Class Description:

Welcome to HCU's Flight School in partnership with S & S Aviation, located at the Fairfield County Airport in Winnsboro. (Located 30 minutes north of Columbia) This is a huge step up from our previous military aviation course.

Not only will these kids be getting on the ground flight school training, it's hands-on training, they're opening up the engines, sitting them on the planes, going over all of the tools and instruments used to fly the plane...

Students will have the opportunity to book one hour flights at a cost of \$205 per flight. This fee you will pay directly to the airport.

Additionally, you do not have to pay for flying time! To save cost, you can simply take the flight school training.

You have an opportunity to get the PDF curriculum for free. Or you can purchase the physical copies.

This is the same curriculum that they use to get your actual private Pilot license.

So for those of you, that would like to one day, get your pilot license by the age of 17, we have the path for you!

Additional Details...

- Students 15 and under can only fly with an instructor.
 - Students ages 16 and 17 are allowed to solo fly.
- Students 17 and up are able to get their piloting license.
- Students that wish to take flights, your hours will be logged and recorded. There is no expiration date on your hours.



Those looking to receive their **Private Pilot.** Here are the requirements...

- 20 Hours with a flight instructor
- 10 Hours solo
- 10 Hours solo or with a flight instructor
- Pass a "Basic Med" Flight Physical
- Successfully complete the Private Pilot Written Exam
- Successfully complete the Private Pilot Practical Test (Oral and Flight Test with an FAA Designated Examiner)

Those looking to receive their Commercial Pilot. Here are the requirements...

- 250 Hours of total flight time
- 100 Hours as Pilot In Command
- 50 Hours of cross country flight time
- 10 Hours of simulated or actual instrument time
- 10 Hours in a complex airplane (an airplane equipped with retractable landing gear, flaps, and a controllable pitch prop)
- Successfully complete the Commercial Pilot Written Exam
- Successfully complete the Commercial Pilot Practical Test

Weekly scope:

Flight instructors are unable to give a weekly play-by-play of what will be taught. They will be working the curriculum and going at the pace of the students.
