Stated Meeting of Session
University Community

December 15, 2022, 6:30 PM, Fellowship Hall

Moderator Commissioned Pastor Lois Hildenbrand opened the meeting with prayer at 6:30 pm.

Scripture and Devotion: Patti Gallagher presented a devotion on Matthew 7:1-5.

Present: CP Lois Hildenbrand, Patti Gallagher, Roger Smith, Paula Long, Jerry McBeath, Muffie Durst, and Doreen McNeill.

Absent: Janet Johnson.

Guests: Deacon Lynne Krizek, deacons-elect Carol Nielsen and Sarah Lanstra, elders-elect Joe Krizek and Matthew Bierer.

The clerk declared a quorum, the amended docket was approved and minutes of the November 17 meeting were approved by unanimous consent.

Orders of the Day

Notices were posted on outside doors for UCPC members to call to be allowed into the locked building to attend the session meeting. Clerk's correspondence is in the attached written report.

Pastor Lois submitted her Pastor's report.

Pastor Lois read a letter from elder elect Ruth Knapman, who withdrew from serving as an elder. Ruth's resignation was accepted with regret.

Deacon Lynne Krizek read and discussed the deacons' report. Deacons were commended on their outstanding care and nurture of members.

New Business:

- New Officers. Deacons elect Carol Nielsen and Sarah Lanstra, Elders elect Joe Krizek and Matthew Bierer were examined and approved. Elder-elect Larry Johnson and deacon-elect Janet Johnson will be examined later.
- Approved proceeding with a plan to complete the gas boiler installation in the new year (2023).
- Approved moving forward with our financial commitment for travel, salary and housing for our agreed interim pastor candidate (when we have one) according to the current regulations by Presbytery.
- Approved the following communion dates for 2023: The second Sunday of the month in January September, the first Sunday of October (World Communion Sunday), the second Sunday of November and December, Maundy Thursday, Christmas, and Easter.
- Review of rental fees was tabled until January.
- Approved removal the following people from the membership roll: Colleen Cavanaugh, Arva Chiu, Jeanette Gaul, Trevor Morton, Lorraine Phillips, Russ Sharpton, Eric Solie, Jeannie and Dan Talbot, Richard Wagner, Mark and Kathy Bertram. Motion passed by unanimous consent. These people are welcome to worship with us. Removal of people from membership rolls who do not participate in the life of this church will decrease the cost of our per-capita and fair-share payments. Pastor Lois sent a nicely worded letter to the above members who have not been present for several years or have made it known that they do not attend UCPC and also do not contribute financially. The letter included a return post card with a response deadline.
- Appointed Muffie Durst as elder commissioner to the January 7 Presbytery meeting.
- Approved use of a "consent agenda" (also called a "consent calendar") beginning at the January meeting.
- Approved signing the contract that Presbytery's Ministry Commission approved between UCPC and Pastor Lois.

Old Business

- 1. Approved removal of signs and requirement that the right side of the sanctuary is reserved for people who are masked.
- 2. Clerk was directed to remove recurring kitchen evaluation regarding COVID from the docket. It will be revisited if circumstances require it. **Amended committee reports were approved.**

DEACONS' REPORT

The following tasks were discussed and completed during December:

- Gift cards were purchased as **Christmas gifts** for the pastor, the office administrative assistant, the church choir director and the organist. A basket of snack treats was purchased for the custodial crew. To start the new year with a healthy spending balance, deacons prepared a request for transfer of \$300.00 from the General Fund to Designated Giving.
- Deacons hand delivered or mailed **Christmas greetings** to all names on the Care List by Dec. 18. These cards included an insert announcing the time for Christmas Eve and Christmas worship services, the Christmas Joy Offering and the Adopt-A-Family tree.
- Communion continues to be served using two stations of the elements, requiring 3 servers plus the pastor. Current and former deacons and elders are called upon to assist with serving communion. There will be no communion on Christmas Eve this year. Communion was taken to 2 members at the Pioneer Home. Pastor Lois plans to resume traveling communion with deacons in January to those who have been unable to attend worship in person.
- The link to the *FoodTrain* app was given to deacons to sign up for meals for 1st Presbyterian Church member and UCPC friend, who is in hospice care. Pastor Lois also contacted persons who indicated on the talent tithe a willingness to provide meals when needed.
- A member has moved to Fairbanks from North Pole. He will need **transportation** to worship service. Deacons will discuss options at the next meeting.
- As is tradition, **poinsettias for bereaved church families** were delivered during December to 12 UCPC members. The **administrative secretary** was honored with a gift on her birthday.
- Notes of thanks were given to those who volunteered for various tasks around the church (snow plowing and shoveling, greeter, nursery, projection slides for worship, substitute choir director, fellowship following worship, finances).
- The 2022 deacon board welcomes the class of 2023 Janet Johnson, Sarah Lanstra and Carol Nielsen. They join returning members Melissa Bierer, Donita Lawhead and Norma Wivoda.

The next deacon meeting is January 5 at 5:00 p.m. Officers will be appointed and Care List assignments given.

SESSION COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Clerk's Correspondence:</u> ~ Ministry Commission approved signing of the contract with CP Lois Hildenbrand as our temporary pastor, and approved Lois being session moderator. We will send a thank you note to Rev. Rich Mauer for being session moderator for many months. Respectfully submitted in Christ's Service, ~Doreen McNeill, Clerk of Session

<u>Building Stewards Committee:</u> ~ Joe Krizek has been working on completion of the 100% drawings for the gas boiler and submitting them for approval by the DEC and Fire Department. Contractor bids are expected in January. Much work was done by Stewards and others to clear snow from the parking lot, the sidewalks and the deck.

Finance, Treasury & Stewardship: 12Th December, 2022 at 8:00 p.m. Sarah Lanstra, Roger Smith, and Curtis McNeill were present. We began the meeting in prayer led by Roger.

- We reviewed the statement of accounts for the Designated Fund. It was noted that \$29,636.24 is shown as the balance in the Boiler System fund. Adding the grant for \$7,500 and the promised \$35,000, we have a grand total of \$72,136.24. The last given total cost for the installation is \$80,000. Given that there is a reliable and generous guarantor (to remain anonymous) to fund the difference, the Finance Committee recommends to Session that UCPC proceed on a plan to complete the installation in the new year (2023).
- The Committee reports, with satisfaction, that we have <u>completed all mortgage payments for the current year</u>.
- Only 67% of Fair Share contributions have been paid. In view of Presbytery's needs and our obligation, we plan to complete the remaining 33% before the end of the year.
- To simplify our operating account, finance committee will merge building repair and maintenance with equipment repair and maintenance lines in the new year.
- The committee recommends to session that UCPC move forward with our financial commitment for travel, salary and housing for our agreed interim pastor candidate (when we have one) according to the current regulations by Presbytery.
- Sarah Lanstra will be added to the list of signers on UCPC checks.

The meeting ended with prayer led by Sarah.

<u>Interim Pastor Search Ad Hoc Committee Report</u> ~ Muffie Durst, Roger Smith, Paula Long, and Doreen McNeill have interviewed three pastors that seem interested in coming to Fairbanks. We are down to two candidates, as one of the three removed himself from consideration. Please pray for discernment for the right pastor to be called for this interim position. ~ submitted by Muffie Durst

Mission and Outreach: ~ The December 2022 Mission and Outreach Committee meeting opened and closed in prayer. Present: Theresa Reed, Janet Brower, Muffie Durst, Pastor Lois Hildenbrand, Donita Lawhead.

Adopt-A-Family details were finalized for delivery. The cold weather clothes closet big block of time give-away did not work. We will try hanging a few things at a time (mostly coats) on the fence by the little free pantry. We will have a few items in the office area for Jimmie to grab if someone knocks on the door. We are considering sources for giving away the excess clothing after a while. We will reevaluate next month how things are going. Twelve Days of Christmas canned food drive will be from Christmas until Epiphany or January 8, the Sunday closest to then.

Focus on Mission schedule was set up for the next month.

Loving Families will be returning this spring, so we need to start preparing. We have excluded the following dates for hosting: February 19 – 26 or April 2 – 9. If there are other dates session believes we need to exclude, we need to know.

Worship Committee: We very much appreciate Sarah Dietsche's generous help as she stepped in to direct the choir while Patti Gallagher had surgery and was in recovery.
