A Note from the Pastor:

Later this month we will begin the season of Lent, a time of preparation for the celebration of Easter. With that in mind, here is some information you may find interesting followed by a reflection you may find meaningful during this season of self-reflection and self-examination.

Everything you Ever Wanted To Know About Lent

When does Lent begin? Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 22nd. UCPC will have an Ash Wednesday service at 7pm in the sanctuary. After my vacation there will be a container in the narthex where you may place small slips of paper with the sins from which you'd like to be freed. We will burn those sins with last year's palms and use the ashes to mark the forehead of those attending the Ash Wednesday service.

What are Lenten Simple Suppers? After Ash Wednesday, for six weeks UCPC will host Wednesday night simple suppers. We'll have soup, bread and salad at 5:30pm followed by a brief discussion of the book, *FORGIVENESS: A Lenten Study* by Marjorie Thompson. We should finish by 7pm so Choir can continue without interference and folks can get home at a reasonable hour. Please sign-up in the narthex.

Where did Lent get its name? The word "Lent" originally meant "springtime." Because the church season always fell at that time of year, the name came to apply to it as well. Even after the word "Lent" was no longer used for spring, it was still used by the church to describe the season leading up to Easter.

Why does Lent last forty days? The early church celebrated Lent only for a few days before Easter. Over the centuries, the length of the season grew until it was several weeks long. In the seventh century, the church set the period of Lent at forty days (excluding Sundays) in order to remind people of the duration of Jesus' temptation in the wilderness.

How did the tradition of "giving up something for Lent" start? Over the centuries, the church began to baptize and confirm people on days other than Easter Sunday. Lent was no longer a time of preparation for these events, but it remained as a special time of prayer and fasting. After the Reformation, the discipline of fasting became unpopular. Thus, as a way of preserving Lent as a time of self-sacrifice, the church leaders encouraged people to give up something

What does Lent mean for us today? Lent is still the church season in which we prepare for Easter Sunday. It is a special time of prayer and reflection, of confession and self-sacrifice. It is a time to remember the temptation, the suffering, and the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. Most of all, it is a time to ready ourselves for the humble thankfulness and sheer joy of Easter morning – it is a time to ready ourselves to meet our risen Lord once again!

For Reflection: Read slowly each of these different kinds of fasting/feasting; be aware of which ones seem to challenge you; focus on those to which you are called to Fast/Feast during this Lent.

Fast from judging others... Feast on Christ dwelling in each Fast from seeing differences...Feast on the Spirit in all life Fast from apparent darkness... Feast on the reality of light Fast from thoughts of illness...Feast on the healing power of God Fast from words that pollute...Feast on phrases that support or confirm Fast from discontent...Feast on gratitude Fast from anger...Feast on patience Fast from worry...Feast on trust in God's Providence Fast from complaining...Feast on appreciation Fast from hostility...Feast on non-violence Fast from bitterness...Feast on forgiveness Fast from self-concern...Feast on compassion for others Fast from discouragement...Feast on hope Fast from lethargy...Feast on enthusiasm Fast from idle gossip...Feast on prayerful silence Fast from suspiciousness...Feast on Truthful Relationships

Minute Stated Meeting of Session University Community Presbyterian Church

January 19, 2023, Student Lounge

Roll call: CP Lois Hildenbrand, Roger Smith, Matthew Bierer, Joe Krizek, Paula Long, and Doreen McNeill (Clerk) were present. Jerry McBeath was absent. Guests Deacon Melissa Bierer, Confirmand Frederich Bierer, and prospective Member Kathy Taylor Yokel were also present. The clerk declared a quorum.

Moderator Commissioned Pastor Lois Hildenbrand opened with prayer at 6:35 pm.

Scripture and Devotion: Roger Smith led a devotion on the Lord's Prayer.

Orders of the Day

- At 6:15 p.m. Notices were posted on outside doors for members to call to be allowed into the locked building to attend the session meeting. No comments from members were received.
- At 7:00 p.m., Confirmand Frederich Bierer, and prospective Member Kathy Taylor Yokel were examined and **approved for membership by unanimous consent.**

The following items were approved by unanimous consent via a consent calendar:

- Session Minutes of the Stated Meeting of Session for December 15, 2022, special Session meetings for December 29, 2022, and January 15, 2023.
- Reports from Building Stewards; Finance, Treasury & Stewardship; Interim Pastor Search Ad Hoc; Mission and Outreach; and Worship committees.
- Norma Wivoda's resignation from board of Deacons
- Hackett's transfer of membership.

New Business:

- Elder Training. Pastor Lois spoke on interpersonal communications and recognizing pitfalls. Jesus provided guidance in Matthew, chapter 18. Lois reminded us that the only person whom we can <u>control</u> what they learn and change is ourselves.
- CP Lois Hildenbrand gave her pastor's report. Elders are encouraged (not required) to help staff a second committee. Chairs were reminded that it is their job to make sure work gets done, not to just do the work themselves.
- Deacon Melissa Bierer gave the deacons' report. Deacons were commended on their extraordinary service to the congregation.

UCPC Session News

Reported 2 correspondences from members of the congregation. A request to reinstate passing of the peace during worship was referred to Worship Committee. A concern will be worked through as soon as possible.

The Call to the February 24-25 Presbytery Meeting in Eagle River.

Doreen McNeill was elected Clerk of Session.

Session members signed up for committee chair and elder of the month assignments. Some committees still do not have a Session Elder Chair.

Paula Long will be Elder Commissioner to Presbytery meetings in February and October.

CP Lois Hildenbrand remains our temporary pastor.

There are 2 parts to calling an Installed (called) Pastor:

Lois will start the required Mission Study with a Mission Study Team after she returns from vacation. A Mission Study typically takes 6 months and will allow UCPC to move forward with our pastor search, even though we have not secured an Interim Pastor who is normally tasked with leading a congregation through this process. Session will begin to select Mission Study Team members.

After the Mission Study is completed, a Pastor Nominating Committee will be formed to search for an Installed (called) Pastor.

Meanwhile, the Interim Pastor search sub-committee continues (see attached report). Joe Krizek will replace Muffie Durst on the sub-committee.

Roger presented financial information:

We paid our full fair-share to Presbytery

Our mortgage payments are up-to-date

Financially, we are "in the black" for 2022, mostly because we are not currently paying a full-time, installed pastor.

Joe presented boiler project information. The bids were higher than expected, but we are hopeful that, with further fundraising, the costs can be covered. Total projected cost including boiler, accessories, training, Beckley's installation, permits, and other work will be \$91,085. The boiler will cost \$25,805 F.O.B. (and is subject to increase in 2023, so it should be ordered as soon as is reasonable.) Joe will have the agency providing the \$7,500 grant send a check directly to Proctor Sales to pay against the boiler. Electrical work will be done for the cost of materials only (an incredible savings) by UCPC member Brian Dixon of The Electrician.

It was moved and seconded to (a) execute the proposed contract with Beckley Mechanical Company for \$54,785 with a required completion date of August 31, 2023; (b) buy the boiler for \$25,805 directly from Proctor Sales in Anchorage (F.O.B.); and (c) continue to fundraise. Motion passed by Unanimous Consent. Old Business

Tabled from December 2022 meeting:

Mission committee motion to do something about the homeless situation was tabled. Pastor Lois will contact the borough and city to find out if they have homeless liaisons who can help these people.

Building Fees – Roger will continue to work with building stewards to update fee structures and rules.

SESSION COMMITTEE REPORTS

Clerk's Report:

Received a Christmas letter from the Hackett Family and a request to transfer their membership to a church in Michigan.

Received a letter from Deacon Norma Wivoda resigning from the board of deacons.

<u>Building Stewards Committee</u>: ~

Joe Krizek met with **Beckley Mechanical Inc.** for a pre-bid site inspection. **Slayden Plumbing & Heating** did not attend the pre-bid inspection.

UCPC has a new used **snowblower** with lots of power to blow the hardened snow piles and clear the yard between the buildings in the spring. It was purchased from Karl Kalen and donated to UCPC.

Design Alaska was paid \$2250 for work done to submit the boiler plans for inspection at the Borough and the Office of the Fire Chief. The fire alarm system was tested and is up to specification except for the fire horns at the main entrance on the deck. Further work is scheduled to correct the problem.

Finance, Treasury & Stewardship: Sarah Lanstra, Jerry McBeath, Curtis McNeill, Roger Smith, and Pastor Lois Hildenbrand were present. The meeting began in prayer led by Jerry.

- We discussed the pledge drive. By 12/31/22 approximately \$181,500 had been raised. Some 27 individuals/families have made pledges, and additional contributions are expected in the new year.
- The boiler system replacement project is on target for completion in 2023, thanks to two large anonymous donations, a state grant, and many generous donations from the congregation.
- We reviewed the December income report and reasoned that given the amount pledged for 2023, estimated loose offerings, and rental income, we are in a good position at this stage in recruitment of an Interim Pastor.
- Due to uncertainty regarding financial terms for the person called to be the Interim Pastor, the committee considered it premature to discuss other issues of stewardship. We expect to be able to support a full-time interim pastor in 2023, but it might require a special offering to raise the required funds.

A check was sent to Presbytery at the end of December to pay the balance of UCPC's Fair Share.

Because Jerry is unable to attend the January 19th Session, Roger volunteered to address finance/treasury questions. The meeting closed in prayer led by Roger. ~ Submitted by Jerry McBeath, with addition to #4 & addition of #5 by Roger Smith

Interim Pastor Search Ad Hoc Committee Report ~ Muffie Durst, Roger Smith, Paula Long, and Doreen McNeill spent many hours on the search. We had three serious candidates. One withdrew because the situation at his church required him to stay longer. Two more went through a more complete process, but both ended up deciding that a move to Fairbanks would be more challenging than they initially realized when they were asked. At this time, Lois Hildenbrand is still our temporary pastor, but the search for an interim will continue. ~ submitted by Muffie Durst

Mission and Outreach: ~ Present: Lois, Janet B., Donita, Muffie

- We planned for Souper Bowl collection of food for the Food Bank on Feb.12.
- We discussed the Agape Dinner for Helping Alaska. We do not plan on getting a table, but will have a slide prepared so people will know about the dinner.
- We discussed making breakfast burritos on Sunday, January 29 after church. Burritos can go to the Door and for our Little Free Pantry.
- We would like to know more about what is happening with the GAP (God Always Provides) ministry of our personal needs closet. It does not get a lot of use, but Jimmie gets an occasional call from Helping Alaska for items from there. We used to get much more frequent calls.
- Cold weather clothing closet We will put a few coats up on the fence one or two at a time to see if that fits the needs better. The idea of a specific time to get items does not seem to fit the schedule of those who need such items.
- Focus on Mission schedule was set up until Feb. 12.

<u>Worship Committee</u>: ~ The committee met at 7pm Thursday, January 12^{th} in the Conference Room. Present: Jim Durst, Patti Gallagher and Lois Hildenbrand. The meeting opened with prayer.

- Choir has low attendance, but Patti continues to find music to accommodate. She would like to know sermon topics farther in advance so the choir has more time to prepare pieces. Various tools for that were discussed.
- Special Music during worship: Soloists are encouraged, but not required, to be part of and rehearse with choir. 'Special Music' musicians must communicate in advance with leadership to coordinate with worship planners, and with the Sound Team so the right equipment is in the right place at the right time.

The Choir Room needs cleaning and organization. Patti will create an event where she can get help.

Worship Committee Tasks and membership

Lois agreed to email the current UCPC Committee Job Descriptions to committee members.

Obtaining "Prayer Persons" each week was discussed, including training and helping the congregation understand the intent.

Obtaining Liturgists each week was discussed, including training, and a list of potential liturgists.

Pulpit Supply for Lois' vacation. Rev. Ericka Bergh will preach 1/29 and 2/5.

Ash Wednesday will be 7pm Wednesday, February 22, 2023. Lois will obtain ashes from dry palms from previous years and "sins you'd like to be rid of" written on small slips of paper and deposited, anonymously, in a collection vessel in the Narthex. Jim will burn these (outdoors) and the ashes will be used for the service.

Maundy Thursday – if Lois is still at UCPC she would like to have a Seder. We discussed options.

Good Friday – Jim will talk with Sarah about the digital Stations of the Cross.

Palm/Passion Sunday - Choir will prepare two Anthems. A Palm Sunday celebration piece in the Anthem spot and a mournful, passion piece for the Offertory.

Easter - Lois will work on a brass/woodwind ensemble.
