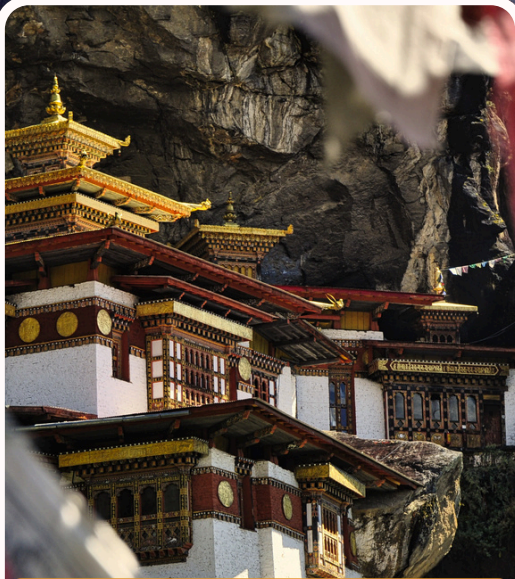


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Jammu, J&K, India

5N/6D *Itinerary from India*

DAY 1

Arrival in Bagdogra and entry in Bhutan via Phuentsholing

After landing at Bagdogra airport, take a bus till Jaigaon from Siliguri junction. Once you reach Jaigaon, cross the border via immigration to enter Phuentsholing, Bhutan. Either stay there or take a bus further to reach Paro. Stay overnight in Paro.

DAY 2

Explore Paro

Rest well. Visit Paro International airport, wear Bhutan's traditional dress and go to a zhong, go for a hot stone bath, and attend the cultural dance. Stay overnight in Paro.

DAY 3

Tiger's Nest Trek

Start early for the Tiger's nest trek and after lunch, leave for Punakha. Stay overnight in Punakha.

DAY 4

Explore Punakha and Phobjika

Go to Punakha Dzong, suspension bridge and after lunch, leave for Phobjika valley. Go to gangter viewpoint, Black necked crane center and explore the valley. Stay overnight in Phobjika.

5N/6D *Itinerary from India*

DAY 5

Explore Thimphu

Leave for Thimphu early morning. Go to Dochula pass, Buddha Dordenma and Takin preserve. In the evening, go to Thimphu market for shopping, try Ema Datshi and experience karaoke bar. Stay overnight in Thimphu.

DAY 6

Leave for India via Phuentsholing

In the morning, go to Simply Bhutan, and then leave for Phuentsholing. Cross border to reach Jaigaon in India. Stay overnight in Jaigaon

Next morning, leave for Bagdogra airport and depart with good memories.

Things to know when travelling to Bhutan (for Indians)

- Only passport or voter ID card is accepted for entry.
- Apply for an online permit in advance through the Department of Immigration website or a registered Bhutanese tour operator.
- Pay SDF ₹1,200 per night fee online or at the border (Phuentsholing).
- Indian debit/credit cards and UPI work in major towns like Thimphu and Paro.
- You must hire a licensed Bhutanese guide for visiting monuments and, generally, for touring.
- Purchase a local SIM (TashiCell or B-Mobile) at the border or in town.
- Dress modestly, covering shoulders and knees, especially inside Dzongs and temples.
- Self-driving is not permitted for tourists. Hire a local taxi or book a tour vehicle.
- Best Time to visit: March to May (Spring) and September to November (Autumn)
- Photography is strictly prohibited inside temples, monasteries, and religious halls.

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
