Homework Requirements: Students will complete a 1-page weekly journal response and a final research project (2–3 page paper or presentation).

Class Description:

Class can be taken for a high school credit. Meeting content standards and will feature assessments.

Students will explore the foundations of America from the first colonies through the Constitution by examining history through a moral and practical lens. Using a combination of engaging video resources, guided note sheets, and focused readings, students will learn how everyday choices and national decisions were shaped by both ideals and survival needs.

Each week, students will:

- Watch a video segment in class and complete guided notes.
- Respond to a weekly journal prompt (1 page) comparing moral vs.
 practical motivations.
 - Participate in class discussion to build critical thinking skills.

At the end of the course, students will complete a final project based on a particular colony and its history.
