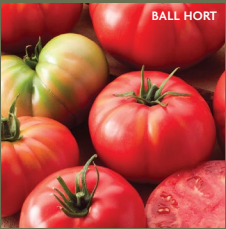
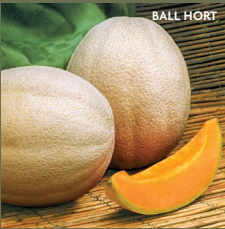
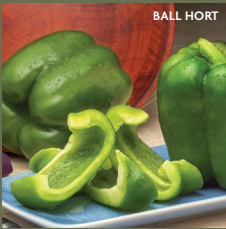


DIANE'S HELPFUL HINTS

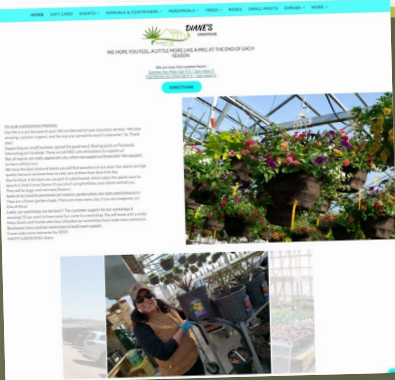
GROWING VEGETABLES

So many people have problems with blight on their tomatoes. I have found two things that could eliminate blight from your garden. Consistency in keeping your garden moist. A 1" layer of mushroom compost will help hold in the moisture for your plants. Nutrition! Add 1-2 ice cream buckets full of mushroom compost to each plant. For a tomato, dig your hole, as deep as the tomato plant. Work in 1-2 ice cream buckets full of mushroom compost. Than plant your tomato plant deep – leave a couple of inches above ground. The whole stem will form roots. The mushroom compost will add beneficial bacteria into the soil. This will choke out the bad bacteria, and create a healthier plant. I know this works! No need to add any other fertilizer for the season. You will be able to grow fewer plants, because the plants you have will produce more fruit! I don't like grass clippings for mulch. Especially, if you used weed and feed on your lawn.

Also, If you are using other compost, do you know what's in it? Is it composted lawn clippings? Full of herbicide? Please don't add it to the garden!





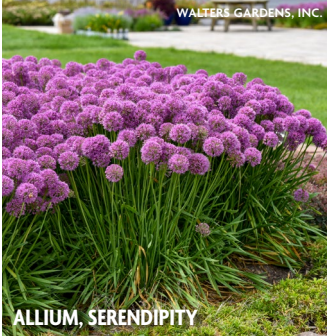

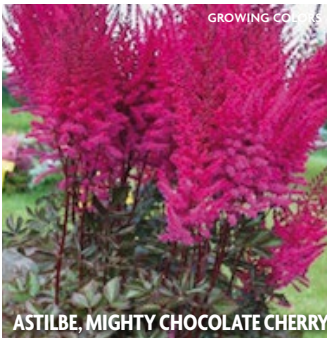

**ACHILLEA, TUTTI FRUIT PINK GRAPEFRUIT (YARROW)** Excellent flowering, sweet flowers, compact and sturdy. Prune off dead flowers and will rebloom. Sun, Hgt. 22", Zone 4-8.

**ALCEA, FIESTA TIME (HOLLYHOCK)** A shorter hollyhock with stunning double two-toned pink flowers. Sun, Hgt. 2-3", Zone 2-9.

**ALLIUM, SERENDIPITY** Globe like, rosy-purple flowers in mid to late summer. Sun, Hgt. 15-20", Zone 4-8.

**ALLIUM, WINDY CITY** A dwarf variety with 2" round violet-purple flowers that appear in mid summer. Sun, Hgt. 16-18", Zone 4-9.

**ANEMONE, SATIN DOLL BLUSH** Exceptional flower count on a dwarf plant. Very early blooming. Shade, Hgt. 9-17", Zone 4-9.

**AQUILEGIA, EARLYBIRD YELLOW** Nodding yellow flowers. Blooms late spring-early summer. Sun or Shade, Hgt. 9-11", Zone 3-8.

**ASCLEPIAS, TUBEROSA (SILKWOOD)** Blooms in summer. Brilliant orange flowers. Late to break dormancy. Full Sun, Hgt. 40", Zone 4.

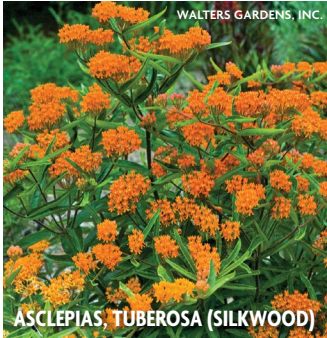
**ASTER, PURPLE** Great fall color. Mix with mums and other asters. Long bloom time in fall. Full Sun, Hgt. 15, Zone 3.

**ASTER, SHOWMAKER MAGENTA** Always nice to have late summer color. Magenta flowers in late summer. Loved by butterflies. Sun, Hgt. 12", Zone 3-8.

**ASTILBE, MIGHTY CHOCOLATE CHERRY** Giant astilbe has clusters of cherry red flowers on dark stems up to 4' tall. Shade, Hgt. 3-4', Zone 3-8.

**ASTILBE, PEACH BLOSSOM** Delicate peach flowers with a hint of pink. Glossy green foliage. Shade, Hgt. 24", Zone 3-9.

**BERGENIA, MISS PIGGY** Dark pink flowers atop dark green leaves. Deer and rabbit resistant. Shade, Hgt. 16-18", Zone 3-9.

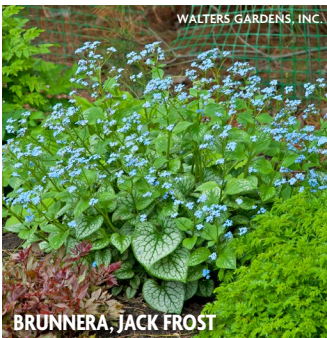

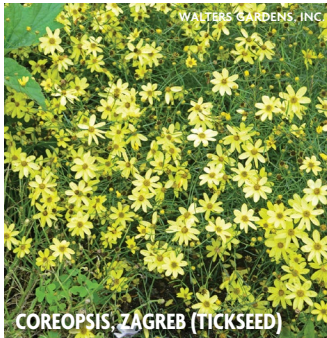

**BRUNNERA, JACK FROST (HEARTLEAF)** A favorite plant. Beautiful blue flowers cover the plant in spring. Shade, Hgt. 12-15", Zone 3-8.

**COREOPSIS, UPTICK YELLOW/RED** Sunny yellow flowers with red center. Blooms in summer. Sun, Hgt. 12-14", Zone 5-9.

**COREOPSIS, ZAGREB (TICKSEED)** Many yellow flowers in summer. Excellent performer. Full Sun, Hgt. 15", Zone 4-9.

**DELPHINIUM, COBALT DREAMS** Deep, true cobalt blue tall spike flowers in summer. Sun or part sun, Hgt. 4-6', Zone 3-7.

**DELPHINIUM, BLACK EYED ANGELS** Tall spires of frilly white flowers with black bees. Sun, Hgt. 4-5', Zone 3-7.

**DIANTHUS, FRUIT PUNCH CLASSIC CORAL** Striking coral pink flowers. A quick shear of dead flowers will encourage re-blooming. Sun, Hgt. 8-10", Zone 4-9.

**DIANTHUS, FRUIT PUNCH CRANBERRY** Full 2" hot magenta flower heads. Look and smell like carnations. Sun, Hgt. 8-10", Zone 4-9.

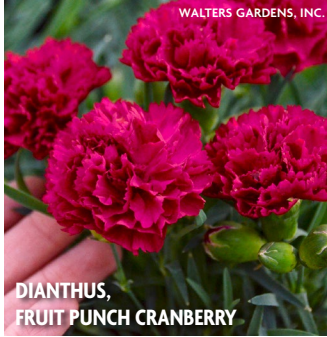
**DICENTRA, SPECTABILIS** Chains of pink hearts. An old time favorite. Great spring time bloomer. Sun or shade, Hgt. 30", Zone 3-9.

**ECHINACEA, CARA MIA CORAL** Shell peach coral flowers in summer. I love this color in the garden. Sun, Hgt. 20", Zone 4-9.

**ECHINACEA, CARA MIA SEASHELL** Bright shell pink flowers with green eye. Blooms in summer. Sun, Hgt. 12-21", Zone 4-9.



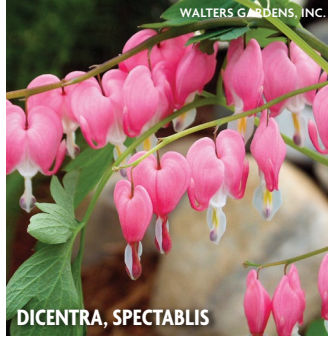

## DIANE RECOMMENDS MUSHROOM COMPOST

Totally organic rich dark mixture of wheat straw, peat moss, cottonseed meal, gypsum, lime and chicken litter. This combination is superior to other compost.

- ▶ Compost will keep the ground temperature cooler and help add moisture.
- ▶ Work in 2-3", layer when planting a new tree, add a 2 gallon bucket full.
- ▶ Add a 2", layer to large (whiskey barrel size) containers.
- ▶ Add a 5 qt. ice cream bucket full/vegetable plant.
- ▶ Top dress all containers, existing flower beds and trees.
- ▶ Add a 1 gallon bucket of mushroom compost/perennial.
- ▶ The end of June (after soil temps heat up) mulch each vegetable plant with a 1", layer of mushroom compost.

**ECHINACEA, CHEYENNE SPIRIT** Incredible color range of red, orange, yellow. First year flowering. Deer resistant. Sun, Hgt. 22-30", Zone 4-9.

**ECHINACEA, FRESCO APRICOT** Zinnia looking flower heads. Very striking in the flower garden. Sun, Hgt. 23", Zone 4-9.

**ECHINACEA, KISMET RASPBERRY** Large raspberry daisies adorned with a golden-brown central cone. Sun, Hgt. 18", Zone 4-8.

**ECHINACEA, KISMET RED** Large red and early blooming. Reblooms all summer. Sun, Hgt. 18", Zone 4-9.

**ECHINACEA, ONE IN A MELON** 5" melon-colored flowers. Plant echinaceas in a hot spot. Sun, Hgt. 24-26", Zone 4-8.

**ECHINACEA, ORANGE FASCINATOR** Stunning double orange flower heads in summer. Sun, Hgt. 16-18", Zone 4-9.

**ECHINACEA, PRIMA SAFFRON** Bright saffron colored flowers in summer. Sun, Hgt. 12-20", Zone 3-9.

**ECHINACEA, RASPBERRY BERET** 4" fully double intense raspberry pink flowers. Sun, Hgt. 18-20", Zone 4-8.

**ECHINACEA, SUMMERSONG FIREFINCH** 3.5" beautiful shades of red, varying from reddish-orange to pinkish red. Sun, Hgt. 12-16", Zone 4-8.

**ECHINACEA, SUNSEEKER APPLE GREEN** White highlights overlap apple green petals. So stunning. Sun, Hgt. 18-24", Zone 4 - 9.

**ECHINACEA, SUNSEEKER SALMON** Salmon petals sometimes have a little yellow in the centers. Sun, Hgt. 18-24", Zone 4-8.

**ECHINACEA, SWEET FUCHSIA** Multiple rows of fuchsia pink petals. Love this color. Sun, Hgt. 18-24", Zone 4-9.

**ECHINACEA, THE FUCHSIA IS BRIGHT** 4½" fuchsia pink flowers. Exceptional garden performer. Sun, Hgt. 20-22", Zone 4-9.

**FOXGLOVE, DALMATIAN PEACH** The flowers open a pretty shade of pinkish peach then lighten to a soft peach with tiny orange speckled throats. Shade, Hgt. 2-3', Zone 4-9.

**GAILLARDIA, RED STARBURST** Tons of bold yellow flowers with red centers. Sun, Hgt. 8-12", Zone 4-9.

**GERANIUM, ROZANNE (CRANESBILL)** Perennial of the Year 2008. Full to part sun, Hgt. 18-20", Zone 4-8.

**GRASS, AUTUMN RED** Plumes in mid-summer. An excellent grass for fall color. Full to Part Sun, Hgt. 5', Zone 4-9.

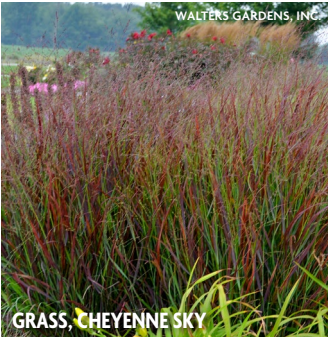
**GRASS, CHEYENNE SKY** A beautiful, easy and hardy! Blue green foliage that turns wine red in summer. Purple flower heads. Sun, Hgt. 3', Zone 4-9.

**GRASS, ELIJAH BLUE** The best blue grass. Forms a dense mound. Sun to Shade, Hgt. 10", Zone 4-8.

**GRASS, HURON SUNRISE** A profusion of full, burgundy plumes sweep the sky. Sun, Hgt. 5-6', Zone 4-9.

**GRASS, KARL (CALAMAGROSTIS)** Feather Reed Grass Compact and upright. Wheat like seed heads in summer. Most popular. Sun, Hgt. 4', Zone 4-8.

**HEMEROCALLIS, BEST SELLER** Large 5" lavender pink flowers. Reblooms. Sun, Hgt. 24", Zone 3-9.

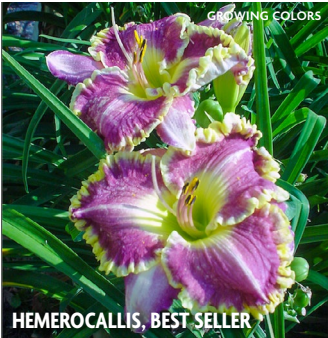
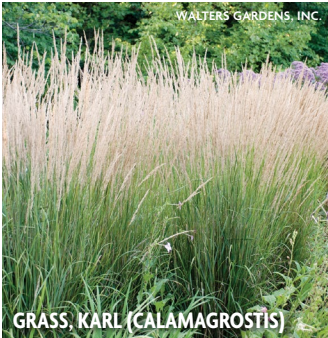


## DIANE'S HELPFUL HINTS CARING FOR PERENNIALS

Why do plants die or why don't they thrive? The answer is simple — watering and/or nutrition, and quality of the plant from the beginning.

**NUTRITION:** I mention mushroom compost all the time. Why? Because I know it works. Add at least 1 gallon of mushroom compost/perennial. More if you have poor soil. You are adding the good bacteria the plant needs to thrive. Also, the compost will help hold moisture and will break up clay soil and add substance to sandy soil.

**WATER:** I hear it all the time, "I watered, watered, watered." Then you didn't water correctly, if your plant did not thrive. A newly planted perennial will need about 5 gallons/week during a dry spell. A newly planted tree will need 20 gallons/week. Things have been extreme the last couple of summers, don't be afraid to give your plant water! Giving your plant, a shot of water every day, is not enough! Deep watering is the way to go. That's where 1-3" of mushroom compost will help each plant, retain moisture and give it amazing benefits.

**HEMEROCALLIS, NOSFERATU** A premium daylily. Dark purple flowers. Heavy bloomer. Sun, Hgt. 26", Zone 3-9.

**HEMEROCALLIS, PERSIAN RUBY** Deep purple red 8" flowers. High bud count. Sun, Hgt. 30", Zone 3-9.

**HEMEROCALLIS, PRAIRIE WILDFIRE** Fragrant velvet red daylily. High bud count. Sun, Hgt. 23", Zone 3-9.

**HEMEROCALLIS, PURPLE D'ORO** A compact daylily. Ruffled edges. Blooms nearly all summer. Sun, Hgt. 20", Zone 3-9.

**HEMEROCALLIS, RED HOT RETURNS** A continuous red blooming daylily. Vigorous grower. Blooms all summer. Rabbit Resistant. Sun, Hgt. 24-28", Zone 3-9.

**HEMEROCALLIS, STELLA D'ORO** Blooms all season long. Most popular daylily. Re-bloomer. Full Sun, Hgt. 15", Zone 2-9.

**HEUCHERA, DOLCE CHERRY TRUFFLES** Bright red and heavily ruffled leaves. Light pink flowers in summer. Sun or Shade, Hgt. 10", Zone 4-9.

**HEUCHERA, PEACHBERRY ICE** Large 5" peachy orange leaves. Airy cream flowers. Shade or part shade, Hgt. 8-10", Zone 4-9.

**HEUCHERA, PRIMO MAHOGANY MONSTER** Massive glossy leaves. Cream flowers. Sun or Shade, Hgt. 12-16", Zone 4-9.

**HEUCHERA, RED DRAGON** Massive 7" wide burgundy leaves. Sun or Shade, Hgt. 12-14", Zone 4-9.

**HIBISCUS, BLACKBERRY MERLOT** 8" deep velvety red massive flowers in late summer. Sun, Hgt. 4-5', Zone 4-9.

**HIBISCUS, MIDNIGHT MARVEL** Wine purple foliage with scarlet red 9" flowers in late summer. Sun, Hgt. 4', Zone 4-9.

**HIBISCUS, SUMMERIFIC BERRY AWESOME** Huge 7-8" lavender pink flowers and red eye. Sun, Hgt. 4', Zone 4-9.

**HIBISCUS, SUMMERIFIC LILAC CRUSH** Lilac colored 9" flowers in late summer. Very tropical looking. Sun, Hgt. 4', Zone 4-9.

**HIBISCUS, SUMMERIFIC SPIDERELLA** Wild new pinwheel colors in late summer. Sun, Hgt. 4', Zone 4-9.

**HOSTA, AGE OF GOLD** Golden yellow foliage with a wide spread of 5'. Cream flowers. Shade, Hgt. 25", Zone 3-9.

**HOSTA, ATLANTIS** Dark green with yellow edges. Spread 70". Shade, Hgt. 30", Zone 3-9.

## DIANE'S HELPFUL HINTS CREATING A HANGING BASKET

► Start with good quality potting soil – we use PRO MIX

► Use top quality plants – not all plants are created equal. At Diane's Greenhouse we give our plants the best care they can get. We use the best potting soil, they are watered when they need it and they are fed! So when our plants get to your house, they are ready to explode.

► When you get your basket home, you can give it a trim (see photo). I know it's hard to do, but it's worth it.

► After I trimmed it, I added 3 Tbs. of Proven Winner slow release. And I fertilized with "Nature's Source" (formerly known as Daniels), daily all through the summer.

► I water my baskets daily on a drip system.

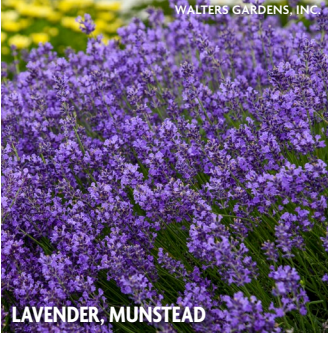
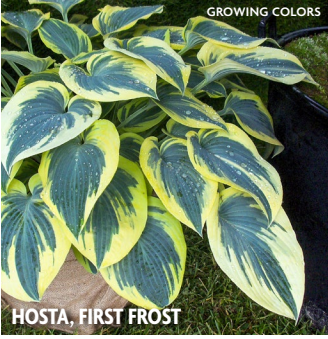
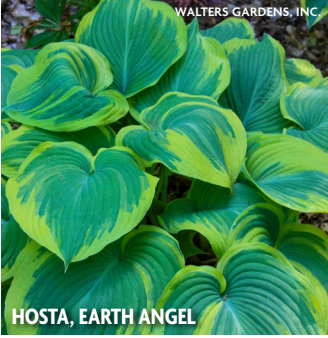

**HOSTA, AUTUMN FROST** 2023 Proven Winner Hosta of the Year. Frosty blue-green leaves with yellow margins. Light lavender flowers. Shade, Hgt. 12-16", Zone 3-9.

**HOSTA, BLUE ANGEL** Gigantic blue green leaves. Very slug resistant. Spreads 4'. Shade or part shade, Hgt. 36", Zone 3-9.

**HOSTA, CAPTAIN KIRK** Dark green edges with bright gold center. Pale lavender flowers. Shade, Hgt. 20", Zone 3-9.

**HOSTA, COAST TO COAST** A giant solid gold hosta. Great in a dark shady spot. Shade, Hgt. 30", Zone 3-9.

**HOSTA, EARTH ANGEL** Heart shaped blue green leaves. Pale lavender flowers. Shade, Hgt. 30", Zone 3-9.

**HOSTA, EMPRESS WU** 2023 hosta of the year. Huge green leaves. Pale reddish purple flowers Spreads 5-6'. Shade, Hgt. 3-4', Zone 3-9.

**HOSTA, FIRST FROST** Intense blue green leaves. Spread 36". Shade, Hgt. 16", Zone 3-9.

**HOSTA, SHADOWLAND ETCHED GLASS** This hosta will bring class to your flower garden. Spreads 36". Shade, Hgt. 18", Zone 3-9.

**LAVENDER, MUNSTEAD** Rich lavender flowers. Sun, Hgt. 12-18", Zone 3-9.

**LEUCANTHEMUM, BECKY** Durable in hot summers. 3" large white flowers. Sun, Hgt. 36", Zone 5-9.

**LIGULARIA, BOTTLE ROCKET** An excellent garden performer. Mustard yellow flowers in summer. Chocolate colored stems. Shade, Hgt. 30", Zone 4-9.

**LILY, VIVA LA VIDA** Huge 7" yellow tropical looking flowers. Very fragrant. Sun, Hgt. 40-48", Zone 4-9.

**MONARDA, LEADING LADY PINK** Pink blooms in early summer. A great pollinator. Sun, Hgt. 10-14", Zone 4-8.

**MONARDA, LEADING LADY RAZZBERRY** Rich raspberry flowers. Very hardy and a long bloomer. Sun, Hgt. 10-14", Zone 4-8.

**MONARDA, ROCKIN' RASPBERRY** Deep raspberry flowers in summer. Awesome color. Sun, Hgt. 20", Zone 4-8.

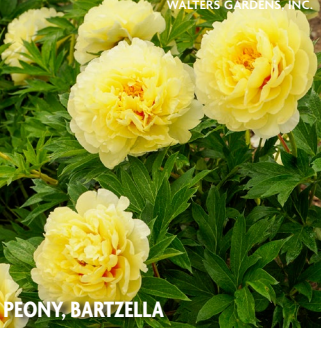

DIANE’S HELPFUL HINTS  
TREES & SHRUBS

- ▶ Trees require 20 gallons of water/week
- ▶ Shrubs require 10 gallons/week
- ▶ Add a gallon bucket of mushroom compost to each vegetable plant. Also, mulch with a 3” layer. You’ll be amazed with the results. Less disease and more fruit!
- ▶ Always plant a tree 2” above ground including mulch.
- ▶ When planting a new tree, cover the trunk with a white, perforated tree protector. This will protect the tree for the winter, and against rabbits. Leave on all year, until the tree forms it’s real bark.
- ▶ When you purchase a tree or shrub, be sure to water the container every day. The tree or shrub must get planted wet! If it’s a hot, windy day, water the container first, dig your hole and plant your item. Water the tree or shrub thoroughly. Keep the root ball of the tree or shrub moist. It helps to mulch your tree, to keep the moisture in the ground. We also recommend to incorporate one package of Soil Moist in the soil at time of planting. Most problems come from under watering or over watering.

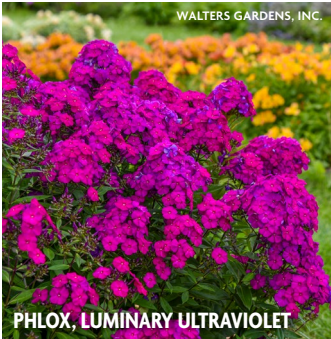

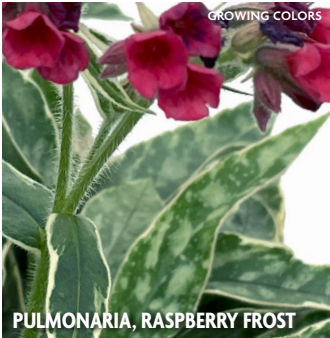

**PHLOX, LUMINARY OPALESCENCE** A Proven Winner plant. A tall garden phlox, blooms in summer. Powdery mildew resistant. Sun, Hgt. 30-32”, Zone 3-8.

**PHLOX, LUMINARY ULTRAVIOLET** A proven winner plant. Very dark, magenta flowers in summer. Good disease resistance. Sun, Hgt. 32-36”, Zone 3-8.

**PHLOX, OPENING ACT PINK A DOT** Add a group of these garden phlox next to a dark garden phlox. Long flowering. Sun, Hgt. 22-28”, Zone 3-8.

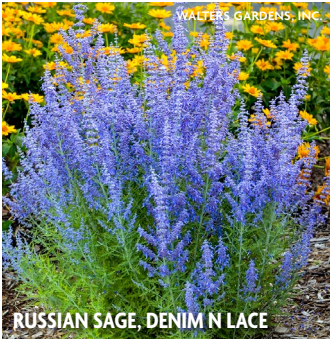
**PHLOX, PRISMATIC PINK** Bubblegum pink flowers in summer. Long lasting. Excellent disease resistance. Sun, Hgt. 32”, Zone 3-8.

**PULMONARIA, RASPBERRY FROST** Coral red flowers in spring. Adds good color to the shade garden. Shade, Hgt. 8-10”, Zone 4-9.

**RUDBECKIA, GOLDSTRUM** All gardens need a little bit of yellow. Very long blooming. Good pollinator. Sun, Hgt. 30”, Zone 4-10.

**RUSSIAN SAGE, DENIM N LACE** One of my favorite plants. Compact and upright. Bright sky blue flowers in summer. Deer resistant. Sun, Hgt. 28-32”, Zone 4-9.

**SALVIA, BLUE BY YOU** Bright violet blue flowers in spring. Long bloomer. Sun, Hgt. 22”, Zone 4-9.

**SEDUM, ROCK N GROW POPSTAR** Cherry salmon pink flowers in early fall. Great pollinator. Sun, Hgt. 10-12”, Zone 3-9.

**SEMPERVIVUM (HEN & CHICKS)** Multi-color rosettes of baby “chicks,” Takes drought well. Use on roofs. Full Sun, Hgt. Groundcover, Zone 4.

**SEMPERVIVUM, CHICK CHARMS CANDIED CAMPFIRE (HEN & CHICKS)** Gold nugget, Plum Pargait and strawberry kiwi all in one plant. Sun, Hgt. 2”, Zone 3-9.

**SEMPERVIVUM, CHICK CHARMS CHERRY CORDIAL (HEN & CHICKS)** Mint Marvel, Berry Bomb and Autumn Apple all in one plant. Sun, Hgt. 2”, Zone 3-9.

**VERONICA, MAGIC SHOW PURPLE** Spiky purple flowers in summer. Pairs well with daisies , phlox or bee balm. Sun, Hgt. 16-18”, Zone 3-8.

**VERONICA, VERBIQUE RASPBERRY** Raspberry pink flower spikes in summer. Sun, Hgt. 12-18”, Zone 4-8.

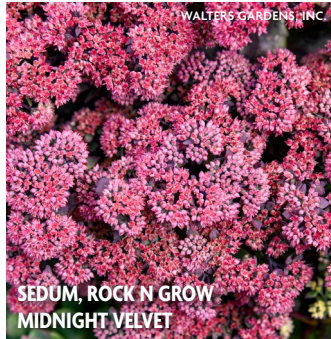

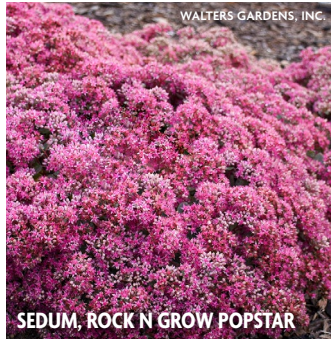
