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

IABC's mission is to provide inclusive and accessible platforms that empower Muslim artists, engage diverse audiences, and foster dialogue through creativity and shared experiences.

Core Programming

At the heart of IABC's work is its signature annual event, the

elder Mary Point IAE 2
Islamic Art Experience (IAE). This initiative showcases the arts, crafts, and heritage of the Islamic world while welcoming artists of all backgrounds inspired by its traditions. The Islamic Art
Experience offers a dynamic platform for individuals of all ages to explore various art forms, including calligraphy, visual arts, performance, and digital media. In addition to exhibitions and community events, IABC takes a multidimensional approach to art, offering Islamic art and calligraphy classes, creative workshops, public art initiatives, and art-for-social-justice projects.

These programs provide opportunities for learning, dialogue, and self-expression, encouraging participants to engage with art as a means of connection and transformation.

Community Engagement

Under the umbrella of IABC, founder Nikhat Izhar Qureshi leads several initiatives that blend art, healing, and community building. Through the BC Muslim Art House, a collective of Muslim artists across British Columbia, the initiative highlights Muslim presence in the arts and promotes intercultural collaboration. Another key program, The Artful Peace Practice (TAPP), provides a creative and therapeutic platform that encourages participants to "speak through colors" — using art as a tool for mindfulness, emotional well-being, and conflict transformation. Together, these initiatives embody IABC's vision of art as a bridge for understanding, resilience, and peacebuilding.



1st Juried Exhibition of Islamic Art

In 2022, the Islamic Art of British Columbia (IABC) proudly hosted Richmond's very first juried exhibition of Islamic Art, displayed on community art walls at the Richmond Public Library from November 1 to December 31. This landmark exhibition showcased 14 outstanding works created by both Muslim artists and artists inspired by Islamic art traditions, representing the diverse talent of Metro Vancouver and Toronto. By highlighting the beauty, symbolism, and cultural richness of Islamic art in a public setting, the exhibition provided an inclusive space for dialogue, learning, and appreciation. It not only gave emerging and established artists a professional platform to share their work, but also engaged the broader community in exploring the ways Islamic art contributes to Canada's multicultural fabric. The success of this inaugural exhibition demonstrated the growing interest in cultural arts programming and underscored the importance of creating opportunities where creativity and diversity can be celebrated together.


3RD ANNUAL ISLAMIC ART EXPERIENCE

Ramadan and Eid Community Arts Programming

Each year during the holy month of Ramadan, IABC collaborates with the Welcome Ramadan and Celebrate Eid Committee to organize a series of public programs at the Richmond Public Library, inviting the wider community to experience the spirit of fasting and the joy of Eid-ul-Fitr, a celebration observed by Muslims worldwide. These initiatives include, but are not limited to, a month-long window display, film screenings, art exhibitions, and a community celebration festival. Through these efforts, IABC aims to foster inclusivity, cultural appreciation, and dialogue across diverse communities..

Fasting for Faith - Ramadan in art exhibition

The art exhibition, held from March 10 to April 30, 2024, at the community art wall space inside the Richmond Public Library, explores the significance of Ramadan as expressed by local artists of all ages who shared their profound journeys of fasting and faith through art. Each artwork reflected personal experience from the joys of breaking fast to the discipline and self-reflection that define the holy month. The exhibition highlighted fasting as a transformative journey of self-discovery, heightened spirituality, and communal solidarity. Visitors were invited to contemplate the spirit of Ramadan in art, celebrating diversity, unity, and the rich experiences that shape this sacred month within our local Muslim community.

As part of its annual programming, the Islamic Art of British Columbia (IABC) presents the Ramadan Window Display at the Richmond Public Library, exhibited throughout the thirty days of Ramadan. This initiative serves as an educational and cultural engagement opportunity, inviting the broader community to learn about the spiritual and social significance of the month of fasting in Islam. Ramadan is a time devoted to self-reflection, compassion, and community service, culminating in the celebration of Eid al-Fitr, a festival that symbolizes gratitude, renewal, and unity. Through this initiative, IABC fosters intercultural understanding and promotes dialogue by sharing the artistic and spiritual traditions of the Muslim community in an accessible public space.







Film Screenings

Islamic Art of British Columbia (IABC) is dedicated to bringing a variety of creative expressions of Islamic art to communities, including film screenings and digital media presentations that highlight Islamic art and the contributions of Muslims in filmmaking. Through these initiatives, IABC aims to share the untold stories of the Muslim world and the beauty of Islamic art, fostering understanding and dialogue across cultures. As part of its regular programming, IABC hosts curated film screenings featuring films by the Unity Productions Foundation (UPF). This non-profit organization promotes peace, understanding, and pluralism through media. To date, IABC has presented several acclaimed UPF films, including Islamic Art: Mirror of the Invisible World, Lamya's Poem, and Inside Islam: What a Billion Muslims Really Think. In addition, IABC hosted a special screening of American Ramadan, a documentary by Envoy Films, followed by a panel discussion with the director and cast members, in collaboration with the City of Richmond Cultural Centre and the Richmond Public Library. Through these ongoing efforts, IABC continues to use the power of art and film to connect communities and celebrate the diversity of Muslim experiences

It provides both emerging and established artists with a professional platform to showcase their creativity while engaging the broader community through art and dialogue.

The event invites the public to meet the artists and connect through the universal language of art.

Future Events – Islamic Art of British Columbia

The Islamic Art of British Columbia (IABC) continues its mission to celebrate creativity, faith, and cultural expression through a series of community-based art events and programs. Our initiatives unite artists, families, and the public to experience the beauty, diversity, and richness of Islamic art traditions in contemporary forms. In 2025, IABC partnered with the Academy of Modern Art (AOMA) in Vancouver for the Global Muslim Youth Canada Youth Visual Art Contest, fostering young talent and promoting artistic engagement within the community.

Workshops with Master Artists

In the coming year, the Islamic Art of BC will host a series of master workshops featuring Canadian and international artists. Among them is Omar Uddin, a Toronto-based master calligrapher and Founder of My Qalam Academy. Renowned for his contemporary approach to classical Arabic calligraphy, Omar has taught over 6,000 students from 102 countries and designed calligraphic works for landmark mosques across North America. These workshops will offer participants a rare opportunity to learn from master artists, blending tradition, spirituality, and creativity.

Islamic Art Experience Event

The Islamic Art of BC celebrates the International Day of Islamic Art each year on November 18, as proclaimed by UNESCO in 2019. Similar to the 4 annual signature events, this multisensory experience will continue to bring together local and international artists, musicians, and performers in a day of interactive creativity. Families and visitors will enjoy live performances, hands-on art activities, and cultural displays, including films, storytelling, traditional dances, folk music and instruments, art of weaving, calligraphy, geometric design, henna, and tatreez embroidery, fostering appreciation for Islamic heritage and its contributions to world art while creating a vibrant space for learning and community connection.

Annual Art Exhibition

Held each fall, IABC will continue this exhibition as part of the Islamic Art Experience event. Showcasing original works by Muslim artists from across Metro Vancouver and beyond. Featuring a range of mediums such as calligraphy, painting, textiles, and mixed media, the exhibition offers both emerging and established artists a professional platform to share their work and engage with the broader community.

Film Screening – Islam's Greatest Stories of Love

IABC will host a screening of "Islam's Greatest Stories of Love," a new documentary by Unity Productions Foundation. The film follows Gayotto Hohl, a young woman navigating grief after the loss of her father. Her journey takes her across the world as she meets members of the Muslim community who share their perspectives on love, loss, and healing. This thought-provoking documentary offers a heartfelt exploration of how faith and culture shape our understanding of love and resilience.

Ramadan Programming

Each year during Ramadan, IABC will continue to partner with the Richmond Public Library to present a Ramadan Window Display and other educational activities that invite the public to learn about the spiritual, cultural, and communal traditions of the holy month and celebrate Eid al-Fitr.
