# **Class Description:**

In this 12-week class, your child will become a "little explorer" as we visit different countries and learn about their land, culture, animals, and landmarks. Each week, children will add a special stamp to their personal "passport" to mark the countries they've visited. Activities include interactive stories, crafts, games, and sensory experiences designed to make geography exciting and easy to understand for young learners. No homework—just fun, engaging learning!

### Week 1:

#### Welcome to Our World

This week, children will get their very own "passport" and learn about maps, globes, and continents. We'll explore where we live and mark it in their passport. Fun activities include coloring and map games to start our journey around the world!

### Week 2:

Africa: Safari Adventure

Your little explorer will meet the animals of Africa, like lions, elephants, and giraffes! They'll make animal masks and learn fun facts about the African continent. Their passport will receive a special safari stamp.

### Week 3:

Australia: Down Under Fun

We'll hop over to Australia to learn about kangaroos, koalas, and the Great Barrier Reef. Children will enjoy sensory play with sand and "reef" materials and make fun crafts. They'll earn a kangaroo passport stamp.

### Week 4:

Asia: A Journey to the East

This week focuses on Asia, exploring countries like China and Japan. Kids will learn about pandas, bamboo, and cherry blossoms. Craft activities include paper fans and simple origami. Their passport gets a panda stamp.

#### Week 5:

Europe: Castles and Countryside

Children will visit Europe, discovering castles, the Eiffel Tower, and Italian culture.

Activities include building a simple castle craft and learning about different European landmarks. They'll receive a castle stamp in their passport.

### Week 6:

South America: Rainforest & Rio

Your child will travel to South America to explore the Amazon rainforest and meet animals like toucans and jaguars. They'll create colorful paper parrots and get a toucan stamp in their passport.

### Week 7:

Antarctica: Cold Adventures

It's a chilly adventure to Antarctica! Kids will learn about penguins, seals, and icy habitats. Sensory play with ice or "snow" crafts will make learning fun. A penguin stamp will be added to their passport.

#### Week 8:

North America: Land of Diversity

This week, we explore North America, including the USA and Canada. Children will learn about forests, mountains, and wildlife. Activities include making simple flags or wildlife collages. Their passport gets a bear stamp.

### Week 9:

## Middle East: Desert & Oasis

Kids will discover deserts, camels, and traditional clothing from the Middle East. They'll create sand art jars and learn about life in dry climates. Their passport will receive a camel stamp.

### Week 10:

Oceania & Islands: Tropical Fun

This week takes us to tropical islands like Fiji and Hawaii. Children will explore beaches, volcanoes, and island animals through sensory play with sand and water. A palm tree stamp will be added to their passport.

Children will celebrate cultures from around the world with music, food, and clothing.

Activities may include a dress-up day or a mini "international festival." Their passport will receive a globe stamp for this special celebration.

They'll play games, do quick crafts from their favorite weeks, and enjoy interactive activities that celebrate everything they've learned. Kids will leave with a sense of accomplishment and excitement about being little explorers!
