Prerequisites: To maximize success in this class, students should be able to read and get words on paper. Students should have phonemic awareness to help them write words that resemble the way they sound, even if they're not spelled correctly.

Class Description:

This class will focus on the building blocks of writing: sentences! Students will expand their sentence-writing repertoire through discussion, small group activities, and of course, writing! Students will grow in confidence as they create sentences with more variety, clarity and complexity. As we identify, complete, and imitate sentences, students will practice using basic grammar conventions and become familiar with grammar topics such as subject & predicate, appositives, modifiers, and conjunctions. We will use age-appropriate sentence models from a variety of children's literature. Later, students will apply what they have learned about sentences to create outlines and build paragraphs.
