About Franklin County Children Services

Franklin County Children Services sees children every day whose lives are in jeopardy. The agency is mandated by law to provide protection, care and permanency for children who are abused, neglected or dependent.

Children Services believes in the importance of family and strives to keep the entire family involved in solving the problems that brought them to the agency. This is done through a wide variety of resources and services, including:

- Investigation of abuse and neglect reports that come in to the 24-Hour Child Abuse Hotline: 614-229-7000.
- Social workers and other professionals to help children and families.
- Partnerships and Community Involvement with local agencies and organizations to provide services and support.

Helping Children and Families

Children Services gets involved to assure the safety of children or to help a family during a crisis. The goal is to keep children safe and strengthen families.

≱ Family Care

If a child can be safely maintained at home, FCCS works with the family on a plan to solve the problems that led them to the agency.

≱ Kinship

Children may be able to have other family members or family friends help care for them in particular times of need.

🛿 Foster Care

Sometimes children need to be temporarily removed from their home and placed in foster care. Foster care services are provided by community partner agencies.

Adoption

If family problems cannot be resolved, FCCS will seek permanent custody of the children and place them for adoption.

Volunteers and Mentors

Often volunteers and mentors assist families and children with additional guidance and support.



Connecting to the Community

Franklin County Children Services protects and cares for children and their families through many community partnerships. Some programs are specific to families while others involve the entire community and partners.

- Family to Family a partnership with local settlement houses to help families in their communities
- Community Partners contracts with more than 100 organizations to help children and families
- **Special Events** includes community awareness activities, displays and speaking engagements

Making Decisions With Families
