

### A Note from the Pastor

Happy New Year!

Every New Year's Eve, my family begins a puzzle that we finish after the new year so we can joke that "this puzzle took us since last year to finish!" But this year we did something different, we drove up to Weller Elementary and watched fireworks and the Aurora at the same time. It was beautiful and awesome and it reminded me that light can come from unexpected places, at unexpected times, and in unexpected ways.

We never knew which direction the next firework would come from, so we were constantly twisting this way and that while looking at the horizon. And similarly, we also didn't know which part of the Aurora would flare at any given time. So again, our heads were on a swivel gazing up above us. We had to be alert and keep looking all around us for the next potential sighting of beautiful and surprising light.

In January, we transition from the season of Christmas (through January 5th) to the Day of Epiphany (January 6th) and then the Season after Epiphany (January 7th through Ash Wednesday). This transition takes us from the easily identifiable source of the light of God: Jesus lying in the manger, to a more ambiguous source of God's light: a star on the move and Jesus growing up, becoming mobile. As we know, once babies start to roll over, you can never be quite sure that where you put them is where they'll remain. Epiphany marks the growth of Christ such that he can now move independently in the world. As awesome as this is, it also means that we can no longer look just at the manger scene and know Christ is there, like we can during Christmas. Now, Jesus might be in the synagogue or in someone's home, he might be in Nazareth or in Jericho, he might be on the beach or on the side of mountain, or he might be praying alone in a garden or eating a meal with friends. The Season after Epiphany invites us – through the readings each Sunday – to seek out Jesus wherever he might be. And we do this by following the example of the Wise Ones — the Magi from the East.

On Epiphany Day, we celebrate the Magi following the star that appeared in the sky before Jesus' birth — especially since it took years for them to reach the place where the star stopped. We gain from the Magi an example of determination, despite distance and length of time, to seek out the true source of the light that appeared unexpectedly in the sky and in their lives. So too, might we in the Season after Epiphany, see some unexpected lights appear in our life from surprising directions or places. We may need to spend more time seeking Christ diligently since his presence in the world and in our lives may be less obvious than when he was lying in a manger.

My prayer for you this month, is that as the days grow a little longer each day, as the stars in the sky continue to shine, as candles are lit indoors, and as the Aurora dances overhead; that each and every encounter of light can remind you that even though Jesus is now on the move, he is still present and with you in every up and down of life.

May you see and know that the light of Christ is with you in this new year and new season.





General Assembly proposed 12 amendments to our Book of Order and governance structure. Each Presbytery has until July 1, 20054 to vote for or against ratification. To prepare for the vote at the winter meeting (2/20-22/25, via Zoom), our Presbytery will host two Zoom meetings in January and February to review the voting process and to discuss these amendments. These meetings are geared to Elder Commissioners and pastors, but anyone is welcome to attend. The dates for the 2 meetings are Thursday, January 23 and Tuesday, February 11. Both meetings will be held from 6:30 to 8:30PM.

#### Orders of the Day (7 p.m.)

- Deacons' report: Marijo Larson presented a verbal report of the Deacons' activities. Deacons were thanked for their faithful and loving service.
- Comments from the Congregation. Doreen received no comments from the congregation and no one joined the meeting to comment.
- Clerk's Report. Doreen highlighted items in the clerk's report. The clerk also received a letter from Yukon Presbytery highlighting the suggested mission support (a.k.a. per capita). The letter was reviewed and passed on to Roger for the Finance Committee to determine the amount that UCPC can give.

#### **New Business:**

Discussion of committee reports, if needed.

Finance. Roger reported that, in addition to the written report, his request for information needed from our current insurer, Church Mutual to search for insurance elsewhere to begin on January 1, 2025 elicited a quote from them. Church Mutual is dropping insurance on all buildings (the structures) in Alaska because of the high cost. Umialik Insurance (An Alaskan company) will now insure the UCPC building, while Church Mutual will insure other aspects of our insurance needs. The final quote is a 5% increase from 2024 insurance rates. Session agreed that this is a reasonable amount, Umialik is a known and reputable company, and that at this late date, we need to say yes in order to have insurance coverage on January 1, 2025.

**Hospitality**. Being an usher as part of Elder of the Month duties is not working well, because of other duties before church, and this important activity was being taken care of informally by Muffie Durst after Jerry McBeath's passing. We discovered that Kathy Taylor Yokel has taken on the task of finding ushers. **Pat Babcock**, committee chair, will coordinate with Kathy, as this is part of the Hospitality, Fellowship and Membership committee duties.

**Faith Development**. Paula Long reported that Faith Development has no changes to activities. Marji Illingworth reported that Ron Illingworth is working with Milt Wiltse to find a good time to do an adult Sunday School about the major figures in the Protestant Reformation and the history of the Presbyterian Church.

The Personnel Committee moves that this flexible plan be approved: Pastor Erika may take 2 weeks of vacation before her baby is born (beginning approx. January 29) and 12 weeks of Family leave (as approved in her contract) beginning after the baby is born. Motion was APPROVED by a show of hands 7:0. If everything unfolds as planned, her first day back in the office would be Monday, May 5 and her first Sunday back in the pulpit would be May 11.

It was moved and seconded to approve the following for communion: In 2025, communion should be celebrated monthly, typically on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of the month, and may be celebrated as often as every Sunday, as well

as Christmas Eve, Ash Wednesday, and Maundy Thursday, with home communion as needed. Dates will be chosen in coordination with the Board of Deacons, the Pastor, and Worship Committee. Motion was AP-PROVED by a show of hands 7:0.

The Worship Committee moves that no collection be taken at the Christmas Eve service, viewing it as a gift freely given to the community. An appropriately marked receptacle will be stationed in the narthex to receive any loose and check offerings to go toward the Christmas Joy Offering. Motion was APPROVED by a show of hands 7:0.

The Finance committee moves that Lynne Krizek be added to our signature list for checks. Motion was APPROVED by a show of hands 7:0. David Swanson will be removed once he moves out of state.

Fairbanks Korean Presbyterian Church needs an elder to round out their session (administrative commission), which will meet approximately every-other month. No one on session wanted to add this task to their plate. Session members were asked to canvas other elders who are not currently on session to see if they are interested in helping this sister church. If anyone is interested, they should contact Doreen.

It was moved and seconded to **elect Jim Durst as elder commissioner to all Presbytery meetings in 2025, with Roger Smith as the alternate.** Motion was **APPROVED** by a show of hands 7:0.

General Assembly (GA) proposed amendment distribution & Presbytery training dates. **Doreen** will correct typos. It was agreed to give this info sheet out to the congregation in January with notice of the January training meetings regarding these proposed amendments. This Zoom meetings will be January 23 at 6:30 pm and repeated on February 11 at 6:30 pm.

Session noted the new piano cover in memory of Dick Morris.
