

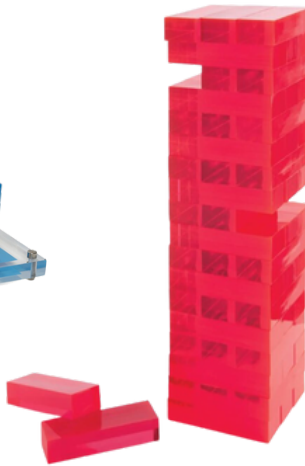
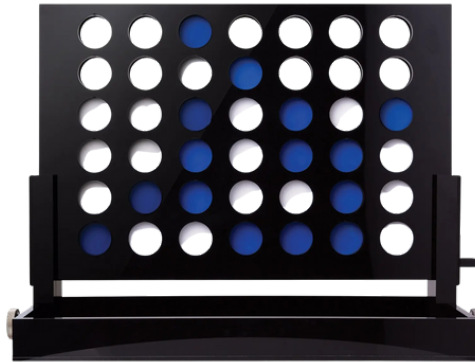

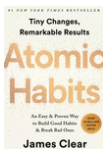
## THIS MONTH: Trunk/glove compartment
