A Note from the Pastor

You all are rubbing off on me. :) In a good way. As most of you know (but for the random person that might read this on the website), I am an ELCA Lutheran pastor serving in a PCUSA congregation. As such, I've been learning a lot about the nuances of Presby theology as opposed to Lutheran, as well as ecclesial and polity differences between the two.

On August 20th, the Presbyterian Outlook published an Opinion (aka "Voices") piece titled "'No Kings' should include Jesus." Right off the bat, my response to the headline was "uh oh. I don't think I'm going to agree with this." But I read it anyway. And I was surprised by what surprised me! What stood out to me most was that the PC(USA)'s emphasis on <u>Jesus Christ as the head of the church</u> wasn't mentioned or addressed in this article, and I believe it should have been. I was surprised by this noticing though, because prior to working with you all, I never would have thought about this.

This consistent emphasis about Christ as the head of the church is definitely a big difference between the ELCA and PCUSA. Sure, the ELCA believes this as well, and it's included in our constitution, but we don't name it as much as you all do. And I actually think that this is a strength of the PCUSA which the ELCA is lacking. In the ELCA, we think of the head of our church as the Presiding Bishop, but you all have moderators and a clerk – which at first was really disarming to me: "Who's in charge?? Who's the main point person? Sure, it's Jesus, I get that, but like... who's the human who's running the show for Christ?"

Now, I kinda love it. The strength of not having one central and prominent human being as a leader, is that it forces us to keep central in our minds that it's Christ who's at the center and at the head. I suppose some might argue that "the head" and "the king" are different concepts, but to me, they are the same. I am someone who likes "Reign of Christ" Sunday more than "Christ the King," yet I still talk about Christ as a king because he *is* our King – just a completely different model than the one the Roman Emperor or modern political leaders might offer.

As such, I think it's essential to not just chuck out a model of kingship that shows how community-oriented and focused God is, simply because we have poor human models of kingship in our midst. If anything, we need to cling to the divine model of kingship so that those in power can see and be reminded of a better way to lead. Because I agree with this opinion article! Jesus was so deeply focused on righting relationships, offering justice, and healing communities from within, and that's the powerful message of the Gospel and the kingship of Christ. He didn't come with military might and political prestige like people anticipated; instead, he came from humble beginnings and from within a regular and imperfect family and


community. And if he can lead and change the world from a place of humbleness and people-first focus, then that's a model we should look to and follow!

By continuing to refer to Christ as our King, we still offer a subversive kingship model of leadership for those progressives in our midst who are worried about leaders who try to demand loyalty or who lead from a place of greed and self-righteousness. The subversive nature of claiming Christ as our King helps us ALL to see when anyone in power has missed the mark of Christ-like, holy, and good leadership. Like a mirror held in front of our faces, Christ as King guides us and asks us to keep central the command to love and serve all as mini-Christs in our midst; and when we fail, Christ is there to redirect us because as Ethiopian Lutheran Gudina Tumsa would say, Jesus is not only the King of Kings but also President of Presidents and Prime Minister of Prime Ministers.

Deacons' report. Judy Fowler-Morris presented the deacons' report. There are a number of needs in our congregation. Deacons were thanked for their tireless good work.

Comments from the Congregation – Doreen received a note from a woman who was looking for information about her mother's funeral, conducted at UCPC in 1984. Doreen continues to chase down leads. Session members gave good ideas on who to ask.

Clerk's Report. Doreen highlighted the written clerk's report. Doreen and Matthew traded Elder of the Month schedules, with Matthew now scheduled for October and Doreen scheduled for November.

New Business:

The session **AGREED** by consensus to **charge** ½ **price for the facility and full price for sound support for the Mary Ehrlander funeral.** Her brother, Randy Franke is a former member. Total price will be \$500.

Motion from Mission Committee: That UCPC's 25% of the Peace and Global Witness offering go to the Literacy Council of Alaska, English Language Learner Program. Motion was APPROVED by a vote of 6 to 0. The Peace and Global Witness offering will be received on World Communion Sunday, October 5.

It was moved and seconded to allow **Randy and Stephanie to hold their wedding on September 6 in the UCPC Prayer Garden or in the Sanctuary.** Motion was **APPROVED** by a vote of 6 to 0.

It was moved and seconded to request that the Ministry Commission recommission Lois Hildenbrand as a Commissioned Lay Pastor during the part of the year that she resides within the bounds of the

Presbytery of Yukon. Motion was **APPROVED** by a vote of 6 to 0.

It was moved and seconded to direct the Mission Committee to come to the session with a way forward to distribute the personal needs items that UCPC has to give to people who used to be referred by Helping Alaska (Formerly Love In The Name of Christ), which has shut its doors. The session AGREED to this by consensus.

Old Business

Erika, Doreen, and Marji will get together to brainstorm ideas to plan the PC(USA) co-moderators trip to Fairbanks on October 8. Input from the congregation is welcome!

It was moved and seconded to **approve a 10% raise for the Administrative Assistant.** Motion was **AP-PROVED** by a vote of 5 to 0, with member Bierer leaving the room during the discussion and vote. Pay will increase to \$19 per hour.

It was moved and seconded to **approve a 10% raise for the Organist/Pianist.** Motion was **APPROVED** by a vote of 6 to 0. Pay will increase to \$110 per Sunday.

Pastor and People, Making Mutual Ministry Work. Roger, Paula, Pat and Doreen have the book and should finish as soon as possible so that Jim, Matthew, and Marji can read it. Pat was applauded for having finished the book.

Marji reported that work is progressing on the bulletin board updates. **Pictures are needed from the congregation that show what we do to further God's kingdom in the world.**



Session is planning on attending an Immigration information zoom training from Alaska's ACLU on September 18th from 5:30 to 7PM prior to our Session meeting (the time of which has been changed to 7pm). We are planning on attending out of care for members of Grace Church, knowing that ICE *is* present in Fairbanks and has detained at least one person from our town. We are simply seeking to know more and gain information, not to make a politically partisan statement. Here is the description of the event from the ACLU:

Join the ACLU of Alaska and congregations across Alaska for a "Know Your Responsibilities" training on interacting with immigration enforcement. We're prepared to share what places of worship can do to protect Alaskans who are targeted by immigration enforcement. This training will teach you what to do if ICE comes to your door; how to advocate and protect individuals who are at your place of worship, and potential risks of harboring; and the power individuals have to push back against unlawful enforcement actions. This virtual event is open to all, but pre-registration is required.
