We stand behind our puppies with a one-year genetic health guarantee. All puppies sold by Given Doodles are in the best possible health to the best of our ability and knowledge. While our puppies are in our care, we have provided love, nurturing, early behavior and potty training. We feed them well and give them the necessary care to grow into strong and healthy pets for years to come. When our puppies leave our home to go to their forever homes, they will have been wormed several times, had their first set of shots, and will have been carefully checked by a licensed vet and received a clean bill of health.

Buyers are required to have the puppy examined by a licensed veterinarian within 72 hours of taking possession. Request to return or refund must be made within the 72 hour time period. Given Doodles will only accept request for a refund/return of puppy, if the puppy is diagnosed by a licensed veterinarian as sick upon arrival or to be in poor health or have a health issue to be life-threatening and a genetically debilitating health issue. Given Doodles has a right to a 2<sup>nd</sup> opinion from a licensed veterinarian at their expense. Given Doodles is not responsible for veterinarian expenses incurred by Buyer. We require a written documentation from your Veterinarian to qualify for full (1) refund the full purchase price or (2) Replacement of the puppy with another similar puppy from the next litter.

Additionally, if within the first 12 months of purchase date, your puppy develops an inherited, life threatening genetic disorder, we will happily replace the puppy with another puppy of your choice from the next available litter with no additional charge, as long as the puppy has been returned to Given Doodles with Vet documentation of the disorder. We do not cover any out-of-pocket medical expenses that may have been incurred. Buyer agrees not to abandon the Dog to an animal shelter, Humane Society, or Dog pound. In addition, buyer <a href="#">CAN NOT</a> transfer, sell or give puppy to another family without contacting Given Doodles and without being spayed or neutered.

This health guarantee does not cover, and not limited to internal or external parasites, hernia, undescended testicles, under or overbite, injuries, allergies, heat exhaustion, or hypoglycemia. Kennel cough and other communicable diseases are not covered after your veterinarian's initial examination.

Buyer acknowledges that there is no promise (express or implied) that the dog will be non-shedding or non-allergenic. Additional Given Doodles makes no promise or warranty regarding size, color, coat appearance, or any physical/behavioral trait.

**This dog is sold as a pet only** and is not to be used for breeding purposes. Buyer shall spay/neuter the Dog prior to the Dog turning 10 months of age. Buyer shall provide official spay/neuter certificate to Given Doodles by 10 months of age, Health Guarantee and Warranty offered becomes immediately void if no communication is received.

## CARING FOR YOUR NEW PUPPY Buyer Responsibility

Our puppies are generally very easy to care for. Here are a few pointers that we think are important reminders of how to care for your new puppy, and are **prerequisite for the health guarantee to be valid**.

- Puppy must be examined by a licensed Veterinarian within 72 hours of possession.
- Keep your puppy up to date on shots, worming and other preventative treatments advised by your Vet.
- Find a vet that you feel comfortable with, and keep regular appointments so your vet gets to know your puppy.
- Find a groomer you feel comfortable with. Maintaining the coat of a Goldendoodle is very important. Plan on taking your puppy to a groomer for the first time by 4 months and 6 months of age to get them use to being handled.
- Maintain your puppy's nails with regular trimming. Your puppy has their Dew Claws intact! Be sure to point this out to your groomer and have them regularly trimmed.
- Feed your puppy a good, well-rounded diet. NOT GRAIN FREE!
- Avoid exposing your puppy to physically stressful situations, such as frequent stair climbing or standing on concrete for long periods of time during his formative years.
- Make sure your puppy has plenty of exercise on a regular basis, and whenever possible. Don't overdo it in the first few months. Puppies need lots of rest too.
- New puppies like to chew! Provide plenty of healthy and safe options for your new puppy.
- Remember gum and all candy containing Xylitol, chocolate, garlic, avocado, apple seeds, apricot pits, and cherry pits are just a few things to be aware of. Please double check with your vet before feeding anything other than puppy food to your puppy.
