sins. Colossians 1:13-14

Preparing to write this newsletter article on forgiveness, I went to my usual website to look up scripture, Biblegateway.com. Its scripture of the day was Proverbs 17:9. "One who forgives an affront fosters friendship, but one who dwells on disputes will alienate a friend."

Matthew 18:21, "Then Peter came and said to Jesus, "Lord, if my brother or sister sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?"

Matthew 26:28, "for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins."

Helping Alaska (formerly Love in the Name of Christ) is planning on restoring Loving Families. This program helps homeless families get back on their feet. Be looking for signups soon after church. In case you don't remember or have not been involved, there are two main slots each day. First is greeting the families and having a meal ready for them. This time slot also involves possibly helping with homework or playing a game with kids. It runs from 5:00 until 7:45. The second slot is an overnight one. Depending on the day of the week or the age of the children, it may involve some activity time with the families before they get ready for bed. It goes from 7:30 pm to 7:30 am. If being at church does not work for you, there is set up and takedown to be done as well as food that needs to be purchased. Think about how God might be calling you to help.

Minutes Stated Meeting of Session University Community Presbyterian Church

Present: Commissioned Pastor (CP) and moderator Lois Hildenbrand; elders Paula Long, Jerry McBeath, Matthew Bierer, Roger Smith, Joe Krizek, and Doreen McNeill (Clerk), Deacon Carol Nielsen

Moderator Hildenbrand opened the meeting with prayer at 6:35 pm.

Scripture and Devotion: Paula led a devotion about forgiveness as an act of love, including 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 & Proverbs 19:11

We approved the docket; Minutes of January 19, 2023; Committee Reports for Building Stewards, Faith Development, Finance, Treasury & Stewardship, Interim Pastor Search Ad Hoc Committee, Hospitality-Fellowship-Membership, Mission and Outreach, Nominating, Personnel, Worship.

Orders of the Day at 7:00 p.m. There were no comments from the congregation.

New Business:

<u>Elder Training</u>: Pastor Lois' elder training was based on the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Items covered were 1) G-1.0103, including that the session leads the congregation in fulfilling its responsibilities for the service of all people, for the upbuilding of the whole church, and for the glory of God; and 2) G-3.0201, including that the session is the council for the congregation. The session has the power and responsibility to make sure the Word of God may be truly preached and heard, make sure the Sacraments are rightly administered and received, and nurture the covenant community of disciples of Christ.

<u>Deacons' Report</u>: Carol Nielsen gave the deacon's report. Their next meeting is March 2 at 5:30. As the March elder of the month, Matthew Bierer will attend the meeting. Paula Long will attend if Matthew is unable to go. Deacons will appoint a member to staff the Nominating Committee.

- Regret that she will be unable to lead a mission study as planned. She explained how a Mission Study process
 works to create an up-to-date mission statement and path for the church. It is done with the guidance and
 participation of an Interim Pastor (which we do not have), to prepare the congregation for calling an Installed
 Pastor. A Mission Study committee surveys the congregation, holding meetings to ask questions to discern the
 needs and path of the congregation.
- Lois requested someone lead the Lenten book study on Wednesday evenings throughout Lent in conjunction with Simple Soup Suppers. Paula Long volunteered.
- Elder, Deacon, and Trustee pictures need to be updated. Lois will try to find someone to do so.
- Lois received a request from Ruthann Dohner that Ruthann be removed from the rolls of active members. It was moved and seconded to remove Ruthann from active membership. There was no opposition. Motion passed.
- We have 5 young children attending church and a request to have Sunday School. Who will teach?
- Homeless Liaison: The borough does not have a homeless liaison (we are outside the city limits). Lois has the City of Fairbanks Crisis Now Coordinator contact information.
- The church needs a wedding coordinator to work with the wedding party, hospitality committee, deacons, sound managers, and building stewards. Few weddings occur, but this task requires close coordination when they do occur. There is a wedding coordinator handbook. Fees are being reviewed by Roger & the building stewards. Further discussion will occur at the March session meeting.

Board of Directors for the University Community Presbyterian Church Corporation:

- It was moved and seconded that the following slate of corporation officers be elected: President, Paula Long; Vice President, Roger Smith; Treasurer Jerry McBeath; Secretary, Doreen McNeill. Motion passed by Unanimous Consent.
 - It was moved and seconded that Joe Krizek be given authority to act on behalf of the church's property owner (Presbytery of Yukon), and UCPC Corporation to work with the Fairbanks North Star Borough, D.E.C., Interior Gas Utility, and other entities necessary to install and use a gas boiler in the church. Motion passed by Unanimous Consent.

<u>Fair Share Pledge to Presbytery of Yukon</u>. UCPC will make their best effort to see to it that this \$20,065 pledge is paid to the Presbytery to support mission and functioning of the church as a whole.

Motion from Worship Committee: UCPC will immediately reinstate regular passing of the peace in our services, recommending that it be done by gestures rather than by touch. Motion passed by unanimous consent.

DEACONS' REPORT, JANUARY 2023

Four UCPC Deacons met on Feb. 2, 2023: Donita Lawhead, Melissa Bierer, Sarah Lanstra, and Carol Nielsen. Our fifth Deacon, Janet Johnson, attended via Zoom.

Carol gave a brief devotional. There was no Session or Pastor's report. We hope Session will send a representative to Deacons' meetings regularly, as they have done in the past. We understand that Session is seeking another Deacon to add to our number. Treasurer Sarah reports approximately \$800 in our account. Care lists were reallocated and distributed to each Deacon by Melissa. Communion was organized for Feb. 12; traveling communion last month was provided to 2 members. Meals were provided to one person and transportation to worship for another person has been arranged. Pastor Lois and Donita visited a sick member in late January. We discussed contacting our care list people on upcoming church Lenten events. A number of people deserving special thanks were assigned to each deacon. Finally, situations and prayer needs of several members were discussed and prayed for. Our next meeting is March 2.

SESSION COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Clerk's Report:</u> Sent a letter to Calvin Church in Muskegon, MI, transferring Hackett's membership, to which the church responded affirmatively.

Building Stewards Committee: ~

Boiler project:

The State of Alaska Fire Marshal Plan Review is approved. We have received the SOA-FM approval letter and certifications. The Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation review process is on hold because the new online submissions program is locked up.

The Interior Gas Utility responded to our request for gas service with the following explanation. "In order to provide natural gas to your location, it would require a Main Line Extension. Those are approved on an individual basis and are not guaranteed. As a small public Utility, our budget for Main Line extension is limited. We allocate those funds to benefit the maximum number of customers possible." This is the first I heard of approval required for mainline extension. I was told was that gas was available on College Road and UCPC is ready to convert to gas. I should have an answer in 2 weeks if IGU plans to do a mainline extension to UCPC. I hope UCPC will be a large enough customer to make the extension economically feasible. COGIC has made a Gas Service request. Beaver Sports, has not, but is interested. The more users we have on the mainline extension the better.

• Doreen and Joe are working with FNSB to have Neill McKay's name replaced with Joe's name (per UCPC corporation officer's approval) on the boiler grant application. Then the \$7,500 grant will be secure.

<u>Fire Alarm Repairs:</u> Siemens performed the annual fire alarm test and inspection Jan 17, 2023. The two outside horn strobes did not work. There is a proposal to replace the old devices with new devices for \$920. Respectfully, Joe Krizek

<u>Faith Development Committee</u>: ~ Simple Soup Supper and Lenten study on Wednesdays during Lent This book study will be shepherded by Paula Long.

<u>Finance, Treasury & Stewardship:</u> In attendance were: Sarah Lanstra, Curtis McNeill, Jerry McBeath, Roger Smith and Pastor Lois Hildenbrand. Jerry opened the meeting with prayer.

Old Business

- 1. The committee reviewed UCPC income and expenses from January 2022 through early February 2023. The year ended with positive balance largely because Pastor Lois is serving part-time.
- 2. A review of the January DG report led to a few changes in funds (e.g., replacing "Love, INC" with "Helping Alaska).
- 3. Bank balances were:
 - Operating, \$56,203.94
 - Fuel, \$498.33
 - Designated Giving (DG), \$88,089.94
 - The committee will move \$5,000 from the operating to the fuel account to keep the buildings warm.

New Business

- 1. To repay the loan from DG to the operating account in 2020, the committee unanimously agreed to move \$11,760 to DG: Pastor Salary.
- 2. The committee added Sarah Lanstra to the names of those authorized to sign checks.

Closing

- 1. The next Finance Committee meeting will be March 6, 2023, at 5:45 pm.
 - 2. Roger closed the meeting with prayer

Subsequently by email, Jerry asked members whether they would approve paying the \$20,065 fair share obligation, and only one has not yet responded. Sarah notes that the payment is already in this year's financial plan. Two members agree that notwithstanding UCPC's fiscal challenges, this is an obligation for which we, as members of the Yukon Presbytery, are responsible. The third could go either way. That's enough background for a vote, which the committee may support. Best, Jerry.

Interim Pastor Search Ad Hoc Committee Report

Two of 4 potential interim pastors declined interviews, two have not yet replied. One who we interviewed last fall and was interested but could not work on our schedule then but who thinks he might do so now. Roger is sending reminders to those who have not responded.

Mission and Outreach: $^{\sim}$ February 8, 2023. Present: CP Lois Hildenbrand, Theresa Reed, Muffie Durst. We opened in Prayer. One Great Hour of Sharing offering will be received on Easter Sunday, April 9. Plans were made for encouraging members to give. Loving Families is scheduled for March 5-12. Help is needed. We were reminded that we are a Red Cross Emergency Shelter with Muffie as the contact. We discussed options or ideas about the homeless near us, but nothing definite was determined. We set up the next month's Focus on Mission slot for the service. Next meeting, March 9, 10:00am. Ended in Prayer. Worship Committee: $^{\sim}$ Met Thursday 2/9/2023 at 7pm. Lois, Jim Durst, Patti Gallagher and Roger Smith, and Lois Hildenbrand attended. Roger opened in prayer.

We reviewed plans for services up to Easter Sunday. No changes in Ash Wednesday arrangements from those reported in last month's Session meeting. For Palm Sunday (April 2), Lois requested two choir pieces, one at the normal anthem time and another later in the service. Roger agreed to order 10 leafy and 50 spear palms from Safeway Flower dept. For Maundy Thursday, it is planned to have a Seder meal in the Fellowship Hall at 7pm. If Doug Buteyn is not available to lead this, Lois will organize. For Good Friday, the "Stations of the Cross" video to be continuously shown in the Sanctuary 11-2pm and 5-8pm. Volunteers are needed to monitor the entrance door during these times.

For Easter Sunday, breakfast will be served at 8am by the men of the church feeding congregants and local people. Worship starts at 10.30am with the Sanctuary in the dark. The dark curtains will be brought down suddenly bringing light to the worshipers with the shout "He is Alive" followed by a joyous hymn or anthem on the same theme. The choir will sing an anthem at the normal point in the service.

A short discussion reviewed the difficulties of renting out our sanctuary for weddings when we do not have a wedding coordinator. A joint meeting with the Stewards and Worship committee members will make recommendations for any changes needed for future wedding rentals.

The committee reviewed our current practice avoiding the "passing of the peace" in our services. We submit the following motion to the Session: UCPC will immediately reinstate regular passing of the peace in our services, recommending that it be done by gestures rather than by touch.

Patti ended the meeting in prayer at 8.20pm.
