A Note from the Pastor

Happy July to you all!

I want to start with a quote from *Reclaiming Rest* by Kate Rademacher:

"As author and Episcopal priest Lauren Winner notes, we are surrounded by messages 'extolling the virtues of treating yourself to a day of rest, a relaxing and leisurely visit to the spa, an extra long bubble bath, and a glass of Chardonnay.' In this context, Winner asks, 'Whom is the contemporary Sabbath designed to honor? ...Why, the bubble-bath taker herself of course!' In contrast, traditional Jewish and Christian teachings on Sabbath offer an entirely different worldview. The bubble-bath taker is not at the center of the story. God is. And the gift and discipline of rest help remind us that we are not God."

We. Are. Not. God.

Now, have I been worried that any of you have a God-complex and actually think you're God? Definitely not. But sometimes it can be hard to remember that because we're not God, we can't do it all.

Lately, Ottilie has been so eager to do a list of a multitude of things every day after daycare. She wants to go to the library, go "swimming" in the kiddie pool, take our dog to the "puppy park," go to the store and get a donut, and do an art project. We usually have about two hours between when Ollie picks her up and when we have dinner and bedtime. Do I think it's possible to do all of those things in a two hour timespan? Not comfortably. So instead, as she's listing them off, we have started encouraging her by saying "today while you're at school, how about you think about what you want to do and just pick one thing to do today."

While some of these items are not exactly "restful" (especially for mom and dad), they *are* life-giving for her. But trying to do too much in a day would defeat the purpose, and turn these life-giving activities into life-draining ones.

I know that adult lives are more complicated than toddler lives; just picking one thing on the list of things to do is not always practical. However, I wonder if it is still possible to "treat yo' self" like the *child* of God that you are when you make plans on any given day. Ask yourself "What can I do today, and what can I leave for God to do?"

Perhaps you're already doing this, seasoned adults as you are. If so, great! Keep up the good work! But if you haven't ever tried this before, I encourage you to see what it's like. Narrow your list down to a tiny number and trust that God will help with the rest. It's not easy to let things go or set them aside. Especially things that are important. How do you choose between grocery shopping because you have to eat something or fixing a broken window so the smoke doesn't get inside the house? I wish there was an easy way to definitively tell you how to triage these decisions. But there's not, only trial and error. When we set things aside for another time, we are de-centering ourselves and re-centering God—an important spiritual practice! The practice (and I do mean "practice" because it is not easy to do) reminds us we are "not at the center of the story. God is."

I pray that in this busy month you find ways to "treat yo' self" through the Christian worldview of decentering yourself and re-centering God. Let go of some things. You aren't God, and God wants to do things for you. And if your shortened list of "keeps" still includes a bubble bath, I leave you with this midrash about Rabbi Hillel (Vayikra Rabbah 34:3):

One day, Rabbi Hillel told his students, "I'm going to do a commandment: I'm going to take a bath." The students said, "Is that really a commandment?" Hillel told them, "Yes. If those who wash the statues of kings set up in the theaters and circuses are given status, how much more will I, who was created in the Divine Image and Form, will be rewarded!"



#### Orders of the Day (7 p.m.)

Melissa Bierer gave the Deacons' report and several items were discussed. Deacons were thanked for their wonderful work

Comments from the Congregation: No written or verbal comments were received.

Clerk's Report. The clerk had nothing new to report.

#### **New Business:**

**Notification from Personnel Committee:** The Personal committee members (the chair, Matthew Bierer, was not involved) notified session that the Admin Assistant, Melissa Bierer's summer office hours will be Monday through Thursday, 9:00 to 2:00. This was agreeable to the session and the pastor.

Motion from Personnel Committee: It was moved to approve the draft contract with Rev. Erika Bergh, pending minor edits in the document. Motion was approved 6 yes, 0 no.

#### **Motions from Finance Committee:**

It was moved to adopt the budget column in the YTD 6.17.24 document as the 2024 UCPC budget. Motion was APPROVED 6 yes, 0 no.

It was moved to use all of the Designated Giving maintenance funds for the 2024 Christian Education building's first floor window replacement project, if those funds are needed. Motion was AP-PROVED 6 yes, 0 no.

It was moved and seconded to rename the Interim Pastor Search Ad Hoc committee. Motion failed 0:6. It was moved and seconded to dissolve the Interim Pastor Search Ad Hoc committee. Motion was AP-PROVED by a vote of 6:0.

#### Additional committee report information:

Building Stewards were ready to install a replacement door that was rusting through when they found out it was an interior door. The door was returned and a replacement exterior door was ordered.

We are only \$6,000 short of having all the funds needed to replace the first floor Christian Ed building windows. Finance committee believes that the funds can be found, especially if the Designated Giving maintenance account is used.

Doreen notified the session that Rev. James bill for \$300 for 2 hours of consulting was submitted for payment.

Matthew summarized the June 9 potluck. Attendees stated that they would have preferred more time to digest the summaries before being asked more questions.

**Adjourn Pastor** Erika led the closing prayer and the meeting adjourned at 8:45 pm.




The lawn mower has been repaired, so it is again available for use!
