

DIANE'S HELPFUL HINTS

GROWING VEGETABLES

So many people have problems with blight on their tomatoes. I have found two things that could eliminate blight from your garden. Consistency in keeping your garden moist. A 1" layer of mushroom compost will help hold in the moisture for your plants. Nutrition! Add 1-2 ice cream buckets full of mushroom compost to each plant. For a tomato, dig your hole, as deep as the tomato plant. Work in 1-2 ice cream buckets full of mushroom compost. Then plant your tomato plant deep – leave a couple of inches above ground. The whole stem will form roots. The mushroom compost will add beneficial bacteria into the soil. This will choke out the bad bacteria, and create a healthier plant. I know this works! No need to add any other fertilizer for the season. You will be able to grow fewer plants, because the plants you have will produce more fruit! I don't like grass clippings for mulch. Especially, if you used weed and feed on your lawn.

Also, If you are using other compost, do you know what's in it? Is it composted lawn clippings? Full of herbicide? Please don't add it to the garden!







ACHILLEA, FIREFLY FUSCHIA (YARROW) Excellent flowering. Deep fuchsia pink in summer. Deadhead old flowers/it will rebloom. Sun, Hgt. 26-30", Zone 4-8.

ACHILLEA, NEW VINTAGE WHITE (YARROW) White always stands out in the garden. Good pollinator. Great rebloomer. Sun, Hgt. 26-28", Zone 4-9.

ALCEA, QUEENY PURPLE (HOLLYHOCK) Flowers first year. Pink flowers in summer. Reseeds itself. Sun, Hgt. 2-3', Zone 2-9.

ALLIUM, BOBBLEHEAD Globe like 3" lilac flowers appear in mid summer. Sun, Hgt. 30-32", Zone 4-8.


ALLIUM, SERENDIPITY Globe like, rosy-purple flowers in mid to late summer. Sun, Hgt. 15-20", Zone 4-8.

ASCLEPIAS, TUBEROSA (SILKWOOD) Blooms in summer. Brilliant orange flowers. Late to break dormancy. Full Sun, Hgt. 40", Zone 4.


ASTER, PURPLE Great fall color. Mix with mums and other asters. Long bloom time in fall. Full Sun, Hgt. 15, Zone 3.

ASTILBE, MIGHTY CHOCOLATE CHERRY Giant astilbe has clusters of cherry red flowers on dark stems up to 4' tall. Shade, Hgt. 3-4', Zone 3-8.

BAPTISIA, PINK LEMONADE Soft yellow flowers age to dusty raspberry. So Pretty!! Full and bushy. Sun, Hgt. 3.5-4', Zone 4-9.





BERGENIA, SPRING FLING Clusters of pink flowers above foliage. A nice shade plant. Shade, Hgt. 12-24", Zone 4-8.

BRUNNERA, JACK OF DIAMONDS A giant version. Huge 9-10" leaves. Baby blue forget me not flowers in spring. Shade, Hgt. 14-16", Zone 3-8.

COREOPSIS, LIL BANG DAYBREAK Bi-color flowers with a prominent orange-red center. Sun, Hgt. 8-12", Zone 5-9.

DIANTHUS, FRUIT PUNCH FUNKY FUCHSIA Double fuchsia purple flowers. Proven Winner plant. Sun, Hgt. 14-16", Zone 4-9.

DIANTHUS, FRUIT PUNCH SWEETIE PIE True pink flowers. Flowers will fully cover plant. Proven Winner plant. Sun, Hgt. 12-14", Zone 4-9.

DICENTRA, SPECTABILIS Chains of pink hearts. An old time favorite. Great spring time bloomer. Sun or shade, Hgt. 30", Zone 3-9.

ECHINACEA, DELIGHTFUL TROPICS Dbl orange, mango and ruby grapefruit flowers. Tropical flowers. Flowers June - frost. Sun, Hgt. 12-16", Zone 4-9.

ECHINACEA, DOUBLE DIPPED JAMBERRY Mandarin orange flowers mature to coral pink. Sun, Hgt. 22-26", Zone 4-8.

ECHINACEA, DOUBLE SCOOP RASPBERRY DELUXE Hot pink flowers. Huge flower count. Outstanding performer. Long blooming. Good pollinator. Sun, Hgt. 22-24", Zone 4-9.

ECHINACEA, DOUBLE SCOOP STRAWBERRY DELUXE Double bright reddish flowers. Long blooming. Huge flower count. Sun, Hgt. 22-24", Zone 4-9.

DIANE RECOMMENDS MUSHROOM COMPOST

Totally organic rich dark mixture of wheat straw, peat moss, cottonseed meal, gypsum, lime and chicken litter. This combination is superior to other compost.

- ▶ Compost will keep the ground temperature cooler and help add moisture.
- ▶ Work in 2-3" layer when planting a new tree, add a 2 gallon bucket full.
- ▶ Add a 2" layer to large (whiskey barrel size) containers.
- ▶ Add a 5 qt. ice cream bucket full/vegetable plant.
- ▶ Top dress all containers, existing flower beds and trees.
- ▶ Add a 1 gallon bucket of mushroom compost/perennial.
- ▶ The end of June (after soil temps heat up) mulch each vegetable plant with a 1" layer of mushroom compost.



ECHINACEA, DOUBLE SCOOP WATERMELON DELUXE Hot pink flowers. Huge flower count. Outstanding performer. Long blooming. Good pollinator. Sun, Hgt. 22-24", Zone 4-9.

ECHINACEA, KISMET RED Large red and early blooming. Reblooms all summer. Sun, Hgt. 18", Zone 4-9.

ECHINACEA, POW WOW WILD BERRY Deep purple, magenta pink flowers. Large 3-4" flowers. Stocky strong stems. Masses of color. Sun, Hgt. 12-16", Zone 4-9.

ECHINACEA, SOMBRERO TRESAMIGOS 3 flower colors on 1 plant. Coral, pink and burgundy flowers in summer. Long blooming. Sun, Hgt. 18", Zone 4-9.

ECHINACEA, SUNSEEKER MINEOLA Bright double tangerine flowers. Deer resistant. Strong stems. Good pollinator. Sun, Hgt. 24", Zone 4-9.

ECHINACEA, SUNSEEKER SALMON A two-toned flower is always an eyecatcher in the garden. Long lasting blooms. Good pollinator. Sun, Hgt. 24", Zone 4-9.

ECHINACEA, SWEET FUCHSIA Multiple rows of fuchsia pink petals. Love this color. Sun, Hgt. 18-24", Zone 4-9.

FERN, CRESTED SURF Japanese painted fern. A vigorous variety. Perfect for moist areas. Use mulch. Shade, Hgt. 28-30", Zone 3-8.

FERN, FRONDS FOREVER (LADY FERN) A full dense fern. Excellent vigor. Proven Winner plant. Rabbit resistant. Shade, Hgt. 18-24", Zone 3-8.

FOXGLOVE, DALMATIAN PURPLE Large spikes of lilac purple flowers. Deer and rabbit resistant. Shade, Hgt. 1-2', Zone 4-9.

DIANE'S HELPFUL HINTS CARING FOR PERENNIALS

Why do plants die or why don't they thrive? The answer is simple — watering and/or nutrition, and quality of the plant from the beginning.

NUTRITION: I mention mushroom compost all the time. Why? Because I know it works. Add at least 1 gallon of mushroom compost/perennial. More if you have poor soil. You are adding the good bacteria the plant needs to thrive. Also, the compost will help hold moisture and will break up clay soil and add substance to sandy soil.

WATER: I hear it all the time, "I watered, watered, watered." Then you didn't water correctly, if your plant did not thrive. A newly planted perennial will need about 5 gallons/week during a dry spell. A newly planted tree will need 20 gallons/week. Things have been extreme the last couple of summers, don't be afraid to give your plant water! Giving your plant, a shot of water every day, is not enough! Deep watering is the way to go. That's where 1-3" of mushroom compost will help each plant, retain moisture and give it amazing benefits.



GAILLARDIA, ARIZONA SUN Large 3" wide fiery orange-red flowers. Tipped with red. Deer and rabbit resistant. Good pollinator. Sun, Hgt. 10-12", Zone 3-10.

GRASS, OCTOBERFEST Miscanthus. Nice fall color. Big fan of this grass. Nice to cover up an object. Sun, Hgt. 5', Zone 3-9.

GRASS, CHEYENNE SKY A beautiful, easy and hardy! Blue green foliage that turns wine red in summer. Purple flower heads. Sun, Hgt. 3', Zone 4-9.

GRASS, HURON SUNRISE A profusion of full, burgundy plumes sweep the sky. Sun, Hgt. 5-6', Zone 4-9.

GRASS, KARL (CALAMAGROSTIS) Feather Reed Grass Compact and upright. Wheat like seed heads in summer. Most popular. Sun, Hgt. 4', Zone 4-8.



HELIOPSIS, SUNDIAL Gold flowers with red eye. A must have. Very hardy and a great bloomer!. Sun, Hgt. 42", Zone 3-9.

HEMEROCALLIS, BLOOD, SWEAT & TEARS (DAYLILY) Massive raspberry red flowers. Premium daylily. Rebloomer. Good pollinator. Sun, Hgt. 32", Zone 3-9.

HEMEROCALLIS, CATCHER IN THE EYE (DAYLILY) Lavender blooms with yellow throat. 30 flowers/scape. Rebloomer. Sun, Hgt. 30", Zone 3-9.

HEMEROCALLIS, DESERT FLAME (DAYLILY) Flaming red orange flowers. Rebloomer. Sun, Hgt. 36", Zone 3-9.

HEMEROCALLIS, DON'T LOSE HEART (DAYLILY) Large pink and cranberry flowers. A great rebloomer. Sun, Hgt. 22", Zone 3-9.

HEMEROCALLIS, ROMANTIC RETURNS (DAYLILY) Deep rose pink flowers. Very large flowers. Rebloomer. Sun, Hgt. 25", Zone 3-9.

CREATING A HANGING BASKET

► Start with good quality potting soil – we use PRO MIX



BEFORE TRIM

► Use top quality plants – not all plants are created equal. At Diane's Greenhouse we give our plants the best care they can get. We use the best potting soil, they are watered when they need it and they are fed! So when our plants get to your house, they are ready to explode.



AFTER TRIM

► When you get your basket home, you can give it a trim (see photo). I know it's hard to do, but it's worth it.



IN AUGUST

► After I trimmed it, I added 3 Tbs. of Proven Winner slow release. And I fertilized with "Nature's Source" (formerly known as Daniels), daily all through the summer.

► I water my baskets daily on a drip system.



HOSTA, LOVE STORY Pie crust wavy edges. A beautiful hosta. Large white flowers. Shade, Hgt. 14-16", Zone 3-9.

HOSTA, SHADOWLAND GIGANTOSAURUS GIANT blue leaves with wavy yellow margin. Pale lavender leaves. Proven Winner Plant. Shade, Hgt. 32", Zone 3-9.



DIANE'S HELPFUL HINTS TREES & SHRUBS



Diane's carries an assortment of trees including fruit, shade, ornamental and shrubs. Visit dianesgreenhouse.com for a full list.

- ▶ Trees require 20 gallons of water/week
- ▶ Shrubs require 10 gallons/week
- ▶ Add a gallon bucket of mushroom compost to each vegetable plant. Also, mulch with a 3" layer. You'll be a.mazed with the results. Less disease and more fruit!
- ▶ Always plant a tree 2" above ground including mulch.
- ▶ When planting a new tree, cover the trunk with a white, perforated tree protector. This will protect the tree for the winter, and against rabbits. Leave on all year, until the tree forms its real bark.
- ▶ When you purchase a tree or shrub, be sure to water the container every day. The tree or shrub must get planted wet! If it's a hot, windy day, water the container first, dig your hole and plant your item. Water the tree or shrub thoroughly. Keep the root ball of the tree or shrub moist. It helps to mulch your tree, to keep the moisture in the ground. We also recommend to incorporate one package of Soil Moist in the soil at time of planting. Most problems come from under watering or over watering.




