#### A Note from the Pastor

"Worry is like a rocking chair. It gives you something to do, but it doesn't get you anywhere."

These words have been rattling around in my head since Sunday, October 15th when I attended worship at Amazing Grace Lutheran Church (ELCA) in Anchorage. Pastor Sandy preached part of her sermon from a seated position in a rocking chair. Her words, combined with the visual image, were striking.

The range of things we worry about is broad, from the simple and superficial (but no less overwhelming!) to the deep, profound, and survival-provoked. We worry about how we'll afford groceries; what we'll wear for the first day of a new job or on a first date; what people will think of us because our garden isn't free of weeds or the sidewalk isn't free of snow; what grade we'll get on an assignment or test; whether we'll be safe to go to school or a certain location; whether so-and-so made it home okay after they left our dinner party; whether our rights will be stripped from us; whether our church can afford a pastor or how membership has dwindled; whether we're worthy of love; how to have a hard conversation with a loved one; and the list goes on. God has given me a theme over the past month. At Youth Group on October 8th we explored with the 6 teens from 4 churches about justice for the Earth and what God's relationship with the Earth looks like. During this discussion, Pastor Ollie of Fairbanks Lutheran highlighted Jesus' words from Matthew 6:25-34 wherein Jesus invites his listeners to consider the lilies of the field and how they live worry-free, fully provided for by God. Pastor Ollie asked us to learn from the lilies and to not worry so much about tomorrow. Likewise, at Presbytery, Pastor Leisa, the Interim Executive Presbyter, encouraged the newly elected and installed Executive Presbyter, Pastor Elizabeth Schultz to FROG: "Fully Rely On God." As she gifted EP Elizabeth with a porcelain frog, Pastor Leisa reminded us all that sometimes life and ministry is just too hard for one person to do alone, or even one church to do on its own. In those times we need to look to the frogs and remember to Fully Rely On God so that God can do the work that needs to be done once we get out of the way.

Session has been discussing the growth and health of UCPC; understandably, Session worries about membership size and desires to welcome new and younger members to the congregation. While this

discussion is good, I have invited the Session to read a book with me called *The Invitational Christian*, which explores what it means to be an inviting church that can welcome and support new people in our midst. This book encourages its readers to focus less on the number of people in a church and focus instead on all the ways the church is flourishing. And UCPC is flourishing! I first walked through the doors of UCPC on Sunday October 16, 2022 (over a year ago!) to supply preach while then Commissioned Pastor Lois was out with COVID. My first thoughts upon entering your parking lot and building were NOT "yikes, this church is in trouble or is dying." NO! It was the exact opposite. My breath was taken away at the amount of energy buzzing in the space and in the air. It felt as though I was literally breathing in the Holy Spirit's energy just by being in your presence. As a church, you felt so alive and full of vitality that I came away from that service feeling renewed and refreshed in my faith in a way I hadn't in several years. I was eager for an invite back.

I have since learned that that first impression was not a one-off unique experience. I have experienced this over and over, every time I am with you, like at our incredible Faith and Fellowship Potluck this past month.

We don't need to worry about UCPC. We need to tell people that there is a faith community known as University Community Presbyterian Church that is alive, loving, and full of energy! As Session explores the ideas *The Invitational Christian* has, I invite you ponder how UCPC continues to energize you. That energy, not worry, is what God is focused on and can use.

# Minutes Stated Meeting of Session University Community Presbyterian Church October 26, 2023, Student Lounge

**Present**: Moderator Rev. Erika Bergh; elders Roger Smith, Matthew Bierer, Joe Krizek, Jerry McBeath, Pat Babcock, Paula Long and via Zoom: Doreen McNeill (Clerk).

Guest: Deacon Sarah Lanstra

Moderator Rev. Erika Bergh opened the meeting at 6:33PM.

**Scripture and Devotion:** Paula presented a devotion on Psalm 24.

**Prayer:** Rev. Bergh led an opening prayer.

**Quorum:** The clerk declared a quorum.

**Consent Calendar:** The consent calendar consists of

It was moved and seconded to approve the consent calendar. Motion was approved by unanimous consent.

#### Orders of the Day (7:00PM)

<u>Deacons' report</u> Sarah Lanstra gave the deacons' report, including potlucks. Deacons were thanked for their tireless work.

Comments from the Congregation No in-person comments were received.

<u>Clerk's Report</u> Correspondence received from: Alice Nielsen-Shane and from Jane Steeves. Alice thanked the congregation for their generosity. Jane requested to be removed from the rolls.

At their request, the clerk wrote a letter of transfer for Ruth and Carl Benson, transferring their membership to Fairbanks Lutheran Church (ELCA).

Family leave of 12 weeks, as required by latest Book of Order, are added to the 2024 minimum terms of call for called-and-installed pastors in the Presbytery of Yukon. This means churches must allow 12 weeks of family leave for called-and-installed pastors. Family Leave is defined as leave to accommodate the birth, foster placement, or adoption of a child; leave to provide care to an ill or disabled family member; and leave to heal following a loss or tragic event. See attached document for sample language. Presbytery of Yukon is also working on minimum terms of call for supply pastors. It is likely to be similar to the terms of call for installed pastors. Both of these documents will be updated by February, 2024.

#### **New Business:**

PC(USA) calendars were distributed to session members who requested them. Calendars for deacons who requested them were given to Sarah Lanstra to distribute.

It was moved and seconded to remove elder Jane Steeves from the rolls, per her request. Motion

was approved by unanimous consent. Doreen will write a letter to Jane confirming this action.

Rev. Bergh appointed Doreen McNeill as temporary moderator and stepped out of the room. Pastor Bergh returned and resumed her role as moderator.

It was moved and seconded to forward the part-time pastor terms of call for 2024 to the congregation for the November 5 Congregational Meeting. Motion was approved by unanimous consent. There was agreement that it is unlikely that the church can afford a full-time interim pastor at this time, especially in conjunction with the associated cost of moving that person from the lower 48.

It was agreed to *investigate* having a facilitator/consultant work with the session and congregation to accomplish the goals normally accomplished by an interim pastor. The interim pastor search subcommittee will investigate, and report back to the session. The finance committee will consider potential costs. This work will help UCPC look into the future and envision a plan of action for living out God's will for our congregation. It is not only helpful, but a requirement by the Presbytery of Yukon that congregations that are in transition (such as UCPC) take a good look at where they are, where God is calling them, and a plan to get there.

Personnel committee members Roger Smith and Muffie Durst conducted the 6-month performance review for the Administrative Assistant, Melissa Bierer. Motion from committee: Melissa Bierer receive a \$1/hour pay increase. Motion approved by unanimous consent (Matthew Bierer recused himself from the performance review, session discussion and voting.)

It was agreed that UCPC's Elder Commissioner to Presbytery, Paula Long, will give a report to the congregation about the October Presbytery meeting on a Sunday of Paula and Pastor Erika's choosing.

#### **Old Business**

*The Invitational Christian*. Pastor Erika handed out these books. Session members were asked to read the book by November 16, for discussion at the November session meeting.


#### **November's Procession of the Church Year Colors**

Sunday, November 26th is the "New Year's Eve" of the church year since a new church year begins with Advent, the following Sunday. To celebrate the completion of another year in our life of faith we'll be doing a "Procession of the Church Year Colors" during worship on November 26th.

For this procession, we are creating banners/flags/streamers/pennants to wave and process in worship. We will assemble the flags at the potluck event on November 19th. However, we still need some donations of fabric and ribbons by November 12th so we have time to prep them for assembly. There is a designated bin in the Narthex for donations.

Thank you to everyone who has already donated some wonderful fabrics! We still need LOTS of GREEN fabrics and ribbons to help us remember the seasons of the church year following Pentecost and Epiphany [Ordinary Time] (otherwise known as the growing seasons of the church year, which follow Jesus' life and ministry in general). Plain fabrics are ideal (but they can have simple, delicate, or faint patterns). Shiny, silky, or textured plain fabrics are great! We need one yard of fabric per flag, or about one- to two-foot long strips of ribbon. Other materials we still need:

- o 2 large paint buckets (These will not be returned.)
- o **PVC pipes** that can be cut into short tubes (to fit inside the paint buckets)


