Class Description:

This class will explore the foundations of freedom, rights, and responsibilities in a democratic society. Students will examine historical and modern perspectives on freedom of speech, government structure, and citizenship while connecting these ideas to current events. Through debates, simulations, and class discussions, students will practice critical thinking and apply concepts to real-world scenarios.

Assessments & Assignments:

- Weekly Current Event Writing Piece Students will research and summarize a current event related to freedom, rights, or government.
- Quizzes Every 2–3 weeks to review concepts, class activities, and discussions.
- Midterm Exam Covers the first half of the course, emphasizing understanding of rights, government systems, and responsibilities.
- Final Project A PowerPoint presentation where students present on a chosen freedom-related topic, connecting history, law, and modern issues.

Credit:

This course may be counted as a high school social studies elective credit (0.5 credit for a semester).
