Day 1

- Tour Fort McHenry National Monument and Historic Shrine. The valiant
 defense of the fort during the Battle of Baltimore on September 13-14,
 1814, inspired Francis Scott Key to write the words that became the U.S.
 national anthem. The fort's history holds many other stories too, from the
 Civil War to WWII.
- Enjoy lunch at Phillips Seafood. Few family-owned food and restaurant companies have been around for 100 years and achieved the levels of success of Phillips Seafood. From their humble beginnings on the Chesapeake Bay, to the opening of their first restaurant in 1956, to their overseas expansion into sourcing high-quality crab meat, the Phillips family has become a powerful force on the global seafood market.
- Visit the National Aquarium. Continue to learn about the environment that supports the local
