggestions were made.


