## A Note from the Pastor

We Gather — Advent 2023


There is power in gathering. When we gather, our energy is joined with others. We feed off each other and support one another in the task at hand. Whether we are giving space for grief to flow, shouting chants so lawmakers can hear our voice, studying for a test, or singing and dancing and making toasts till the cows come home, gathered people create energy.

Why? Well as Christians, we may recall Jesus promising his disciples that if two people agree on anything then they should ask God for it and it will be done. "For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them" (Matt. 18:20). Wow. That's a lot of power. All we need is two people agreeing and then asking God and God will do that? That kind of power could make the world an amazing place. That kind of power is proof the Spirit of Christ has come down on us.

During the pandemic, we saw the pain of NOT gathering together. We saw the dysfunction of the world and the demoralizing and de-energizing power of separation. Gathering together these past few months, with our first potlucks and Thanksgiving meal since the pandemic, has shown what a great gift Christ's Spirit is, and how potent the promise is that Jesus makes in Matthew 18.

In Matthew 18, Jesus promises that where two or three (or more!) are gathered in the name of God, the advent of God is upon us. God, the source of all energy and life, appears there with us. God, the source of all peace and love. God, the source of all goodness and joy. God, the source of all creation. *That* God is there when we gather in His name. There is power in gathering because when we gather, all the little images of God in each of us are combined to create a much larger and more comprehensive image of God at work in the world – lamenting, learning, advocating, celebrating, and much more. We are what St. Augustine calls the *Totus Christus*—the total Christ.

This Advent, we'll be worshipping under a theme of "We Gather" – celebrating the ways we come together during this season, in particular, to welcome the new-born king, the Prince of Peace, the Immanuel, God with us. For where two or three are gathered in Jesus' name, there God is, too. So, come and let us gather together, as we both celebrate the God Immanuel with us already *and* await the God incarnate yet to be born.

## Reports: No reports were discussed further.

## **New Business:**

Plan for By-laws updating and special congregational meeting. Doreen McNeill and Jim Durst (after he comes on the session in January) volunteered to guide updates. Joe and Jerry have comments regarding the by-laws and will send them to Jim and Doreen.

Finance committee recommends a plaque be made thanking UCPC donors to the boiler replacement campaign, listing names of donors as well as respecting those who preferred to remain anonymous, for the approximate cost of \$500. It was decided that Jerry will find out which donors want their names on the plaque.

The Finance committee seeks guidance of session on whether: to develop an independent capital cam-

paign starting in 2024 to reduce the UCPC mortgage (the single largest monthly expense of the church) and/or to increase non-cash contributions to the church through encouraging gifting of property, CDs, IRAs, etc. It was decided that before this is done, we need to have a clear vision for what mission this money should go to when the mortgage is paid off, and that will be part of the campaign.

#### **Old Business**

Annual Meeting was discussed. Consensus was that it went well.

Transitional consulting update. The Search committee has a meeting scheduled for Nov. 28.

## Orders of the Day (7PM)

Deacons' report. Donita Lawhead gave the deacons' report. Deacons were thanked for their outstanding service.

Comments from the Congregation. No in-person comments were received from the congregation.

Discussion: *The Invitational Christian.* Pastor Erika led the discussion of this book. Members agreed to continue the discussion, as this is a worthwhile book, with clear ideas that could be implemented at UCPC.




Thanks to all who contributed to the Thanksgiving potluck, and to all who attended! It was a lovely time of fellowship with a *lot* of fabulous food.

# CHRISTMAS JOY OFFERING

Why is the Christmas carol "What Child Is This" so meaningful to us? Yes, it links a beautiful tune with inspiring words. But it is more than that. It is in the vision behind and beyond the tune and text where we find the deeper truths.

When we sing "What Child Is This," we sing of a flesh-and-blood human, born under the most vulnerable of conditions. We sing of Emmanuel, "God with us."

When we sing "What Child Is This," we are reminded of infants born in our

own life stories, our congregational communities and beyond, down the street and around the world.

The words "so bring him incense, gold and myrrh" remind us not only of the gifts the Magi offered to the baby Jesus — the perfect gift — but also how we can support those whom God loves with our own gifts.

With the words "the babe, the Son of Mary," we sing of all those who are vulnerable and in need, which includes those who receive support from the Christmas Joy Offering. Emergency and health assistance and educational opportunities are real, human needs — needs that we can help meet.

The Christmas Joy Offering supports retired ministers and church workers and their families through the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions as they face medical and emergency costs. The Offering also supports students in Presbyterian-related schools and colleges equipping communities of color, as they pursue their education and prepare to bring their gifts in service to the church and world. We are receiving it on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Advent (Dec. 17) or anytime during the Advent season.

Thank you for your generous gifts to the Christmas Joy Offering, and your ongoing prayers for all those it supports. Your gifts make a difference, and bring praise to the babe, the son of Mary.






# Rooted in Love: Fall 2023 Stewardship Update
