What level is this class: Level 2

Prerequisites: *Important*

This class will explore the mummification process and mention some mummies that were believed to have been sacrificed as part of ancient rituals. Also we will be looking at pictures of different types of mummies. Please make sure that is ok for your student and with you before signing up for this class.

- Interest in Science & History: No prior knowledge required, but a curiosity about ancient cultures, archaeology, or forensic science is helpful.
 - Comfort with Hands-On Activities: Students will participate in preservation experiments, including handling materials like salt and baking soda.
- Basic Reading & Research Skills: Some light reading, note-taking, and participation in discussions will be expected.
- Maturity for Chicken Mummification Project: The project involves handling a raw (store-bought) chicken over several weeks. Students must be mature enough to follow sanitation guidelines, handle materials responsibly, and observe the preservation process without discomfort.
 - Listening & Following Directions: Students must be able to follow multi-step instructions carefully, especially during hands-on activities and preservation experiments.

Graduation Requirements: Participation in class activities, projects and discussions.



Homework Requirements: There may be some homework and any projects that may need to be finished at home.

Class Description:

Step into the world of ancient mysteries and scientific discovery as we explore mummies from around the world! This 12-week interactive class takes students beyond Egypt to uncover how different cultures preserved their dead—from the ice mummies of the Andes to the bog bodies of Europe and mummies of Pompeii.

Students will engage in hands-on experiments, including a real chicken mummification project, fruit preservation activities, and a few hands-on mummy preservation simulations. Along the way, they'll examine different types of mummies, study famous discoveries like Ötzi the Iceman, Tollund Man and King Tut.

Through a mix of science, history, and hands-on exploration, students will gain a deeper understanding of how and why mummification was practiced across cultures—and what these preserved remains can teach us today.
