A Note from the Pastor

This past month I finally sat down and read "Autopsy of a Deceased Church: 12 Ways to Keep Yours Alive" by Thom S. Rainer. This book has been on my shelf and my "to read" list for literal years. I've just been too in denial and scared to read it. In denial because I didn't believe it could contain anything that would apply to any church I was at. Scared because what if my denial wasn't right? What if the church I was at, was heading towards death? But I'm so glad I worked up the courage to read it. Despite my critiques of it (particularly how it ends), I encourage you to read it as well. It's a short book with great questions for thought or discussion at the end of each VERY short chapter.

After examining and interviewing congregations that closed, the author observed a common theme among them: they stopped focusing on the community and ministry needs around them and shored up their resources to take care of themselves. Their focus shifted from outward-oriented to internally-oriented. Usually it wasn't an overnight switch; rather, it happened over the course of years — if not decades — such that no one inside the church could see the trend for what it really was. I can't stop thinking about this. How easy it is for small decisions here and there to start snowballing such that we drift way from our true purpose and mission which is to be outside our "four" walls, spending every penny we can on the people and needs in our community.

As I've been reflecting on this dichotomy of outward- vs. inward-focused church ministries, I've been drawn to reexamine the concept of "F.R.O.G.". Perhaps you've heard of this acronym. F.R.O.G. stands for "Fully Relying On God" (or "Fully Rely On God"). On the surface, I love it. "FROGing" is exactly what I want to be doing, and I'm sure you feel that pull too. As Christians, that's our call after all! We are called to FROG — to fully rely on God. We pray, we lift things up to God, we ask for God's help with stuff, we thank God for the ways God has provided, and on and on. Often I feel like I am FROGing and so is the Church.

I was reminded of our call to FROG when we heard an imperative from Jesus during worship this past month in Mark 6:

⁷[Jesus] called the twelve and began to send them out two by two, and gave them authority over the unclean spirits. ⁸[Jesus] ordered them to take nothing for their journey except a staff; no bread, no bag, no money in their belts; ⁹but to wear sandals and not to put on two tunics.

Jesus is asking the disciples to FROG on a level I have never tried. He is basically commanding them to become homeless and trust that God will provide shelter, clothing, food, safety, etc. as they have need of it. How many of us can say that we operate the same way? Of course the world has changed since then and life expectancies are longer, etc. so a lot of our realities, and therefore absolute necessities, have changed. But still, we have homes (and maybe also second homes or cabins), 401(k)s, cars, boats, RVs, checking & savings accounts, hedge-funds, land, stocks & bonds, IRAs, and so much more. And when we add all that up, it ends up meaning that most of us are not actually FULLY relying on God, but rather, only partially relying on God. We have stockpiled wealth for ourselves and our church(es) in case of hard times, emergencies, or for when/if we are no longer able to work. I'm not saying these aren't necessary things in today's world, but it does make truly being able to FROG, more difficult.

If a church has shifted from outward-focused ministry to an inward-focused life, one symptom is that budget lines that once funded ministries happening outside the church's walls have now been cut in order to preserve "the essentials" like the building/ utilities and the pastor's salary or to build up a rainy day fund. Again, don't hear me saying

that buildings, pastors, and rainy day funds aren't great things, but if they become ends instead of means, what happened to God? Are we so worried about safety and security we're unwilling to trust that God works through us? And *that* is what makes truly FROGing so difficult in today's day and age. It's sneaky and easy to slide off course of truly and fully relying on God because we can *think* that we are, even when we are not.

What this means is we have to be intentional, aware, and diligent. We have to keep track of decisions and pay attention to what is lost as well as gained. Fully Relying On God takes work. Hard work. But it IS possible. It requires being willing to go against society and against our own gut. It requires us to shift our mindset and internal cultural values. It requires us to lean into uncertainty and scarcity and trust that God will provide, multiplying a few loaves and fishes such that there ends up being an abundance left over. When we are able to see scarcity and uncertainty as an opportunity for God to work a miracle, rather than when we need to batten down the hatches and panic, *that* is when we start to get into what it means and feels like to FROG. It's scary. It's hard. But it *is* possible.


